The Troop S Motor Carrier Safety Assistance Program would be disbanded and Oklahoma would not be allowed to issue Commercial Driver License (CDL). Troop W would be out of federal compliance as far as United States Coast Guard boating law requirements. OKOHS would end all funding for state, local, and county funding for federal Homeland Security initiatives. OHSO would end funding for OHP, state, local, and county funding for alcohol and seatbelt enforcement and other National Highway Traffic Safety Administration initiatives.

## 4.) How will your agency be affected by federal budget cuts in the coming fiscal year?

Should the reduction of federal funds occur, Troop S, Troop W, OHSO, and OKOHS would have to curtail current operations and depending on the size of the cut, they could have to suspend operations.
