FIRST READING

The following were introduced and read the first time:

SB 1 – By Garvin.

An Act relating to school funding; amending 70 O.S. 2021, Section 5-135.4, which relates to the School District Transparency Act; requiring school districts to submit and the State Department of Education to post on a website the amount of carryover in a school district's general fund and certain descriptive purpose on certain date; amending 70 O.S. 2021, Section 18-200.1, as last amended by Section 2, Chapter 488, O.S.L. 2021, which relates to State Aid; removing limitations on school district general fund carryover, method for calculating carryover amount, and penalties for exceeding limitations; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

SB 2 – By Dahm.

An Act relating to schools; requiring certain schools and institutions of higher education to disseminate certain historic proclamations; providing proclamations to be disseminated; providing for manner of dissemination; providing for codification; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

SB 3 – By Burns.

An Act relating to state parks; amending 74 O.S. 2021, Section 2212, which relates to powers, rights, and privileges of Oklahoma Tourism and Recreation Commission; providing for legislative approval for certain property decision; updating statutory language; and declaring an emergency.

SB 4 – By Thompson (Roger).

An Act relating to the Oklahoma Tourism and Recreation Department; amending 74 O.S. 2021, Sections 2203, 2204, and 2206, which relate to the Oklahoma Tourism and Recreation Commission; removing function of Commission as an advisory body; providing provision for removal of Commission members; transferring powers from the Executive Director to the Commission; modifying powers and duties of Commission; authorizing Commission to appoint Executive Director; allowing Commission to establish salary for the Executive Director; and providing an effective date.

SB 5 – By Matthews.

An Act relating to libraries; amending 65 O.S. 2021, Section 155, which relates to city-county library commissions; making language gender neutral; modifying frequency of commission meetings; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

SB 6 – By Garvin.

An Act relating to insurance; defining terms; requiring coverage for retrieval in certain circumstances; specifying terms of coverage; providing for codification; and providing an effective date.

SB 7 – By Stephens.

An Act relating to daylight saving time; establishing daylight time in this state; specifying effect on certain actions; exempting Oklahoma from the federal standard time provision; authorizing future action; providing that act shall take effect on certain authorization; providing for codification; and providing a conditional effective date.

SB 8 – By Garvin.

An Act relating to alcoholic beverages; amending 37A O.S. 2021, Sections 2-102, as amended by Section 1, Chapter 396, O.S.L. 2021, 2-103, 2-104, and 2-131, which relate to brewer, winemaker, distillery, and small farm winery licenses; allowing certain license holders to host off-site events under certain conditions; authorizing the ABLE Commission to permit certain license holders to host off-site events following application; requiring licensees to sell only the products covered by licenses; providing details of application; allowing Commission to assess fee; updating statutory language; repealing 37A O.S. 2021, Section 2-102, as amended by Section 1, Chapter 226, O.S.L. 2019; providing for codification; and declaring an emergency.

SB 9 – By Bullard.

An Act relating to school districts; directing school districts to submit annually to the State Department of Education certain expenditure report relating to diversity, inclusion, equity, or social justice; directing the Department to make the report available on certain website; providing for contents of report; requiring school districts to submit certain additional information to the Department; providing for promulgation of rules; authorizing certain designation of a school for certain noncompliance; providing for codification; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

SB 10 – By Bullard.

An Act relating to Oklahoma Law Enforcement Retirement System; amending 47 O.S. 2021, Section 2-305, as amended by Section 2, Chapter 255, O.S.L. 2022 (47 O.S. Supp. 2022, Section 2-305), which relates to retirement and retirement pay; authorizing rehire under certain circumstances; providing for members to continue receiving benefits during rehiring period; and prohibiting accrual of further credited service.

SB 11 – By Rader of the Senate and Pae of the House.

An Act relating to higher education; amending 70 O.S. 2021, Section 626.6, which relates to the Oklahoma Higher Education Tuition Aid Act; removing certain eligibility provision; updating language; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

SB 12 – By Bullard.

An Act relating to schools; amending 70 O.S. 2021, Section 1-109, which relates to the school year; removing reference to requirements established by the State Board of

Education for adoption of certain school-hours policy; allowing adoption of certain school-hours policy if school sites within a district receive certain overview grade; providing for maintenance of certain policy under certain circumstances; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

SB 13 – By Garvin.

An Act relating to pharmaceuticals; defining terms; prohibiting certain drug plans from refusing certain dispensing of physician-administered or injectable drugs under certain circumstances; requiring certain drugs meet certain federal requirements; prohibiting patients from payment of certain fees beyond cost-sharing obligation; establishing penalties; providing immunity from liability to certain providers; providing for codification; and providing an effective date.

SB 14 – By Bullard.

An Act relating to water and water rights; creating the Charlette Hearne Heritage River Act; defining term; creating certain river designation; prohibiting impoundment of and sale of water from certain river; granting Oklahoma Water Resources Board authority over provisions of act and promulgation of rules; construing provision; protecting public recreational use of certain river; providing for codification; and providing an effective date.

SB 15 – By Murdock.

An Act relating to firearms; defining terms; specifying the type of entities that must comply with certain contract requirements; prohibiting governmental entities from contracting with companies unless contracts contain certain written verification; stating specifics of written verification; providing an exception for specific governmental entities; requiring the Director of the Office of Management and Enterprise Services to provide oversight and advice to governmental entities; providing for codification; and providing an effective date.

