
The majority of the judiciary in Oklahoma is composed of Judges of the **District Court**. Often these Judges serve as the first contact a party may have with the judicial system. District Court Judges hear both civil and criminal matters, and they are the backbone of the judiciary. Appeals from the District Courts in civil matters are considered by the Oklahoma Supreme Court. Appeals in criminal matters from the District Courts are considered by the Oklahoma Court of Criminal Appeals.

Nine Presiding Judges are elected by their peers to assist in the administration of Oklahoma's trial courts. These judges, representing separate geographic areas, meet monthly with members of the Supreme Court and Court of Criminal Appeals to discuss the administration of justice and any developments affecting Oklahoma's judiciary. These meetings provide an effective forum for exchanging information by and between the trial judges and appellate judges.

Explanation of Changes and Trends

The budget has increased over the past couple of years due to legislative funding for new judicial and staff positions, financial incentives for Court Reporters, judicial education and salary increases for judges, court reporters and bailiffs.







Name of Request: Judicial Salary Increase

Type: Recurring

\$ 4,457,470

Describe why these funds are needed.

In September 2023, the Board on Judicial Compensation met and recommended a 17% judicial salary increase. The recommendation was approved in part and a 7% salary increase was made effective July 1, 2024. The request for FY26 is to implement the remaining 10% of the original recommendation.

Name of Request: Decrease in State Judicial Fund Certification

Type: Recurring

\$4,143,283

Describe why these funds are needed.

As court fund expenditures rise and collection of court costs decline, the FY26 State Judicial Fund certification estimate is projected to be significantly less than the amount certified in FY25. An increase of appropriated dollars is necessary to adequately cover personnel and operational expenditures.
