
Mobile Dental Facilities for Strategic Oklahoma Geographic Locations

Request:

\$5.1 million

- Design, build and deploy 5 new fully operational mobile dental facilities
- Located in each quadrant of the state,
 Tulsa & Oklahoma City
 - Workforce development: 4th Year dental students with 2 week assignment across Oklahoma
 - Staffed from within the community

Oklahoma Dental Health Professional Shortage Areas For Purposes of the Oklahoma Dental Loan Repayment Program


