Background: Community Health Centers

- Community health centers (CHCs) provide comprehensive, integrated care to all patients regardless of ability to pay
- Address social determinants of health by providing wraparound services like care coordination and patient education to treat the root causes of illness
- Increase access in underserved areas—both rural and urban —by serving in Health Professional Shortage Areas (HPSAs)

History of CHCs in Oklahoma


Oklahoma health centers have grown to meet the needs of their communities. In 1998, there were four health center sites in OK serving fewer than 40,000 people.


Community Health Center Locations

Most Oklahomans Live Within 30 Minutes of a CHC


Areas Within a 30 Minute Drive of a Community Health Center (CHC)



Community Health Centers are Strategic Located to Improve Health of Oklahoma





Lethal Overdoses



Demonstrated Success

Saving money

- Oklahoma community health centers participating in a Medicare Shared Savings Program (MSSP) Accountable Care Organization (ACO) saved Medicare over \$8.3 million in 2020 and have saved the program nearly \$20 million since 2018.
- A13-state Medicaid claims data study published in AJPH in 2016 found Medicaid patients served by health centers saved Medicaid programs 24% per person on average compared to Medicaid patients served by other providers by achieving 22% fewer specialty care visits, 33% lower spending on specialty care, and 25% fewer inpatient admissions.
