500ft Minimum safe altitude Part 107 Drone Rules Upper Altitude (400 ft) Causby (upper limit of 365 ft) Griggs (upper limit of 300 ft) 200 ft Demarcation / Part 77 Causby (lower limit of 83 ft) Griggs (lower limit of 30 ft)

Summary

- There is still a lack of clarity between jurisdictional boundaries within the lower altitude airspace (< 400 ft above ground level)
- There is a complicated interplay between commerce, public safety, property rights, and 1st and 4th Amendment protections
- Initial cases in the federal courts are showing that states attempting to restrict flight at the lowest altitudes may be preempted
- We must not unnecessarily restrict the potential societal benefits from emerging aviation.
