Second Regular Session of the Fifty-ninth Legislature of the State of Oklahoma Twelfth Legislative Day, Thursday, February 22, 2024

HB 1010 – By West (Rick) of the House and Hamilton of the Senate.

An Act relating to the Oklahoma Central Purchasing Act; amending 74 O.S. 2021, Section 85.3, which relates to the Purchasing Division; allowing certain state entities to make certain purchases; requiring certain documentation; and providing an effective date.

HB 2185 – By Lowe (Dick) of the House and Kidd of the Senate.

An Act relating to agriculture; amending 2 O.S. 2021, Section 3-82, as amended by Section 11, Chapter 72, O.S.L. 2023,(2 O.S. Supp. 2023, Section 3-82) which relates to applicator licenses; modifying requirement to receive an aerial license; and providing an effective date.

HB 2946 – By Bashore, West (Josh), Moore, Fetgatter, Sims, George and Hays of the House and Rosino of the Senate.

An Act relating to crimes and punishments; creating Lauria and Ashley's Law; amending 21 O.S. 2021, Section 13.1, which relates to required minimum prison sentences; adding criminal offense to list of crimes; providing for noncodification; and providing an effective date.

HB 3036 – By Stinson of the House and Howard of the Senate.

An Act relating to civil procedure; amending 12 O.S. 2021, Section 1148.7, which relates to forcible entry and detainer jury trials; removing the option of jury trial for forcible entry and detainer actions; retaining the option for a jury trial for other actions; repealing 12 O.S. 2021, Section 1148.8, which relates to procedure where no jury is available; and providing an effective date.

HB 3073 – By Hays and Burns of the House and Gollihare of the Senate.

An Act relating to crimes and punishments; creating a misdemeanor and felony for the dissemination and publication of certain digitization; establishing minimum punishment; creating a misdemeanor for failure to make certain disclosures; defining terms; providing for codification; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

HB 3218 – By West (Kevin) of the House and Weaver of the Senate.

An Act relating to civil procedure; amending 12 O.S. 2021, Section 2004, as amended by Section 1, Chapter 59, O.S.L. 2022 (12 O.S. Supp. 2023, Section 2004), which relates to service of process; providing service of process by electronic means; providing provisions for return when serving by electronic means; and providing an effective date.

HB 3430 – By Archer of the House and Pugh of the Senate.

An Act relating to statutes and reports; requiring renaming of existing title of the Oklahoma Statutes; designating name of existing title; directing publisher to reflect modification of name in electronic and other products; providing for codification; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

The above-numbered measures were read the first time.
