Sixth Legislative Day, Wednesday, February 12, 2020

MESSAGE FROM THE HOUSE

Advising passage of and transmitting for consideration Engrossed **HB 3371**.

HB 3371 – By Ford and Lawson of the House and Bergstrom of the Senate.

An Act relating to crimes and punishments; amending 21 O.S. 2011, Section 644, as last amended by Section 1, Chapter 200, O.S.L. 2019 (21 O.S. Supp. 2019, Section 644), which relates to penalties for assault and battery and domestic abuse offenses; increasing penalty for certain unlawful act; amending 57 O.S. 2011, Section 571, as last amended by Section 1, Chapter 152, O.S.L. 2019 (57 O.S. Supp. 2019, Section 571), which relates to the definition for violent crime; expanding scope of definition to include certain crime; and providing an effective date.

The above-numbered measure was read the first time.
