- Parents/Children
- OKDHS Child Welfare Services
- Law Enforcement officers
- District Attorneys, Parent Attorneys, Child Attorneys
- Judges
- Foster Parents, Safety Plan Monitors (prevention), Guardians, Adoptive Parents
- Service Providers/Services - (parenting, health care, counseling/therapy, housing, child care, food assistance, work, transportation, social supports)
- CASA's/GAL's
- External overseers – OKDHS Office of Client Advocacy, OCCY, Legislators/Governor's office, State Auditor, Federal Government/Children's Bureau, lawsuit monitors, advocacy groups, media

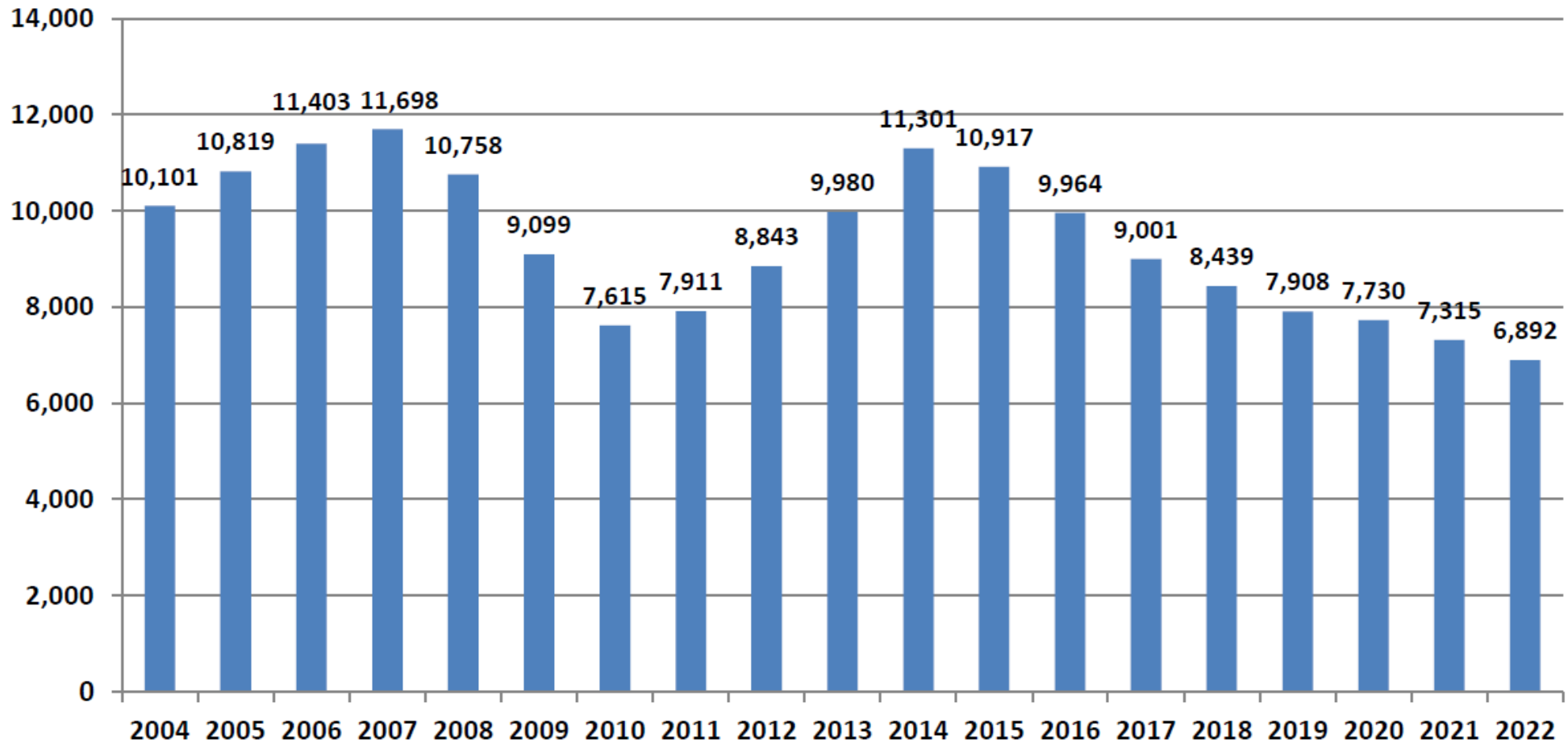
OKDHS CHILD WELFARE SERVICES

- What we are authorized to do
 - Receive and investigate child maltreatment concerns
 - Stabilize a child at home when possible
 - Operate foster care
 - Work with families and courts to move kids safely home or toward permanency (adoption or guardianship)