SB 16 – By Bullard.

An Act relating to schools; directing the State Board of Education to establish certain pilot program to provide grants for certain purpose; providing for use of grants; directing the Board to establish certain criteria for awarding grants; providing for grant application; requiring school districts with certain average daily membership to be included in pilot program; requiring pilot program grant recipients to submit certain report; providing for contents of report; providing for codification; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

SB 17 – By Garvin.

An Act relating to health insurance; defining terms; prohibiting insurers from refusing coverage to an insured under certain circumstances; providing for an insured to seek care from an out-of-network provider under certain circumstances; requiring out-of-network providers to be reimbursed for covered services at the same rate as in-network providers; providing for codification; and declaring an emergency.

SB 18 – By Rader.

An Act relating to Oil and Gas Produced Water and Waste Recycling and Reuse Act; amending 52 O.S. 2021, Section 86.7, as amended by Section 1, Chapter 31, O.S.L. 2022 (52 O.S. Supp. 2022, Section 86.7), which relates to definitions, purpose, and operator rights and responsibilities; modifying definition; excluding certain persons from liability; updating statutory reference; and providing an effective date.

SB 19 – By Burns.

An Act relating to carbon capture technologies; defining terms; requiring energy produced from certain sources be considered carbon neutral; requiring energy produced from certain sources in conjunction with carbon capture technologies be considered carbon negative; providing for codification; and providing an effective date.

SB 20 – By Burns.

An Act relating to schools; prohibiting teachers of certain courses from being compelled to discuss certain events or issues; directing teachers of certain courses who choose to discuss certain events or issues to do so with certain perspectives; prohibiting public schools from requiring or awarding certain credit for certain work for or with certain organization engaged in certain lobbying; prohibiting public schools from requiring or awarding certain credit for certain lobbying; prohibiting the State Department of Education and public schools from accepting private funding for certain activities in certain courses; providing for promulgation of rules; providing for codification; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

SB 21 – By Dahm.

An Act relating to county sheriffs; declaring certain authority; prohibiting a certain federal employee to make an arrest, search, or seizure without written permission of county sheriff; providing exceptions; allowing denial of permission by sheriff; requiring certain permission of the Attorney General; requiring certain elements in written permission request; providing for validity of written permission; providing for violations; prohibiting discretion of district attorney to not prosecute violations; declaring federal authority of a county sheriff to be rejected; providing for codification; and declaring an emergency.

SB 22 – By Dahm.

An Act relating to agency operations; providing procedures for federal rule and regulation review for state agencies; authorizing the Legislature to disapprove implementation of certain rules and regulations; prohibiting certain conduct upon certain disapproval; stating when certain rules and regulations are operative; providing for certain exemption from liability; clarifying application to certain rights, privileges, or interests gained by certain persons; providing for codification; and declaring an emergency.

SB 23 – By Dahm.

An Act relating to the Second Amendment; amending 21 O.S. 2021, Section 1289.24e, which relates to the Second Amendment Sanctuary State Act; allowing certain detention or arrest; and providing an effective date.

SB 24 – By Pemberton.

An Act relating to Oklahoma Employees Insurance and Benefits Act; amending 74 O.S. 2021, Section 1316.3, which relates to continuance of health and dental insurance benefits; allowing for certain members of Teachers' Retirement System to reinstate previously declined health and dental coverage during certain election period; updating statutory language; and reinstating payable benefit.

SB 25 – By Pemberton.

An Act relating to school support personnel; directing school districts to receive certain amount of funds; directing each school district board of education to determine how to distribute funds to school support personnel; prohibiting certain changes in hours of support personnel; providing for noncodification; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

SB 26 – By Pemberton.

An Act relating to schools; amending Section 1, Chapter 323, O.S.L. 2022 (70 O.S. Supp. 2022, Section 1-125), which relates to restroom or changing area use; providing certain exception; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

SB 27 – By Pemberton.

An Act relating to the Oklahoma Higher Learning Access Program; amending 70 O.S. 2021, Section 2603, which relates to eligibility; modifying eligibility to include certain SAT score; providing eligibility for students who complete certain core curriculum; updating statutory language; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

SB 28 – By Pemberton.

An Act relating to teacher compensation; establishing minimum salary schedule for teachers; defining fringe benefits; specifying certain recognition of college degrees; requiring the State Board of Education to accept certain teaching experience; requiring certain notification; limiting teaching credit for certain service and experience; allowing school district to offer more credit; directing the Board to recognize certain experiences; prohibiting application of minimum salary schedule to certain retired teachers; requiring certain certified personnel to receive certain salary increase above certain level paid during certain school year; providing for codification; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

SB 29 – By Dahm.

An Act relating to the Oklahoma National Guard; creating the Defend the Guard Act; defining terms; requiring an official declaration of war or an action to call forth the state militia by the United States Congress before members of the Oklahoma National Guard may be released from state control to participate in active duty combat; allowing for consent of certain missions; providing for codification; and providing an effective date.

SB 30 – By Rogers.

