What Changes did the Agency Make between FY'16 and FY'17?

1.) Are there any services no longer provided because of budget cuts?

No services have been eliminated. Travel has been limited to only necessary maintenance and training. Printing and postage costs have been greatly reduced through use of email and agency website. Some staff vacancies have been left vacant or not filled right away. Requests for extra precinct officials in elections other than the 2016 General Election were granted only in very large precincts where turnout was anticipated to be very high.

2.) What services are provided at a higher cost to the user?

No fees are charged for voter registration or voting. Candidate filing fee amounts increased as of November 1, 2017 due to passage of SB 323 during the 2017 legislative session.

3.) What services are still provided but with a slower response rate?

Response rates have not changed.