OKDHS CHILD WELFARE SERVICES

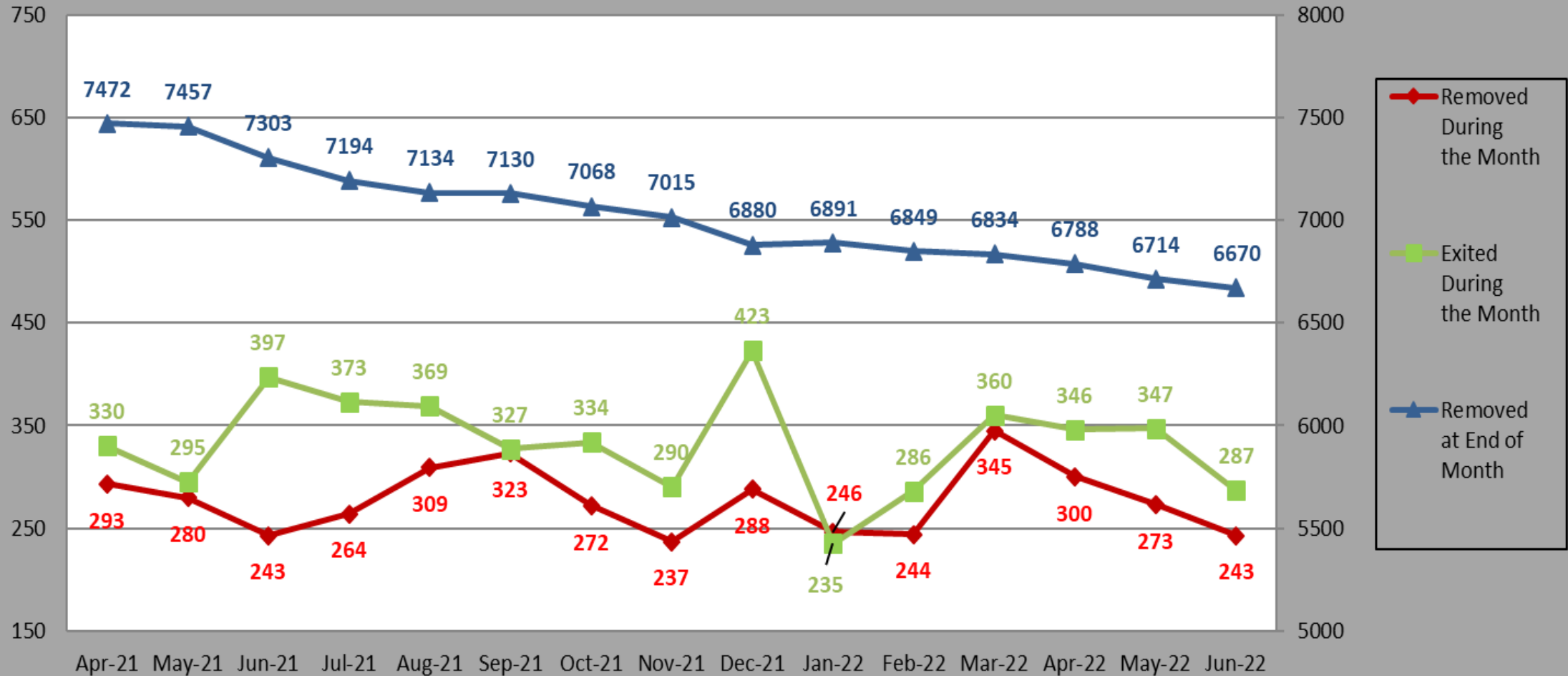
- Prevention Cases – child does NOT enter foster care
 - Substantiation of abuse/neglect
 - Able to mitigate safety threat
 - 90% complete successfully
 - 80-92% do not enter foster care within 1 year of completion

CHILD WELFARE SERVICES

- What we are NOT authorized to do
 - Investigate concerns that don't represent immediate danger
 - Make unilateral decisions to remove children: removal can only occur through law enforcement or a court
 - Order reunification
 - File motions to terminate parent rights