An Act relating to schools; requiring each school district board of education to adopt certain notification procedures regarding changes in a student's mental, emotional, or

physical health or well-being; prohibiting a board of education from adopting procedures that prohibit district personnel from providing certain notification about a student's mental, emotional, or physical health or well-being; directing district personnel not to discourage or prohibit certain notification; providing exception to disclosure of certain information under certain circumstances; prohibiting school district and public charter school employees and volunteers from referring to a student with certain name or certain pronoun without certain written consent; providing certain exceptions; defining term; prohibiting instruction on sexual orientation or gender identity in certain grades; directing instruction on sexual orientation or gender identity in certain grades to meet certain criteria; requiring certain questionnaire or health screening for students in certain grades to be provided to parents or legal guardians; requiring written consent prior to administration of certain questionnaire or survey; directing school district boards of education to adopt certain notification procedures; providing for contents of procedures; providing for promulgation of certain rules and guidelines; providing for codification; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

SB 31 – By Bergstrom.

An Act relating to independent contractor classification; creating the Uniform Worker Classification Act; providing short title; stating purpose; including and interpreting other provisions of law; stating criteria to determine independent contractor; requiring certain classification based on criteria; construing right of principal to hire employee; requiring uniform classification of workers within state; directing political subdivision to use certain criteria to determine worker classification; providing for codification; and providing an effective date.

SB 32 – By Bullard.

An Act relating to controlled dangerous substances; amending 63 O.S. 2021, Section 2-309, as last amended by Section 1, Chapter 333, O.S.L. 2021, which relates to prescriptions; exempting certain practitioners from electronic prescription requirement; limiting availability of exemption; directing licensing boards to take certain actions; and providing an effective date.

SB 33 – By Bullard.

An Act relating to public health; prohibiting public entities and contractors from requiring COVID-19 vaccinations or discriminating due to vaccination status; defining term; providing for codification; and declaring an emergency.

SB 34 – By Hall.

An Act relating to public health; amending 63 O.S. 2021, Section 1-229.23, which relates to prevention of youth access to tobacco; updating statutory references; and providing an effective date.

SB 35 – By Dahm.

An Act relating to electronic information privacy; creating the Electronic Communication and Device Privacy Act; providing short title; defining terms; prohibiting a government entity from access or compelling production of certain electronic information;

authorizing compelled production of certain information under certain circumstances; stating special circumstances; allowing physical interaction with certain devices under warrants and consent; providing for certain good faith and emergency access; providing for access to devices in correctional facility; requiring warrant for information to comply with certain provisions; stating provisions; establishing court procedures for warrants and petitions; stating authority; requiring destruction of certain information within certain time; providing for emergency access to electronic device information; construing authority for other processes to secure electronic information; requiring notification for accessing electronic information; providing for delayed notification under certain circumstances; providing for extension of delayed notification; directing copy of all electronic information be notified to targets of warrants; directing certain information be submitted to the Department of Public Safety if there is no identified target for warrant; providing for publication and redacting of names on certain reports; construing service provider ability to disclose information; providing for suppression of evidence; requiring compliance with state and federal law and procedure in trial; authorizing the Attorney General to institute civil action; authorizing petition for court order to avoid access to electronic information in violation of law; granting immunity for certain corporation officers for release of certain information; providing for codification; and providing an effective date.

SB 36 – By Dahm.

An Act relating to the Oklahoma Open Records Act; amending 51 O.S. 2021, Section 24A.8, as amended by Section 1, Chapter 12, O.S.L. 2022 (51 O.S. Supp. 2022, Section 24A.8), which relates to disclosure of law enforcement records; requiring disclosure of recordings from certain equipment; and declaring an emergency.

SB 37 – By Dahm.

An Act relating to law enforcement; defining certain term; prohibiting certain collection of location information; providing for codification; and declaring an emergency.

SB 38 – By Dahm.

An Act relating to electronic data; defining terms; prohibiting obtaining of certain data without a court order or search warrant; prohibiting use or disclosure of certain data; requiring destruction of certain data; providing exceptions; prohibiting admissibility of certain information; requiring certain notice; providing for codification; and providing an effective date.

SB 39 – By Stanley.

An Act relating to schools; amending 70 O.S. 2021, Section 6-101.6b, which relates to whistleblower protection for teachers; making protections applicable to support employees; defining term; updating statutory reference; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

SB 40 – By Bullard.

An Act relating to teacher pay; creating a task force to study and make recommendations regarding certain types of pay to reward the highest-quality teachers; providing expiration date; providing for membership; providing for designation of chair and

vice chair; requiring appointments by certain date; requiring organizational meeting by certain date; specifying quorum; providing for frequency of meetings; allowing members to participate via videoconference; prohibiting compensation or travel reimbursement for members; providing for staff support; requiring submission of certain report by certain date; providing for codification; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

SB 41 – By Dahm.

An Act relating to eminent domain; amending 27 O.S. 2021, Sections 5 and 17, which relate to local governments and resale of surplus property; conforming language; modifying requirements for disposition of surplus property; defining terms; prohibiting taking of private property unless for certain uses and with compensation; placing burden of proof on condemning authority; granting certain rights to private property owners; requiring court to strictly construe certain provisions; prohibiting expansion of eminent domain powers absent statutory authority; providing exception; providing for codification; and providing an effective date.

SB 42 – By Bergstrom.

An Act relating to commercial flotation devices; amending 82 O.S. 2021, Section 896.16, which relates to user fees and licenses; authorizing promulgation of rules; updating statutory language; updating statutory reference; and providing an effective date.

SB 43 – By Bergstrom.

An Act relating to central purchasing; defining terms; prohibiting certain purchases from certain entities; requiring certification; prohibiting certain entities to bid on certain state contracts; directing State Purchasing Director to terminate contracts for certain reasons; mandating penalties; providing for codification; and providing an effective date.

