An Act relating to state government; creating the Oklahoma Foreign Agents Registration Act; providing legislative intent; defining terms; prescribing requirements to register as a foreign agent; providing certain requirements for statement to be filed; providing exemptions; prescribing requirements for filing and labeling materials; prescribing method for the maintenance of records; prescribing requirements upon the Oklahoma Attorney General; prescribing liability of officers; prescribing enforcement and penalties; prescribing certain rules and regulations; providing for noncodification; providing for codification; and providing an effective date.

**HB 1265** – By McCall and Lepak of the House and Treat of the Senate.