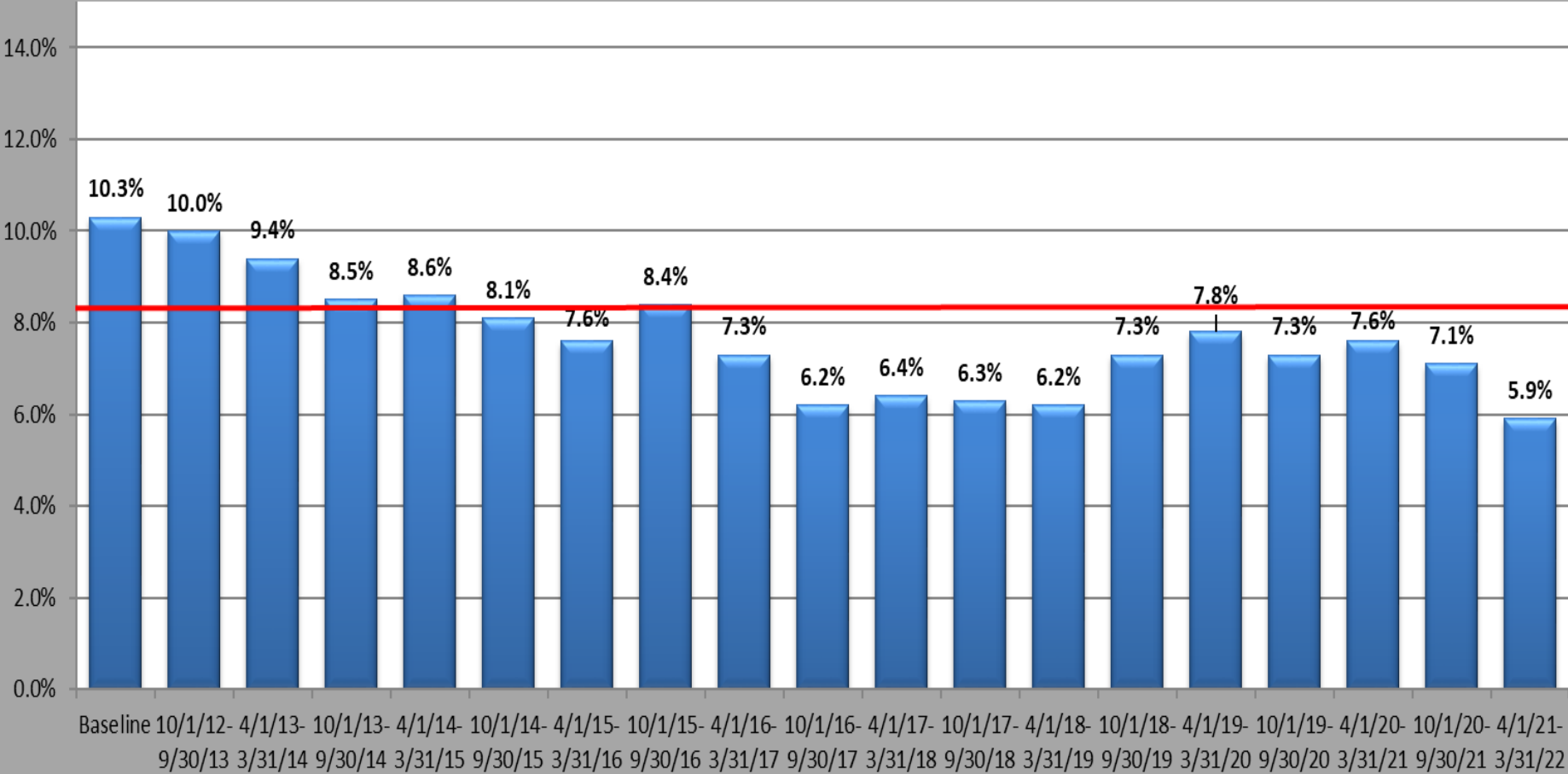
CHILD WELFARE CASE OUTCOMES

- **Adoption and Safe Families Act of 1997**
 - Requires that states move to terminate parents' rights for children who have been in foster care for 15 of the last 22 months. Exceptions include:
 - Kinship foster care
 - Determination that adoption is NOT in the child's best interest
 - State has failed to provide the services necessary for reunification

