#### National Guard Mental Health Care

- <u>Common Misconception</u>: State Guard members are NOT automatically Veterans and are NOT covered by health care or eligible to seek mental health services at VA facilities.

  - Moore Tornado
  - COVID-19

Location: RTI Complex (63<sup>rd</sup> and N Kelley) (owned) Size: 45,000 sf Price: \$477.00 per square foot Furniture, Fixtures, Equipment: \$1,000,000 Total project cost: \$22,150,000





A Wellness Center, will be constructed on existing property in order to house a consolidated mental health effort designed to address the plague of mental health issues such as PTSD in the State's military. The facility is designed meet the comprehensive physical, spiritual, and mental health needs of the modern warrior including **sexual assault/harassment** and **suicide prevention**. Once constructed, on going maintenance will be covered by the Federal Government along with more than 1M dollars in Federal provided salaries for Family Readiness, Mental Health, and Sexual Assault positions.

#### Thunderbird Challenge Program

Location: Pryor, OK Size: 69,470 sf Price: ~ \$443.00 per square foot (sf) Furniture, Fixtures, Equipment (FFE): \$700,000 Total project cost for ALL PHASES : \$31,526,000

Can be split into phases Phase 1 (Requested) : Barracks Wing Only Size: 30,029 SF Price: ~ \$457.00 per sf FFE: \$178,000 Total project cost: \$13,927,000

Phase 2: Dining hall, Classrooms, Courtyard Size: 39,441 sf Price: ~ \$423 per sf FFE: \$903,880 Total Project Cost: \$17,599,000



The construction of a new TCP building would simultaneously address security, modernization, and facility concerns. This stateof-the-art building would consolidate multiple buildings into one location making the program more efficient. This would also make the cadets more secure and safer than ever before, with the built-in dining facility and covered courtyard cadets would now be able to eat and train safely during the most extreme weather events in Oklahoma.

#### **Joint Operations Center**

Location: Chandler, OK Size: 6399 sf Price: ~ \$450.00 per square foot Site Improvement: \$1,700,000 Furniture, Fixtures, Equipment: \$1,000,000 Total project cost: \$8,000,000



The Joint Operations Center (JOC) and Secret Compartmentalized Information Facility (SCIF) would be combined into one usable space. This facility would be used by the Oklahoma National Guard Headquarters in critical times of need when called upon by the Governor. It would house the necessary critical equipment and backup power generation in order to deal with any State or Federal emergency. Currently both the JOC and SCIF are on the same compound in Oklahoma City.
