Episode 10: "Title Off" Takeaways:

What does it mean when a bill has the "Title Off"?

When the title is off of a piece of legislation, that typically means there is still work that will be done on the bill before being voted on again by the House or Senate. No bills can be signed by the Governor unless it is in its final and complete version.

The Senate Appropriations Committee runs most bills with 'Title Off', so the financial impacts can be closely examined before any legislation moves forward.