CHILD WELFARE CASE OUTCOMES

- 44% reunification, 39% adoption, 9% guardianship
- Average length of stay for reunification is 18 months, for adoption is 29 months
- DHS Function: Time from removal to entering a case goal of adoption averages 9-11 months across the state
- DHS and Court: Time from case plan goal is adoption to termination of parent rights (all parents): varies widely across the state (10-19 month average)
- Average days from removal to adoption also varies (27-36 month average)

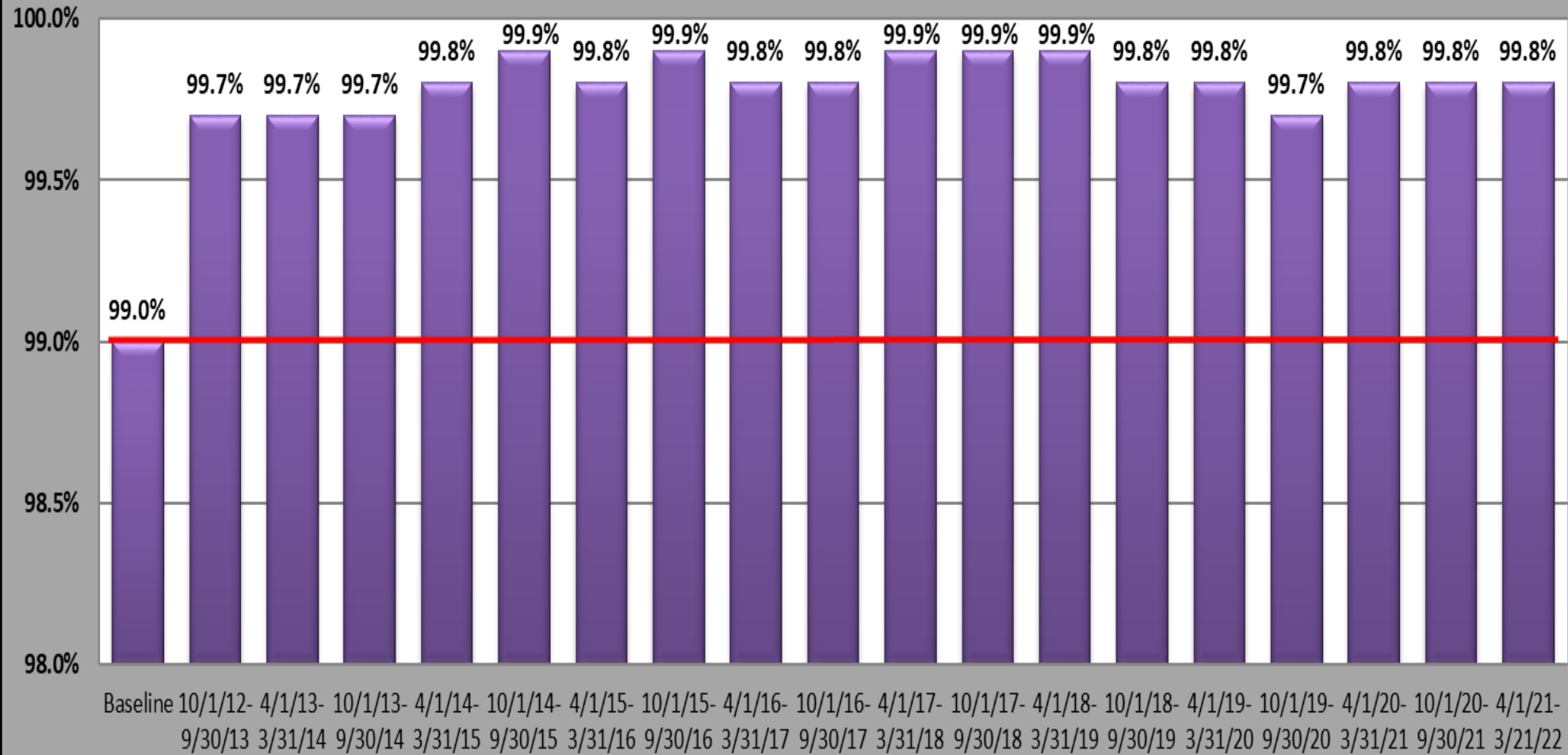
Measure 6.3: Re-entry within 12 Months of Exit

 - Building therapeutic services AROUND a foster home or adoptive home instead of moving kids
 - Eliminating long stays and non-therapeutic congregate care
 - Extending support of youth until their 20's
 - Elevating the voices of youth and parents who have survived this and have better ideas than we do
