BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. AMENDATORY Section 2, Chapter 381, O.S.L. 20 10 Governor of the State of Oklahoma upp."> State of Oklahoma upp. 2010, Section 13-101.2), is amended to read as follows: OFFICE OF THE SECRETARY OF STATE

Section <Section No. > 13-101.2 A. There is hereby created the Lindsey by the Secretary of State this for Students with Disabilities Program. The day of seven Nicole, Menry Scholarships for Students with Disabilities Program is established to provide a scholarship to a pratvate school of constitute for students with disabilities for whom an individualized education program (IEP) in accordance with the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA) has been developed at Bany time prior to notifying the State Department of Education of

the intent to participate in the Program and the IEP is in effect at the time the request for a scholarship is received by the State

Department of Education. Scholarships shall be awarded beginning with the 2010-2011 school year.

- B. The parent or legal guardian of a public school student with a disability may exercise their parental option and request to have a Lindsey Nicole Henry Scholarship awarded for the child to enroll in and attend a private school in accordance with this section and the scholarship shall be awarded if:
- 1. The student has spent the prior school year in attendance at a public school in this state. For purposes of this section, "prior school year in attendance" means that the student was enrolled in and reported by a school district for funding purposes during the preceding school year regardless of whether or not the student had an IEP at the time the student was counted for funding purposes. A student OFFICE OF THE GOVERNOR member of the United States Armed Forces who transfers to a school in this state from out of state or from a foreign country pursuant to a permanent change of station orders of the space of this paragraph but shall be required to meet all other eligibility requirements to participate as proceed for in this section; and
- The parent or legal guardian has obtained acceptance for adBission of the student to a private school that is eligible for the program as provided in subsection $\frac{1}{2}$ H of this section and has notified the school district State Department of Approved by the Governor of the State of Oklahoma the State Department of Education of the request for a scholarship at least sixty (60) days prior to the date of the fight scholars releak payment no Mater than December 1 of the school year during which the scholarship is requested. The request shall be through a communication directly to the Department in a manner that creates a written or electronic record of the request and the date of receipt of the request. The Department shall notify the school disoverner of the State of Oklahoma he request. For purposes of continuity of educational choice, the schoppiet of the Secretary of State until the student returns to a public school or, graduates from high school or reaches the age of twenty-two (22), whichever occurs first. If the residence of the student changes of the district 200f residence shall assume responsibility for the scholarship. At any time, the parent or legal quatrdian of the student may remove the student from the private school and place the student in another private school that is eligible for the program as provided in subsection $\frac{1}{2}$ H of this seBy:ion or place the student in a public school.

- C. A student shall be eligible for a scholarship if the parent or legal quardian of the student made a request for a scholarship for the 2010-2011 school year and the student transferred to an eligible private school but was subsequently denied a scholarship because the student did not have an IEP in effect on October 1, 2009, but did meet all other eligibility requirements as set forth in the Lindsey Nicole Henry Scholarships for Students with Disabilities Program Act.
- D. A student shall not be eligible for a Lindsey Nicole Henry Scholarship if the student is not having regular and direct contact with the private school teachers at the physical location of the private school.
- E. School districts shall notify the parent or legal guardian of a public school student with a disability of all options available pursuant to this section and inform the parent or legal guardian of the available of the availa
- F. 1. Acceptance of a Lindsey Nicole Henry Scholarship shall habe: the same effect as a parental refusal to consent to service pursuant to 20 U.S.C., Section 614(a)(1) of the IDEA.
- G. If the parent or legal guardian requests a Lindsey Nicole Henry Scholarship and the student is devergered by State of Oklahoms school pending the availability of a space for the student, the parent or legality of a space for the student, the parent of legality of a space for the State Department of Education the school district sixty (60) days prior to the first school and before entering the private school and before December 1 index der to be eligoible for the scholarship during the school year when a space becomes available for the student in the prattate school. - D. H. To be eligible to participate in the Lindsey Nicole Henry Scholarships for Students with Disabilities Program, a private school shall notify the State Department of Education of its intent to participate. The notice shall specify the grade levels and services that the private school has available for students with disabilities who are participating in the scholarship program. The State Department of Education shall approve a private school as eligible to participate in the scholarship program upon determination that the private school:
- 1. Meets the accreditation requirements set by the State Board of Education or another accrediting association approved by the State Board of Education;
- 2. Demonstrates fiscal soundness by having been in operation for one (1) school year or providing the State Department of Education with a statement by a certified public accountant confirming that the private **CRFICE** IDELATER COYERNOR articipate is insured and the owner or owners have sufficient capital or credit to operate the school for the upcoming year by serving the number of students anticipated with expected revenues from tuition and other sources that may be reasonably expected. In lieu of a statement, a surety bond or letter of a tredit for the chamber equal to the scholarship funds for any quarter may be filed with the Department;

