An Act relating to taxation; amending 62 O.S. 2021, Section 34.103, which relates to the duties of the State Board of Equalization; requiring certification of certain collections in certain fiscal years; amending 68 O.S. 2021, Section 2355, as last amended by Section 1, Chapter 27, 1st Extraordinary Session, O.S.L. 2023 (68 O.S. Supp. 2024, Section 2355), which relates to income tax; modifying tax rates for certain tax years; requiring the reduction of tax rates for certain tax years upon certain certification by the State Board of Equalization; prohibiting reduction of certain rates upon declaration of revenue failure; updating statutory language and references; and declaring an emergency.

SB 2 – By Green.

An Act relating to wind energy facilities; amending 17 O.S. 2021, Section 160.20, as amended by Section 21, Chapter 126, O.S.L. 2023 (17 O.S. Supp. 2024, Section 160.20), which relates to setback requirements; providing setback requirements for wind towers from certain dwellings and property boundaries; updating statutory language; and declaring an emergency.

SB 3 – By Green.

An Act relating to the Department of Environmental Quality; establishing moratorium on land application of certain materials; prohibiting issuance or renewal of certain permits; defining terms; providing for codification; and declaring an emergency.

SB 4 – By Thompson.

An Act relating to food products; prohibiting use of certain substances in food products; requiring promulgation of rules; providing for codification; and providing an effective date.

SB 5 – By Bergstrom.

An Act relating to the Legislative Office of Fiscal Transparency; amending 62 O.S. 2021, Section 8012, which relates to duties of the Office; modifying duties; updating statutory references and language; establishing administrative rules division within the Office; stating purposes of division; directing oversight; providing for codification; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

SB 6 – By Seifried.

An Act relating to school district elections; amending 26 O.S. 2021, Sections 13A-103 and 13A-105, which relate to election dates and declaration of candidacy; modifying permissible dates for certain elections; modifying dates for filing for certain office; and providing an effective date.

SB 7 – By Seifried.

An Act relating to higher education; creating the Oklahoma Teacher Recruitment Academy to be administered by the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education; providing purpose; defining term; directing the State Department of Education to identify and publish certain list by certain date; providing eligibility criteria; requiring execution of certain agreement; directing assistance amount to be equivalent to certain tuition and fees; prohibiting assistance for certain courses or units; establishing assistance cap for each academic year; allowing funds to be set aside for full commitment; directing assistance to be allocated to certain institution of higher education from certain fund; directing certain benefits to be exhausted first; providing for retention eligibility; requiring repayment of assistance for failure to meet certain agreement; providing for calculation of repayment amount; allowing request for hardship waiver; requiring certain institutions of higher education to develop and promote, in certain coordination, certain public awareness program; directing the State Regents to submit certain report by certain date; providing for contents of report; providing for promulgation of rules; creating the Oklahoma Teacher Recruitment Academy Revolving Fund; specifying source of fund; providing for expenditures; providing purpose of fund; providing for codification; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

SB 8 – By Weaver.

An Act relating to the Oklahoma Firefighters Pension and Retirement System; providing for benefits increase subject to certain exception; defining term; and providing for codification.

SB 9 – By Weaver.

An Act relating to the Oklahoma Law Enforcement Retirement System; providing for benefits increase subject to certain exception; and providing for codification.

SB 10 – By Weaver.

An Act relating to Oklahoma Public Employees Retirement System; providing for benefits increase; and providing for codification.

SB 11 – By Weaver.

An Act relating to the Teachers' Retirement System of Oklahoma; providing for benefits increase; and providing for codification.

SB 12 – By Weaver.

An Act relating to the Oklahoma Police Pension and Retirement System; providing for benefits increase subject to certain exception; and providing for codification.

SB 13 – By Weaver.

An Act relating to The Uniform Retirement System for Justices and Judges; providing for benefits increase; and providing for codification.

SB 14 – By Bullard.

