## Second Regular Session of the Fifty-ninth Legislature of the State of Oklahoma

Tenth Legislative Day, Tuesday, February 20, 2024

#### MESSAGE FROM THE HOUSE

Advising passage of and transmitting for consideration Engrossed **HBs 3192, 4062, 4067** and **4118**.

**HB 3192** – By Newton of the House and Green of the Senate.

An Act relating to forestry administration and enforcement; amending 2 O.S. 2021, Sections 16-2, 16-4, and 16-8, which relate to the Oklahoma Forestry Code; defining terms; modifying definitions; modifying duties of Forestry Division of Oklahoma Department of Agriculture, Food, and Forestry; modifying terms; prohibiting liability for certain activities; amending 2 O.S. 2021, Sections 16-21 and 16-28.2, which relate to forest fire prevention; modifying term; modifying prescribed notification area plan form; updating statutory references; updating statutory language; and providing an effective date.

**HB 4062** – By Wallace and Kerbs of the House and Thompson (Roger) of the Senate.

An Act relating to revenue and taxation; amending 68 O.S. 2021, Section 2370.1, which relates to income tax credits; modifying applicability of tax credit related to certain loan guaranty program fees; and providing an effective date.

**HB 4067** – By Wallace of the House and Hall of the Senate.

An Act relating to state property; amending 62 O.S. 2021, Section 908, as amended by Section 1, Chapter 188, O.S.L. 2023 (62 O.S. Supp. 2023, Section 908), which relates to the Oklahoma State Government Asset Reduction and Cost Savings Program; modifying revenue source for the Maintenance of State Buildings Revolving Fund; amending 74 O.S. 2021, Section 61.8, which relates to long-range capital planning; directing certain liquidation proceeds to the Legacy Capital Financing Fund; and providing an effective date.

**HB 4118** – By Hardin of the House and Howard of the Senate.

An Act relating to agriculture; amending 2 O.S. 2021, Section 10-9.7, as amended by Section 1, Chapter 239, O.S.L. 2022 (2 O.S. Supp. 2023, Section 10-9.7), which relates to Nutrient Management Plans; providing that compliance with a certain Nutrient Management Plan shall be deemed compliant with Best Management Practices; modifying requirements of a Nutrient Management Plan; amending 2 O.S. 2021, Section 10-9.11, which relates to violations of the Oklahoma Registered Poultry Feeding Operations Act; establishing the exclusive enforcement jurisdiction of the Oklahoma Department of Agriculture, Food, and Forestry for acts or omissions relating to the Oklahoma Registered Poultry Feeding Operations Act; creating a presumption that compliance with a current Nutrient Management Plan insulates poultry growers, operators, integrators, and waste applicators from any private right of action or any collateral enforcement; establishing that the Oklahoma Registered Poultry Feeding Operations Act grants statutory immunity from nuisance liability; and declaring an emergency.

The above-numbered measures were read the first time.