- 1. The State Department of Education shall calculate the total cost of all scholarships for all eligible students in the state. The StBre Department of Education shall then reserve or retain from the

total amount appropriated to the State Board of Education for State

Aid purposes and any other revenue available for allocation for State

Aid purposes the total cost for all scholarship payments;

- 2. The maximum scholarship granted for an eligible student with disabilities shall be a calculated amount equivalent to the local and county revenue for the school district which is chargeable in the State Aid formula, state dedicated revenue, and state appropriated funds per weighted average daily membership total State Aid factors for the applicable school year multiplied by the grade and disability weights generated by that student for the applicable school year. The weighted average daily membership shall be determined using the grade and disability weights only. The disability weights used in calculating the scholarship amount shall include all disability weights which correspond to the disabilities included in the multidisciplinary evaluation and eligibility group summary for the student at the time the request for a scholarship is made by the parent OFFICE OF THE GOVERNOR he maximum scholarship amount shall be calculated by the State Board of Education for each year the student is Participating in the scholarship program;
- 2. 3. The amount of the scholarship shall be the amount calculated in paragraph 1 2 of this subsection or the amount of tuition and fees for the private school, whichever is less, minus up to five percent (5%) two and one-half percent (2 1/2%) of the school arship amount which may be retained by the school district State Department of Education as a fee for administrative services rendered. The amount of any assassment fee required by the private school and the amount associated with providing services and therapies to address, the distallities of locke student May be paid from the total amount of the scholarship;

- 4. The State Department of Education shall notify the private school of the Secretary of State this school of the amount of the schoolarship within ten (10) days after receiving the amount of the schoolarship. The initial payment shall be made after the school district Department verifies admission acteptance and enforthment. Quarterly payments shall be made upon verification of continued enrollment and attendance at the private school. Payment shall be made by the school district Department with an Byndividual warrant made payable to the parent or legal guardian of

the student and mailed by the school district <u>Department</u> to the private school that the parent or legal guardian chooses. The parent or legal guardian shall restrictively endorse the warrant to the private school for deposit into the account of the private school; and

- 5. A school district The State Department of Education shall not be responsible for any additional costs associated with special education and related services incurred by the private school for the student including the cost of teachers, equipment, material, and special costs associated with the special education class;
- 6. The State Department of Education shall establish a toll-free telephone number or website that provides parents or legal guardians and private schools with information about the program;
- 7. The State Department of Education shall require an annual, notarize OFFICE OF THE GOYERNOR statement by participating private schools certifying compliance with state laws and shall retain all records received from a participating private school; and
- 8. The State Department of Education shall cross-check the list of a total participating of the list enrollments prior to each scholarship payment to avoid duplication.
- By K. 1. The State Superintendent of Public Instruction shall deny, suspend, or revoke the participation of a private school in the scholarship program if it is determined that the private school has failed to comply with the provisions of this section. However, in instances in which the noncompliance is dock rectable within a reasonable amount of time and in which the health, safety, or welfare of the students is not threatened, the Superintendent may issue a notice of noncompliance which shall provide the private school with a time frame within which to provide evidence of compliance prior to taking action to suspend or revoke pargovernment the State of Oklahoma arship program.

- 3. The private school that is adversely affected by the proposed action shall have fifteen (15) days from receipt of the notice of proposed action to file with the Department a request for an administrative hearing proceeding pursuant to the Administrative Procedures Act.
- 4. Upon receipt of a request for a hearing, the State Board of Education shall commence a hearing within sixty (60) days after the receipt of the formal written request and enter an order within thirty (30) days after the hearing.
- 5. The Board may immediately suspend payment of scholarship funds if it is determined that there is probable cause to believe that there is an imminent threat to the health, safety, or welfare of the studerfice of the studerfice of the studerfice of the private school.

The Oklahoma Department of Career and Technology Education, Oklahoma State Ratents for Holdicker Education, Office of Disability Concerns, State Department of Rehabilitation Services, Oklahoma Health Care Authority, Department of Human Services, and the State Use Committee for the Department of Central Services shall provide support and information as requested by the Task Force.
