The agency was able to mitigate impacts of budget cuts going into FY21 by utilizing carryover from prior years as well as implementing operational practices to reduce cash expenditures. These operational practices included but were not limited to delays in filling vacated positions (from turnover). **2.) What services are provided at a higher cost to the user?** 

Clients are appointed to the agency by the courts, and are potentially subject to fees pursuant to 22 O.S. § 1355.14, unless those fees are waived by the courts. However, costs to the agency to provide services to clients are increasing in categories including (but not limited to) information technology, office rent/leases, and contracts with outside counsel (to represent clients in counties where the agency does not have satellite office coverage).


## 4.) Did the agency provide any pay raises that were not legislatively/statutorily required?

The agency has provided pay raises to several support staff, but these increases came after other positions had turnover and the new employees were hired at reduced rates. The savings resulting from the reduced salary of those positions allowed for slight increases to other positions which took on additional duties resulting from the aforementioned turnover. The agency has also provided raises to staff attorneys in the hopes of reducing turnover, due to the federal government and tribes' ability to pay higher salaries. The Oklahoma Indigent Defense System Board also recently approved a pay raise to the agency's Executive Director (pursuant to 22 O.S. § 1355.3) to bring his salary equivalent to the Executive Coordinator of the District Attorneys Council.