SB 44 – By Bergstrom.

An Act relating to students; amending 70 O.S. 2021, Section 11-107.1, which relates to remediation courses for high school students; requiring rather than allowing school districts to provide remediation courses for students who score below certain benchmarks on certain exams; allowing certain types of remediation; providing for promulgation of rules; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

SB 45 – By Bergstrom.

An Act relating to school finances; amending 70 O.S. 2021, Section 3-117.3, which relates to the School Finance Review Commission; directing the Commission to conduct a review of certain matters; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

SB 46 – By Bergstrom.

An Act relating to home-based businesses; creating the Oklahoma Home-based Business Fairness Act; providing short title; defining terms; authorizing use of residential home for certain businesses; construing permitted use; limiting authority of municipality;

allowing municipal regulations for certain purposes; prohibiting imposition of certain conditions on home-based business; requiring certain evidence for challenge to regulations; providing for codification; and providing an effective date.

SB 47 – By Dahm.

An Act relating to the Oklahoma National Guard; authorizing the Governor to send Oklahoma National Guard for certain purpose; providing for codification; and declaring an emergency.

SB 48 – By Stanley.

An Act relating to teachers; amending 70 O.S. 2021, Section 6-106.1, which relates to mentor teacher stipends; directing the allocation of funds to school districts in certain amount for certain purpose; directing a mentor teacher to provide certain support to certain teachers over certain time period; amending 70 O.S. 2021, Section 6-182, as amended by Section 3, Chapter 220, O.S.L. 2022 (70 O.S. Supp. 2022, Section 6-182), which relates to definitions under the Oklahoma Teacher Preparation Act; updating certain definition; modifying certain definition; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

SB 49 – By Dahm.

An Act relating to legislation; creating the Joint Committee on Line-Item Legislation; providing for membership; providing for terms; authorizing selection of co-chairs; stating purpose of the committee; requiring delivery of findings and recommendations; providing for codification; and declaring an emergency.

SB 50 – By Dahm.

An Act relating to public finance; authorizing the Legislature to transfer certain federal funds to other states for certain purposes; providing procedure for transfer; prohibiting certain transfers at certain times; requiring the Director of the Office of Management and Enterprise Services to take certain actions; requiring the Office of Management and Enterprise Services to promulgate rules; providing for codification; and declaring an emergency.

SB 51 – By Stanley.

An Act relating to the Oklahoma Teacher Preparation Act; amending 70 O.S. 2021, Section 6-189, which relates to certification for superintendent of schools and principal; making certain requirements for certification of principals applicable to certification of superintendents of schools; removing and modifying certain requirements; removing language establishing certification requirements for superintendents of schools; updating statutory language; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

SB 52 – By Stanley.

An Act relating to schools; amending 70 O.S. 2021, Section 6-104, which relates to sick leave; clarifying provisions regarding transferability of certain leave for teachers and

support personnel; prohibiting accumulated sick leave from being lost or not transferred due to any break in employment; updating statutory language; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

SB 53 – By Dahm.

An Act relating to vital records; requiring birth certificate to include certain citizenship provisions; limiting provisions to certain designations; excluding certain children from citizenship; providing for codification; and declaring an emergency.

SB 54 – By Howard.

An Act relating to small estate administration; amending 58 O.S. 2021, Sections 393 and 394, which relate to payment or delivery of property to successor by affidavit; authorizing entities and state agencies to release property upon receipt of certain affidavit; adding property required to be paid or delivered upon receipt of certain affidavit; conforming language; and providing an effective date.

SB 55 – By Stanley.

An Act relating to the Oklahoma National Guard Educational Assistance Act; amending Section 1, Chapter 24, O.S.L. 2022 (70 O.S. Supp. 2022, Section 3231), which relates to creation of the Oklahoma National Guard Educational Assistance Program; increasing maximum number of hours in a graduate program for which assistance may be provided; modifying eligibility criteria; removing language regarding repayment of assistance under certain circumstances; providing for ineligibility under certain circumstances; modifying language regarding submission of certain hardship waiver request; updating statutory references; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

SB 56 – By Daniels.

An Act relating to the Oklahoma State Employee Charitable Contribution Act; amending 74 O.S. 2021, Section 7005, which relates to the state agency review committee; modifying termination date; and declaring an emergency.

SB 57 – By Rader.

An Act relating to counties and county officers; amending 19 O.S. 2021, Section 298, which relates to instruments to contain information necessary for indexing; specifying margin size requirement for certain documents; updating statutory references; and providing an effective date.

SB 58 – By Daniels.

An Act relating to professions and occupations; amending 59 O.S. 2021, Section 46.4, which relates to the Board of Governors of the Licensed Architects, Landscape Architects and Registered Commercial Interior Designers of Oklahoma; extending sunset date; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

SB 59 – By Daniels.

An Act relating to professions and occupations; amending 59 O.S. 2021, Section 6001, as amended by Section 1, Chapter 128, O.S.L. 2022 (59 O.S. Supp. 2022, Section 6001), which relates to the State Board of Behavioral Health Licensure; extending sunset date; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

SB 60 – By Daniels.

An Act relating to professions and occupations; amending 59 O.S. 2021, Section 161.4, which relates to the Board of Chiropractic Examiners; extending sunset date; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

SB 61 – By Daniels.