An Act relating to vaccinations and immunizations; providing short title; amending 25 O.S. 2021, Section 1101, as amended by Section 3, Chapter 365, O.S.L. 2024 (25 O.S. Supp. 2024, Section 1101), which relates to discrimination in employment; modifying language to include disclosure of medical status; requiring exemption; requiring a certification of disclosure exemption be provided; providing for certain requirements; providing for submittal time frame; requiring certain acceptance; providing for vaccination disclosure exemption; providing for policy or regulation inclusions; providing form; amending 40 O.S. 2021, Section 192, which relates to violation of act; adding jurisdiction for enforcement of violations; updating statutory references; providing for noncodification; providing for codification; and declaring an emergency.

SB 15 – By Bergstrom.

An Act relating to firearms; amending 21 O.S. 2021, Sections 1279 and 1280, which relate to pointing firearms; clarifying exception to certain prohibited act; modifying penalty provisions; removing revocation and administrative penalty provisions; amending 21 O.S. 2021, Sections 1289.16 and 1289.25, which relate to the Oklahoma Firearms Act of 1971; authorizing the pointing of firearms under certain circumstances; removing administrative penalty provision; expanding situations that allow for the use of physical or deadly force; allowing for the defensive display of firearms under certain circumstances; providing exceptions; defining terms; updating statutory language; and declaring an emergency.

SB 16 – By Bergstrom.

An Act relating to financial institutions; creating the Oklahoma Second Amendment Financial Privacy Act; providing short title; defining terms; prohibiting collection of certain financial records; providing an exception; prohibiting use of certain code to engage in discriminatory conduct; authorizing the Attorney General to perform certain investigations and provide notice for violation; providing for violation; prescribing certain remedy for repeated violation; authorizing Attorney General to enforce provisions of this act; allowing certain defense; providing for codification; and providing an effective date.

SB 17 – By Daniels.

An Act relating to school finance; repealing 70 O.S. 2021, Sections 3-117.1, 3-117.2, and 3-117.3, which relate to the School Finance Review Commission; and providing an effective date.

SB 18 – By Daniels.

An Act relating to education; repealing 70 O.S. 2021, Sections 1210.451, 1210.452, and 1210.453, which relate to the Oklahoma School for the Visual and Performing Arts; and providing an effective date.

SB 19 – By Hamilton.

An Act relating to schools; defining terms; requiring each school district and charter school to submit to the State Department of Education certain listing annually by certain date; allowing submission of certain attestation; prohibiting certain materials and content from being accessible to certain students; requiring school districts and charter schools to have certain written policy; providing certain construction; providing process for reporting suspected violations; providing for contents of report; requiring certain notifications within certain time period; providing for investigation; allowing a school district or charter school to request certain hearing within certain time period; directing the State Board of Education to review certain information and vote on certain determination; authorizing certain designation of a school for certain noncompliance; providing certain penalty for noncompliance; providing for promulgation of rules; providing for codification; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

SB 20 – By Guthrie.

An Act relating to utility vehicles; amending 47 O.S. 2021, Section 11-1116, which relates to self-propelled or motor-driven and operated vehicles; updating statutory language; modifying statutory reference; prohibiting certain vehicles exceeding specific speed when operated on streets and highways; modifying location for operation of certain vehicles; and providing an effective date.

SB 21 – By Hamilton.

An Act relating to the Oklahoma Police Pension and Retirement System; providing for benefits increase for certain members subject to certain exception; and providing for codification.

SB 22 – By Green.

An Act relating to agriculture; amending 2 O.S. 2021, Section 5-107, which relates to the Oklahoma Meat Consumer Protection Act; defining term; prohibiting production of certain product; providing for promulgation of rules; and providing an effective date.

SB 23 – By Stanley.

An Act relating to smoking in motor vehicles; defining terms; prohibiting certain act; providing for penalty; requiring deposit of fee in certain fund; providing for codification; and providing an effective date.

SB 24 – By Coleman.

An Act relating to retail spirits licensees; amending 37A O.S. 2021, Section 6-103, as last amended by Section 1, Chapter 200, O.S.L. 2023 (37A O.S. Supp. 2024, Section 6-103), which relates to prohibited acts; allowing for licensed premises to operate a specified distance outside of city limits; updating statutory language; and providing an effective date.

