PACE – Programs of All-Inclusive Care for the Elderly

- PACE is a Medicare program for older adults and people over age 55 living with disabilities. This program provides community-based care and services to people who otherwise need nursing home level of care.
- PACE was created as a way to provide flexibility to meet participant health care needs and to help them continue living in the community.
- An interdisciplinary team of professionals will give you the coordinated care you need.
- PACE provides all the care and services covered by Medicare and Medicaid, as authorized by the interdisciplinary team, as well as additional medically-necessary care and services not covered by Medicare and Medicaid.
- With PACE, your ability to pay will never keep you from getting the care you need.

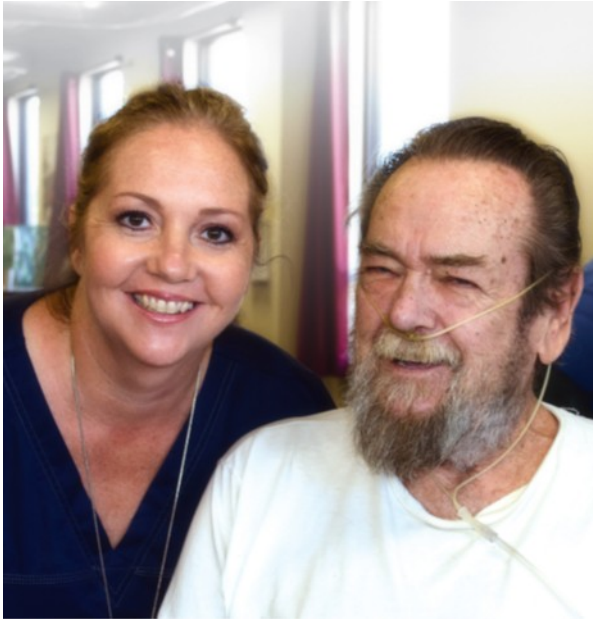
Quick Facts

How to Qualify

- 55+
- Live within our service area
- Medicare/Medicaid eligible
- \$2382 or less a month for an individual
- Noticed challenges in daily living activities that require assistance
- Desire to remain in their home as long as it is safe to do so

- Medical home for transitions of care decisions
- Medical and Social interventions to provide holistic care for the participant and their family
- Right Care at the Right Time – no arbitrary limits or red tape
- 5% hospitalization
- No bounce back penalty
- PACE remains engaged – We are fully incentivized to support the patient's success in all levels of care

What is the Process to Open or Expand and Operate a PACE Program?

- OHCA (State Application process)
 - letter of intent approval
 - State Readiness Review to CMS
 - Site walkthroughs
 - Receive state assurance
- CMS
 - Notice of Intent to apply
 - Submit all materials previously approved through OHCA in HPMS
 - Part D application (new PACE only)
- CMS accepts or sends a request for additional information
 - Site walkthroughs
- OSDH (ACS licensure)
 - Submit all building plans as part of Plan Review process
 - Gain acceptance on building plans
 - Site walkthroughs
 - Submit and gain approval on ADC licensure
- City and State Municipalities



Request for Oklahoma legislative codification of PACE programs

- Defer to CMS regulations and oversight re: quality and safety measures, operational, clinical, financial capitalization requirements
- OHCA - clarify role; what regulations are we basing requests/requirements
- If state oversight of accountability is needed, use high level, outcome-based KPI's (Effectiveness of care, Utilization, Cost) and defer to a single responsible state entity (OHCA)
- Clear state licensing/approval guidelines for the operation of prospective/current PACE organizations that is comprehensive and includes all CMS required services
- Service area decisions based on participant need and organizations ability to provide CMS required services and meet local occupancy and fire codes; no hard, arbitrary caps
- State expectations of document review and turnaround time