An Act relating to professions and occupations; amending 59 O.S. 2021, Section 1000.2, as amended by Section 5, Chapter 116, O.S.L. 2020, which relates to the Construction Industries Board; extending sunset date; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

SB 62 – By Daniels.

An Act relating to professions and occupations; amending 59 O.S. 2021, Section 475.3, which relates to the State Board of Licensure for Professional Engineers and Land Surveyors; extending sunset date; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

SB 63 – By Daniels.

An Act relating to professions and occupations; amending 59 O.S. 2021, Section 1873, which relates to the Oklahoma Board of Licensed Alcohol and Drug Counselors; extending sunset date; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

SB 64 – By Daniels.

An Act relating to professions and occupations; amending 59 O.S. 2021, Section 1253, which relates to the State Board of Licensed Social Workers; extending sunset date; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

SB 65 – By Stanley.

An Act relating to definitions and general provisions; amending 25 O.S. 2021, Section 82.1, which relates to holidays; authorizing personal holiday leave for state employees; and providing an effective date.

SB 66 – By Young.

An Act relating to sow farms; creating the Oklahoma Rural Investment for Sow Farms Act of 2023; providing short title; establishing duties for the Oklahoma Rural Investment for Sow Farms Program; authorizing expenditures; requiring promulgation of certain rules; creating the Oklahoma Rural Investment for Sow Farms Revolving Fund; providing for expenditures; providing for codification; and providing an effective date.

SB 67 – By Howard.

SB 1094 – By Howard.

An Act relating to the Oklahoma Health Care Agent Act; amending Sections 3 and 5, Chapter 136, O.S.L. 2022 (63 O.S. Supp. 2022, Sections 3111.3 and 3111.5), which relate to execution for power of attorney for health care and form; modifying signature requirement for power of attorney for health care; updating statutory reference; modifying certain form; and declaring an emergency.

SB 1095 – By Green.

An Act relating to Oklahoma Police Pension and Retirement System; amending 11 O.S. 2021, Section 50-112, which relates to eligibility for membership in system; allowing municipalities under certain population to hire certain retired police officers; prohibiting

further accrual for certain officers; allowing for retirees of certain pension systems to be hired as police officers under certain circumstances without entrance into system; updating statutory language; providing for codification; and providing an effective date.

SB 1096 – By Jett.

An Act relating to voter registration; amending Section 1, Chapter 233, O.S.L. 2022 (26 O.S. SB 1102 – By Treat.

An Act relating to public finance; creating the Oklahoma Legacy Fund Task Force; providing purpose; providing membership; appointing the chairperson; requiring certain meeting; providing for staff; stating certain directive; providing for codification; and declaring an emergency.

SB 1103 – By Treat.

An Act relating to firearms; amending 21 O.S. 2021, Section 1289.25, which relates to the Oklahoma Firearms Act of 1971; updating statutory reference; clarifying immunity provision for persons asserting claims of self-defense; authorizing defendant to file motion to dismiss charges under certain circumstances; granting defendant the right to file interlocutory appeal after adverse ruling made by the court; providing parameters for appeal hearing; directing judges to enter certain order at conclusion of appeal hearing; stating burden of proof for evidence of self-defense in criminal prosecution; amending 22 O.S. 2021, Sections 1053, as amended by Section 2, Chapter 209, O.S.L. 2022, and 1089.1 (22 O.S. A Joint Resolution directing the Secretary of State to refer to the people for their approval or rejection a proposed amendment to Section 30 of Article II of the Oklahoma Constitution; prohibiting unreasonable search and seizure of electronic data and communications; requiring warrant for search and seizure of electronic data and communications; providing ballot title; and directing filing.

SJR 2 – By Dahm.

A Joint Resolution directing the Secretary of State to refer to the people for their approval or rejection a proposed amendment to Section 1 of Article I of the Oklahoma Constitution; declaring the State of Oklahoma a sovereign state; providing that any laws

contrary to the United States Constitution are null and void; providing ballot title; and directing filing.

SJR 3 – By Kirt.

A Joint Resolution directing the Secretary of State to refer to the people for their approval or rejection a proposed amendment to Section 26 of Article X of the Oklahoma Constitution; reducing the threshold to approve school district indebtedness; updating constitutional reference; providing ballot title; and directing filing.

SJR 5 – By Hamilton.

A Joint Resolution directing the Secretary of State to refer to the people for their approval or rejection a proposed amendment to the Oklahoma Constitution by adding a new Section 4 to Article XXIV; limiting state questions on ballot to odd-numbered years; requiring proposed constitutional amendments or state questions to receive certain majority vote; providing ballot title; and directing filing.

SJR 6 – By Daniels.

A Joint Resolution directing the Secretary of State to refer to the people for their approval or rejection the repeal of Section 3 of Article VII-B, which relates to the Judicial Nominating Commission, and the proposed amendment to Section 4 of Article VII-B of the Oklahoma Constitution; modifying certain appointment procedure; requiring Senate confirmation of certain judicial appointments; providing ballot title; and directing filing.

SJR 9 – By Bullard.

A Joint Resolution directing the Secretary of State to refer to the people for their approval or rejection a proposed amendment to Section 26 of Article II of the Oklahoma Constitution; expanding the rights of citizens to keep and bear arms; updating statutory language; making language gender neutral; providing ballot title; and directing filing.

SJR 10 – By Hamilton.