SB 25 – By Woods.

An Act relating to the funding of transportation projects; amending 69 O.S. 2021, Section 1913, as amended by Section 1, Chapter 17, 1st Extraordinary Session, O.S.L. 2023 (69 O.S. Supp. 2024, Section 1913), which relates to the Rural Economic Transportation Reliability and Optimization Fund; updating statutory language; updating statutory reference; modifying population limitation; directing deposit of certain monies in Rural Economic Transportation Reliability and Optimization Fund; providing for noncodification; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

SB 26 – By Bullard.

An Act relating to the Teachers' Retirement System of Oklahoma; amending 70 O.S. 2021, Section 17-116.10, as amended by Section 9, Chapter 300, O.S.L. 2024 (70 O.S. Supp. 2024, Section 17-116.10), which relates to postretirement employment; authorizing certain postretirement employment for certain time period with no earnings limitation; updating statutory language; updating statutory references; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

SB 27 – By Bullard.

An Act relating to controlled dangerous substances; amending 63 O.S. 2021, Section 2-309, as last amended by Section 6, Chapter 308, O.S.L. 2024 (63 O.S. Supp. 2024, Section 2-309), which relates to prescriptions; exempting certain practitioners from electronic prescription requirement; limiting availability of exemption; directing licensing boards to take certain actions; updating statutory language; and providing an effective date.

SB 28 – By Hicks.

An Act relating to schools; amending 70 O.S. 2021, Section 3-119, which relates to school nutrition; updating statutory language; requiring school districts to provide meals at no cost to certain children in certain school years; requiring apportionment of funds for certain purpose; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

SB 29 – By Hamilton.

An Act relating to health care; requiring licensed practitioners to offer pharmacogenomic test prior to prescription of psychotropic drugs; requiring certain disclosures and obtainment of informed consent; directing order and administration of pharmacogenomic test; providing for codification; and providing an effective date.

SB 30 – By Hamilton.

An Act relating to child care; amending 10 O.S. 2021, Section 403, as amended by Section 1, Chapter 99, O.S.L. 2022 (10 O.S. Supp. 2024, Section 403), which relates to

exemptions from the Oklahoma Child Care Facilities Licensing Act; updating statutory reference; adding exemption; and providing an effective date.

SB 31 – By Hicks.

An Act relating to career and technology education; creating the Oklahoma National Guard CareerTech Assistance Act; providing short title; defining terms; creating the Oklahoma National Guard CareerTech Assistance Program to provide tuition assistance to certain eligible members; providing for amount of assistance subject to availability of funding; limiting assistance to certain number of years; allowing establishment of certain cap; prohibiting assistance for courses taken in excess of certain requirements; providing for eligibility; providing eligibility retention requirements; providing application process; allowing denial of continued assistance for failure to meet certain requirements; requiring repayment of assistance for failure to meet certain requirement; providing for calculation of repayment amount; allowing for application of hardship waiver; directing certain notification on available funding; providing for promulgation of rules and regulations; directing coordination of rules and regulations; creating the Oklahoma National Guard CareerTech Assistance Revolving Fund; specifying source of fund; providing for expenditures; providing purpose of fund; providing for codification; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

SB 32 – By Stanley.

An Act relating to the Oklahoma National Guard Educational Assistance Act; amending Section 1, Chapter 24, O.S.L. 2022 (70 O.S. Supp. 2024, Section 3231), which relates to creation of the act; directing certain assistance to include program fees and any other fees for courses; directing the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education and the Military Department of the State of Oklahoma to jointly review certain fees; allowing the State Regents to determine if certain fees are ineligible for program assistance; authorizing the Department to establish certain cap; modifying retention eligibility; authorizing the Department to establish a cap on certain program participation; modifying reasons for which an application for assistance may be denied; directing the Department to promulgate certain regulations; directing the State Regents and the Department to coordinate certain promulgation; updating statutory references; updating statutory language; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

SB 33 – By Bullard.

