Administrative Services Division includes HR, Budget /Accounting and Procurement/Facilities Management. *CALEA The Commission on Accreditation for Law 0100040 Admin/Admin Svc Fed Grant Administration of Federal Grants for Administration 1000001 Investigative Services The primary purpose of the Investigative Services Division is to provide assistance to those entities as authorized by State statutes. Assistance can be any of a full range of investigative services. Most commonly, assistance is a complete investigation conducted by OSBI agents with a comprehensive report for use in prosecution efforts. The types of investigations conducted include, but are not limited to: homicides; rapes; assaults; white collar crime; public corruption; property crimes such as burglaries; computer crimes such as Internet crimes against children; child abuse response team; insurance fraud; auto theft and oil field theft. Services also include polygraph examinations, electronic surveillance, aerial surveillance, crime scene investigations, forensic art, judicial backgrounds, and local law enforcement training in areas of basic and advanced criminal investigations. The Criminal Intelligence Unit maintains the Statewide Intelligence Network and provides expanded use of crime analysis to help state and local law enforcement as well as federal agencies upon request. For divisional purposes, the state is divided into eight regions, each supervised and managed by an Agent-in-Charge. Agents are assigned by region and work out of a regional office, or as Resident Agents working out of their homes or an office provided by city, county, or state government. 1000040 Investigative Services - Federal Grant Administration of Federal Grants for Investigations 3000001 Criminalistics services The Criminalistics Services Division is the full-service, accredited forensic crime laboratory system for the State of Oklahoma. The program supports law enforcement statewide through forensic services that aid in the investig 3000040 Criminal Services - Federal Services Administration of Federal Grants for Criminalistics 8000000 and 8000089 Information Services This Program consists of nine units designed to provide internal support to the OSBI, assist local law enforcement and provide services to the citizens of Oklahoma. The eight units are: 1) Criminal History Reporting Unit (CHRU): Provides dissemination of criminal history information to non-criminal justice agencies and to the general public. Self Defense Act Unit (SDA): Issues new and renewal licenses to citizens wishing to carry handguns, and maintains all the licensing records. 3) Disposition Services Unit (DSU): Collects and enters all information related to the filing of criminal charges by Oklahoma's District Attorneys. The collection of this data and the disposition data related to the charges provides comprehensive data for the courts, prosecutors and the public. 4) Field Services Unit (FSU): Collects crime statistics from Oklahoma law enforcement agencies and assimilates it into the Crime in Oklahoma Annual Report. This report provides law enforcement administrators and other interested parties the data necessary to make informed decisions about the problem of crime in this state. The data is also sent to the FBI for inclusion with national crime statistics. This unit also provides training to all law enforcement agencies on record keeping and the proper method of reporting crime statistics. This unit also conducts audits to ensure the integrity of the data collected and submitted. 5) Criminal History Management Unit (CHMU): Captures data from submitted fingerprint cards and dispositions to build the Master Name Index, Arrest Segment, Custodial Segment and Judicial Segment of the criminal history record for the State Central Repository. This unit produces and disseminates criminal history rap sheets used by criminal justice agencies nationwide. 6) Identification Unit (IU): Processes submitted fingerprint cards to capture the fingerprint images and minutia records to facilitate the comparison and positive identification of individuals through fingerprints utilizing the Automated Fingerprint Identification System (AFIS) and manual fingerprint processing. This unit also captures fingerprints of individuals who have experienced difficulty in obtaining legible fingerprints from local law enforcement agencies. 7) Biometric Field Services Unit (BFSU): This unit is dedicated to providing initial and follow-up training to jail sites using OSBI and other law enforcement agency owned Livescan Booking devices. The teams of Field Services Representatives travel around the state and provide training on the Livescan devices as well as the manual fingerprint process. The Livescan devices capture data on the subject, charges to be filed, electronic images of fingerprints, palm prints and digital images including mugshots, scars, marks and tattoos. Additionally, personnel audit the booking facilities to assure the proper submission of booking information has been 8) Oklahoma Violent Death Reporting System (OVDRS): This Unit collects data related to homicides, legal interventions, suicides, and unintentional firearms deaths. The unit works with the State Health Department, State Medical Examiner and local law enforcement agencies to collect data that is forwarded to the national reporting system. What changes did the agency make between FY'19 and FY'20?

2.) What services are provided at a higher cost to the user?

None

3.) What services are still provided but with a slower response rate?

In FY 2019, OSBI conducted functional assessments to increase efficiencies within the agency and reorganized its structure to lean agency operations. Savings from these efforts allowed OSBI to add some positions to the leading edge of its mission. The legislature funded salary adjustments to make OSBI more competitive in recruiting qualified agents and that has already shown positive results. OSBI remains understaffed even after these beneficial adjustments.

Low staffing of agents, due to budget constraints, has forced the OSBI to investigate fewer offenses in all areas. Requests for investigative assistance for violent crimes has risen 61% in FY 2019. On any given day there are 70 Internet Crimes Against Children known cases that could be investigated. Oilfield theft, auto theft, cold case and digital evidence analysis units are so understaffed that there are large backloads because manpower is insufficient to meet the needs of the state. Telephone call analysis by OSBI Analysts have a large backlog and has forced the triage of cases working only the most heinous crimes. The additional 19 agents and other staff requested in FY 2021 would help to bring these critical services to a staffing level where effective enforcement efforts could be successful. We still provide forensic and investigative services in cold cases, but at a slower response. The lab, especially, is forced to dedicate most of its resources to current cases that have looming court dates, so we have to put the cold case investigations on a lower priority. We are working to dedicate analysts specifically to cold case analysis, but we aren't there yet.

4.) Did the agency provide any pay raises that were not legislatively/statutorily required?

During FY19 the OSBI did process raise requests through the OMES HR. These raises where designed to address jobs that were being paid below the midpoint, equity adjustments and to raise our Law Enforcement Special Agent and Criminalists salary to a level equal to other State agencies. The adjustments were intended to help address hiring/retention issues. In the previous two years we incurred double digit turnover rates, by increasing targeted salaries we are attempting to turn this tide, provide a more stable workforce and to attract the best possible candidates.

Significant. In FY20, 12% of the OSBI's operation budget is from federal grants. These federal grants provide a major percentage of funding for several programs: the Internet Crimes Against Children Task Force; the Oklahoma Information Fusion Center; the DNA/CODIS discipline; development and implementation of several law enforcement information sharing networks; and, a number of other programs that receive a less significant portion of their operation costs in federal dollars. If federal grant funding ended, it would have a dramatic negative impact and would require realignment of agency funding. Some of these services would be reduced or eliminated.