JOINT SESSION

The Second Joint Session of the First Regular Session of the Fifty-ninth Legislature was called to order by the President of the Senate, Lieutenant Governor Matt Pinnell.

Senator McCortney moved that the attendance roll call of the Senate be considered the attendance roll call of the Senate in Joint Session, which motion was declared adopted.

Representative Echols moved that the attendance roll call of the House of Representatives be considered the attendance roll call of the House in Joint Session, which motion was declared adopted.

Lieutenant Governor Pinnell declared quorums of the Senate and House present and Joint Session duly assembled.

The invocation was offered by Pastor Joel Harder of the Oklahoma Capitol Commission.

Posting of the Colors was presented by the Air Force Junior ROTC of Choctaw High School in Choctaw, Oklahoma.

Senator McCortney moved that the President and Speaker appoint a committee of members from the Senate and House of Representatives, respectively, as a Joint Committee to notify Governor Kevin Stitt that the Second Joint Session of the Fifty-ninth Legislature is ready to receive him and hear his message, which motion was declared adopted.

President Pinnell appointed for the Senate the following: Senators Floyd, Thompson (Kristen), and Murdock.

Speaker McCall appointed for the House of Representatives the following: Representatives Baker, Kane, Fugate, May, McBride, and Moore.

President Pinnell recognized Sergeant at Arms, Adam Cain, who announced the arrival of the Honorable Kevin Stitt, Governor of the State of Oklahoma.

Governor Stitt was escorted to the Speaker's rostrum by the Joint Committee and presented to the Joint Session by President Pinnell where he delivered his message.

And my fellow Oklahomans.

It's such an honor to be with you today.

I stood at this podium to give my first State of the State address four years ago, after promising to deliver Oklahoma's turnaround –

And a turnaround we delivered.

We said that we would put a fresh set of eyes on state government, cut red tape, and create a more transparent government – and we delivered.

We said that we would eliminate our budget deficit and replenish our state savings – and we delivered.

We said that we would boost economic growth and bring more jobs to the state – and we delivered.

We said that we would support our brave law enforcement – and we delivered.

We said that we would cut taxes – and we delivered.

We said that we would invest in infrastructure and education – and we delivered.

We've done this by sticking to our conservative principles.

Smaller government,

Lower taxes,

Family,

Freedom,

And Faith.

My fellow Oklahomans: The state of our state is the strongest it's ever been.

I am proud to present my plan for the greatest legislative session we've had yet.

First, to drive excellence in education.

Second, to continue to make Oklahoma the most business-friendly state in the nation.

Third, to protect Oklahomans and promote freedoms.

Over the last four years, we have made changes together in education: removing zip code barriers, modernizing our funding formula, and raising teacher pay.

But our efforts can't stop there.

Parents spoke loud and clear at the ballot box last November in support of our vision to create more options for kids.

We know not every student learns the same way.

Every child deserves a quality education that fits their unique needs, regardless of economic status, or background.

Let's fund students, not systems.

Let's create more schools, not fewer schools.

In my executive budget, I am proposing the following initiatives:

Education Savings Accounts.

Performance-based pay raises for teachers,

The Innovation School Fund to help start more schools like the Aviation Academy in Norman.

The most expansive reading initiative in the nation to get students reading at grade level.

Expanding concurrent enrollment so that high schoolers can more easily earn college credits.

These strategic initiatives will bring Oklahoma's education system out of the bottom and into the Top Ten.

In south Oklahoma City, there's a charter school serving four thousand students, with another 700 on the waiting list.

On a recent visit to Santa Fe Sparrow Upper Elementary, I heard from their superintendent, Chris Brewster, teachers, parents, and their principal Meg Wheeler.

Meg got her start in New York City at a charter school through Teach for America.

She is a true pioneer who led her school to achieving what was a few years ago impossible: Today, Sparrow is the only "A" school in the neighborhood.

Here's what Meg had to say...

"Families are the experts. They should be the one to make the choice about where their kids should go to school."

I couldn't agree with her more.

And for all those parents in Oklahoma whose child is stuck in a failing school – I am fighting for you!

Meg and Chris are here with us today.

Will you both please stand so we can acknowledge the great work you're doing at Santa Fe South?

Oklahoma governors have been advocating for more parental choice for over 30 years.

In 1989, Governor Henry Bellmon proposed in his state of the state address, and I quote:

"That parents be given greater flexibility to determine which schools their children will attend.

"Thus providing access to educational excellence by allowing more parental choice."

Those are Governor Bellman's words.

Other states like Iowa and Virginia and Florida and New Hampshire have already figured it out.

Providing more options for students leads to better outcomes.

Oklahoma cannot afford to be left behind.

Because our greatest asset isn't our oil and gas –

It's not our football teams –

It's not the aerospace and defense industry.

It's our kids.

Second in my proposal is to continue to make Oklahoma the most business-friendly state in the nation.

Since 2019, over 23,000 new jobs have been created and today, Oklahoma now has the third fastest-growing economy in the nation.

Companies from all over the country – and the world – are moving to our state to build and expand.

Google's second largest data center in the world is right here in Oklahoma -

USA Rare Earth, the nation's first critical mineral-to-magnet manufacturing facility, is right here in Oklahoma -

American Airlines,

Dell,

Amazon,

Boeing...

These companies could be located anywhere in the world, but they choose to be right here in Oklahoma.

This year, we must capitalize on the progress we've made.

That means continuing to focus on key areas: energy, infrastructure, workforce development, and tax policy.

