# Pilot Program in Tulsa

12 Intern Teachers from 5 Tulsa charter schools Enrolling in OC's <u>Paraprofessional Program</u>

Interdisciplinary Studies in Education bachelor's degree completely virtual, asynchronous coursework can be completed at school.

5 have enough credits to potentially graduate in one year. Fully paid program with philanthropy after FAFSA <u>Federal Funding.</u>

#### Grow Your Own/ Registered Apprenticeships

As part of the pilot program it became obvious that we had the pieces in place to develop a Registered Apprentice Program (RAP), also known as a Grow Your Own Program.

Partnering with Oklahoma Christian University and nationally recognized partners, we are developing this program for K-12 Education statewide, hoping to launch next year.






### **RAP** Process

- 1. Districts sign up as employers willing to assign a Mentor to an Apprentice.
- 2. Universities provide the Related Technical Instruction.
- 3. RAP Sponsor (OPSRC) collects and provides data to the Dept of Labor and Local Workforce Boards
- 4. Funding from WIOA, Pell, PIRL, and state funding help students pay **little or nothing** for finishing school
- 5. Apprentice work is counted as part of the education process, allowing students to finish faster.
