First Regular Session of the Fifty-ninth Legislature of the State of Oklahoma

Sixty-second Legislative Day, Tuesday, May 23, 2023

The Senate was called to order by Senator Paxton.

FIRST READING

The following were introduced and read the first time:

SR 21 – By Treat.

A Resolution relating to the protection of the property and supplies of the Senate and duties of the President Pro Tempore during the 2023 legislative interim; authorizing employment of necessary personnel; restricting use of Senate offices and Senate Chamber during the interim except with the consent of the President Pro Tempore; authorizing needed repairs to space in the Capitol under the control of the Senate and purchase of needed furnishings and equipment therefor; authorizing President Pro Tempore to appoint members of the Senate to interim committees; authorizing President Pro Tempore to approve claims for reimbursement incurred by members and employees of the Senate during the interim; and providing for cumulative powers.

SR 22 – By Kirt.

A Resolution declaring the first Friday in June be recognized as National Gun Violence Awareness Day in the State of Oklahoma; and supporting efforts to prevent the tragic effects of gun violence.