Let's continue to diversify our energy grid and embrace our "More of Everything" approach.

We are proud that Oklahoma ranks fifth in the nation for natural gas production, and sixth for oil production.

And we're also ranked 10th in the nation for renewables.

My administration will continue to lead with efforts like becoming the nation's Hydrogen Hub.

Oklahoma's affordable and reliable grid is the envy of the world and an undeniable competitive advantage.

Let's continue to invest in our infrastructure,

From roads and bridges,

To rails and runways,

To broadband.

Oklahoma commute times are some of the shortest in the nation.

We must work fast to keep it that way.

As Americans turn to Oklahoma to build their future, let's learn from gridlock cities like Austin and Denver and get ahead.

Broadband and internet access are critical to Oklahoma's future.

When I came into office, Oklahoma was ranked in the bottom ten for broadband access.

Today, we've jumped 23 spots to 26th in the nation for fastest coverage.

Last year, thanks to the leadership of House Speaker Charles McCall, we formed the Oklahoma Broadband Office and set a vision to deliver high-speed internet access to 95% of the state by 2028.

As companies flood to Oklahoma, workforce is the number one challenge facing businesses.

Let's make sure our universities and higher education are partnering with companies to train the workforce of tomorrow.

I want to challenge OU and OSU to grow and deliver a quality education to 40,000 students by 2030.

We need our universities to meet the nursing needs of our hospitals,

The engineering needs of our growing aerospace industry,

The teaching needs of our secondary schools,

The software developer needs for tech companies.

Because when we send our kids to college, we expect our tuition to pay for their education, not their indoctrination!

I want our universities to have less DEI officers and more career placement counselors.

I want to challenge our high schools and CareerTechs to be more responsive to our workforce.

Because Oklahoma needs more truck drivers, more electricians, plumbers, and aviation mechanics.

I want us to rethink our Career Tech funding model.

We created this model over 60 years ago.

Let's reimagine our approach.

Instead of just building new buildings, let's invest in high school freshman so they graduate ready to start a career in cybersecurity or diesel mechanics.

For Oklahoma to keep up with the jobs of tomorrow, we must transform our state economy into an innovation economy.

Because in Oklahoma we are not afraid of the future.

We lean into it, and we embrace it.

Let's continue to promulgate our budding reputation as the regional hub for Advanced Mobility and unmanned aircraft.

Let's continue to make investments in our fastest growing industry: aerospace and defense.

Let's continue to protect and enhance our world-class military bases like Tinker, Altus, and Vance Air Force Bases -

The McAlester Army Ammunition Base and Lawton/Fort Still,

Which is home to two of the U.S. Army's Futures Commands.

Oklahoma is home to over 340,000 veterans.

That's about 9% of our total population.

With help from our veteran members in the Legislature, we enacted new laws last year to help Oklahoma veterans across the state.

It's my goal to make Oklahoma the best state in the nation for those who fought for our freedoms.

Members of the Legislature,

We have accumulated a \$4 billion savings account

And we're going into this session with a \$1.8 billion surplus.

With our fiscal discipline, economic growth, and record savings, let's make a significant statement that Oklahoma is here to stay on the national stage.

The time is now.

We need to keep the momentum...

Let's cut taxes!

In my executive budget I am proposing to eliminate Oklahoma's state grocery tax and reduce our personal income tax rate to 3.99%.

These cuts will save each family in Oklahoma hundreds of dollars each year.

And it will continue to make Oklahoma one of the best states to live, work, and raise your family.

When our economy is booming everyone wins.

Your personal income goes up, opportunities expand, and the entire tax base grows.

But we must also remember there are families still struggling to keep up with record inflation.

Before the pandemic, a gallon of milk cost \$2.90.

Today, it's \$4.21.

A dozen eggs were about \$1.50.

Today, they're \$5.50.

We can provide families with immediate relief at the store and with bigger paychecks.

Last year Georgia, Idaho, South Carolina, and even New York cut taxes!

Let's listen to the people we serve.

Because Oklahomans sent a clear message last November when they overwhelmingly voted for our vision: to shrink the size of government, to cut taxes, and to let the free market flourish.

We need to return excess revenue to the people, not grow government.

We also have an obligation to think about how we protect the next generation.

Senate Pro Tem Greg Treat has already filed legislation to create an Oklahoma Legacy Fund – an initiative I fully support.

Because of our record savings, we are in a strong financial position to invest into this fund and produce earnings for a permanent revenue stream.

We have done the hard work to be fiscally prudent.

We can now dream big.

We can be bold without passing the risk onto Oklahomans and the taxpayers.

Third, we're going to protect Oklahomans and promote freedoms.

Since I became governor, we have invested over a billion dollars into our health care system.

At the same time, we demanded better for Oklahomans and implemented reforms to focus on improving health outcomes, not just billing for procedures.

As a result, another \$700 million is on the way to improve rural hospitals and expand primary care across Oklahoma.

Protecting Oklahomans means that we continue to prioritize highway safety, especially for our rural highways.

So far, we have secured millions in federal funding to add shoulders to rural highways.

And just last week, Oklahoma secured the largest transportation grant in state history - \$85 million for improving I-44 and the US-75 interchange, a major win for Oklahoma.

Protecting Oklahomans means protecting the integrity of our elections.

I'm calling for stronger transparency laws.

Because Oklahomans deserve to know exactly who is funding political campaigns.

