### How would the agency be affected by receiving the same appropriation for FY '20 as was received in FY '19? (Flat/ 0% change)

SB1130 passed by the 2018 Oklahoma legislature increased the salary schedule for county election board secretaries for the first time since May 1, 2007. The mandate is effective November 1, 2018 and will be a recurring expense to the State Election Board. SB1130 mandates a two step increase in the salary schedule. Step 1 would begin on May 1, 2019 and step 2 would begin on May 1, 2023. County election board secretaries are paid by the county as they are county officers. The State Election Board is required by 26 O.S. § 2-118 to reimburse the county for the statutory salary plus up to 35% of the salary to cover fringe benefits paid. A flat budget (0%) would affect our ability to reimburse counties for county election board secretary salaries and benefits as mandated by statute.

#### How would the agency handle a 2% appropriation reduction in FY '20?

A reduction of 2% would impact our ability to properly staff polling places for the 2020 Presidential Preferential Primary election in March of 2020.

While the State Election Board has not formally requested funding, future major projects include electronic voter check-in and security upgrades as necessary to secure our voting system software and hardware. Additionally, within the next 5-6 years, the State Election Board will need issue an RFP for a statewide voting system to replace the current voting system which has been in use since 2012.

#### Federal Government Impact

#### 1.) How much federal money received by the agency is tied to a mandate by the Federal Government?

All federal money must be used to comply with the Help America Vote Act of 2002 (HAVA) and fund improvements in the administration of elections for Federal office, including enhancements to election technology and make election security improvements.

#### 2.) Are any of those funds inadequate to pay for the federal mandate?

The federal funds we have received are adequate for initial purchases of voting systems and other technical and security upgrades. However, ongoing maintenance, operation and support will be a state responsibility and will need to be funded.

#### 3.) What would the consequences be of ending all of the federal funded programs for your agency?

The State Election Board received \$5,196,017 in federal HAVA Federal Security Grant funds in July 2018. The grant money must be expended by March 2023 to improve the administration of elections for Federal office, including to enhance election technology and make election security improvements" to the systems, equipment and processes used in federal elections. The State Election Board does not anticipate receiving any additional federal funds.

### 4.) How will your agency be affected by federal budget cuts in the coming fiscal year?

We do not anticipate being affected by federal budget cuts.