A democracy is doomed when special interests can spread lies and leverage blank checks to buy elections.

Protecting Oklahomans means standing up for our values and our way of life.

Whether it's the preposterous vaccine mandate for our National Guard,

The ESG attack on affordable domestic energy delivered by our oil and gas industry,

Or protecting Oklahomans Second Amendment rights,

We will always fight back against the federal overreach from Washington!

Protecting Oklahomans means fully funding our law enforcement.

When we back the blue, we are creating safer communities, safer schools, and a safer Oklahoma.

This also extends to combating drug and human trafficking and cracking down on illegal marijuana operations in our state.

We have deactivated over 800 illegal marijuana farms, completed 165 arrests, and seized over 600,000 pounds of illegal marijuana.

Let me be very clear on this point:

As long as I am governor, we will protect Oklahoma from the Communist Party of China and we will not allow foreign nationals to purchase farmland in the state of Oklahoma.

Protecting Oklahomans means engaging in smart and meaningful criminal justice reform. Oklahomans elected me to protect public safety.

Over the last four years, we've closed four prisons, safely reduced the number of inmates by over 5,000, reduced crime, and saved the taxpayers hundreds of millions of dollars.

Today, Oklahoma is leading the nation in helping those with non-violent records return to work and get second chances.

It's why we also lead the nation in the lowest recidivism rate.

First Lady Sarah Stitt is with us today.

Sarah inspires me every day by her passion for helping Oklahomans.

Specifically, Oklahomans who come from a disadvantaged community, a broken family, or have been stuck in a cycle of poverty.

In 2021, through her vision and your collaboration, I signed the Sarah Stitt Act into law codifying her hard work.

Its success has been widespread not just in our state, but across the nation in states like Arizona and Louisiana, and even caught the attention of the White House.

This year, I'm looking forward to enacting the next step - the Sarah Stitt Act 2.0.

Sarah, on behalf of all Oklahomans, thank you for your hard work.

Protecting Oklahomans means making sure our foster care system prioritizes kids and making families whole.

We've been taking great strides to reunite families over the years.

In fact, the number of children in "out-of-home" care, including those in foster care, has decreased from 11,300 to 6,500 over the last 8 years.

Over the next four years I want Oklahoma to have a conversation about how we can become the most pro-family state.

How we can build a pro-family culture.

In my view, fatherhood is an important piece of that puzzle.

This is something that I am always trying to balance – time at work and time with my six kids.

I want to recognize my Dad, who is here with us today, for pouring into me and my two brothers.

Dad, I love you.

Sadly, there has been a movement in our nation that Dads are dispensable.

Right now, the United States is a world leader in fatherless families.

One out of every four kids in America is living without a father in the home.

And even those with a father are being let down.

In the U.S., the average school-age boy only spends about 30 minutes per week in one-on-one conversations with his father.

For comparison, the same boy, on average, will spend about 44 hours per week watching television, playing video games, and searching the internet.

Let's expand and increase fatherhood programs in our communities.

Let's continue to foster the importance of healthy homes with two involved parents.

And let's not leave out other members of the family, like grandparents' and their rights.

Let's become the most pro-family state in which every member of the family is respected, loved, supported, and included.

With me today is Marquess Dennis.

Marquess was a product of these statistics and spent 5 years in prison.

But he turned his experience into something amazing.

Marquess is the founder and director of Birthright Living Legacy, which helps fathers take a more active role in their family.

So far, they've helped over 200 fathers and their families.

Marquess, would you please stand so we can thank you for the work you're doing?

We must protect our most vulnerable - our children.

After all minors can't vote, can't purchase alcohol, can't purchase cigarettes...

We shouldn't allow a minor to get a permanent gender altering surgery in Oklahoma.

That's why I am calling on the Legislature to send me a bill that bans all gender transition surgeries and hormone therapies on minors in the state!

As governor, I will never shy away from calling out right from wrong.

I will not be intimidated by partisan interest groups or make decisions based on groupthink.

I will continue my responsibility to lead, not follow.

I ran for this office five years ago because I was tired of seeing other states succeed while ours got left behind.

I saw other parts of the country have confidence in their states and their states' futures.

But people just didn't see the American Dream in Oklahoma.

They saw it in other, bigger, so-called "better," states –

They saw it in Texas, or in California, or in Florida.

But they didn't seem to see it here.

But today,

We've all noticed something is different.

Today, families and businesses from New York and Chicago and L.A. pack up their little apartments and come to the open plains of Oklahoma,

Ready to enjoy a safe community,

A government that doesn't get in their way,

And the opportunity to chase their American Dream.

Because that's what we've done.

We have brought the American Dream back to Oklahoma.

Some people don't believe that.

They say, "Well we're really not Top Ten."

But the truth is:

We are Top Ten in best states to start a business.

We are Top Ten in the rate of new entrepreneurs.

We are Top Ten in affordability and cost of living.

We are Top Ten in energy production and renewable energy production.

We are Top Ten in net domestic migration into our state.

We are Top Ten in pre-K enrollment.

The truth is: Oklahoma feeds the world, fuels the world, and protects freedoms around the world.

The truth is: Everything is possible, right here from Oklahoma.

The future doesn't belong to the timid, or those who protect the status quo.

The future belongs to the brave, the pioneers, the go-getters, the can-doers,

The future belongs to Oklahoma.

God Bless you.

And may God continue to bless the great state of Oklahoma!