An Act relating to the State Treasurer; authorizing the Treasurer to create, operate, or contract for the operation of a depository and issue certain transaction cards; requiring the Treasurer to provide certain procedures and develop fee structure upon certain circumstance; stipulating certain deposits and transactions be considered the exchange of legal tender; authorizing account holders issued a transaction card to make transactions debited against the value of deposits; authorizing the promulgation of rules; providing for codification; and providing an effective date.

SB 34 – By Hicks.

An Act relating to prescription drugs; creating the Access to Lifesaving Medicines Act; providing short title; defining terms; prohibiting certain insurers and pharmacy benefits

managers from imposing certain costs; requiring certain rebates be offered to certain health benefit plans; establishing terms of prescription drug cost sharing; directing promulgation of rules; providing for noncodification; providing for codification; and providing an effective date.

SB 35 – By Hicks.

An Act relating to the Oklahoma Minimum Wage Act; amending 40 O.S. 2021, Section 197.2, which relates to the establishment of minimum wages; increasing minimum wage amount; updating statutory language; and providing an effective date.

SB 36 – By Bergstrom.

An Act relating to state government; amending 74 O.S. 2021, Section 61.8, which relates to the Long-Range Capital Planning Commission; exempting certain entity from certain land and property requirements; updating statutory language; and declaring an emergency.

SB 37 – By Weaver.

An Act relating to the Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation; defining term; authorizing the Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation to respond to certain events; creating the Mass Casualty Revolving Fund; authorizing certain expenditures by the Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation; providing for codification; and providing an effective date.

SB 38 – By Coleman.

An Act relating to sales and use tax; amending 68 O.S. 2021, Sections 1353, as last amended by Section 4, Chapter 441, O.S.L. 2024, and 1403 (68 O.S. Supp. 2024, Section 1353), which relate to apportionment of revenues; modifying certain apportionment for certain fiscal years; updating statutory reference; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

SB 39 – By Daniels.

An Act relating to firearms; amending 21 O.S. 2021, Sections 1289.9, 1290.10, and 1290.11, which relate to carrying weapons under the influence of alcohol and the Oklahoma Self-Defense Act; modifying inclusions; modifying elements of eligibility; prohibiting certain denial; updating statutory language and reference; and providing an effective date.

SB 40 – By McIntosh.

An Act relating to firearms; amending 21 O.S. 2021, Section 1289.7a, which relates to transporting or storing firearms; removing liability provision; prohibiting the establishment or enforcement of certain policy; removing exception and applicability provision; amending 21 O.S. 2021, Section 1290.22, which relates to the Oklahoma Self-Defense Act; clarifying certain prohibited conduct and exception; providing for the filing of a civil action; directing court to award damages and fees; providing an exception; clarifying liability provisions; allowing for the transport of firearms or legal weapons in motor vehicle; defining term; and providing an effective date.

SB 41 – By Burns.

An Act relating to memorial highway and bridge designations; designating the PFC Lewis Othel Branscum Memorial Bridge; providing for codification; and providing an effective date.

SB 42 – By Gollihare.

An Act relating to the Oklahoma Boating Safety Regulation Act; amending 63 O.S. 2021, Sections 4201 and 4212, which relate to definitions and operation of towing vessel; defining certain term; requiring certain flag under certain circumstance; updating statutory language; and providing an effective date.

SB 43 – By Daniels.

An Act relating to income tax; amending 68 O.S. 2021, Section 2358, as last amended by Section 155, Chapter 452, O.S.L. 2024 (68 O.S. Supp. 2024, Section 2358), which relates to adjustments; eliminating limitation on itemization of wagering losses for certain tax years; updating statutory language; updating statutory references; and providing an effective date.

SB 44 – By Rader.

An Act relating to sales tax; amending 68 O.S. 2021, Section 1356, as last amended by Section 148, Chapter 452, O.S.L. 2024 (68 O.S. Supp. 2024, Section 1356), which relates to sales tax exemption; providing exemption to entities in performance of a contract with an exempt entity; updating statutory language; and providing an effective date.

SB 45 – By Rader.

An Act relating to ad valorem tax; amending 68 O.S. 2021, Sections 2906 and 2907, which relate to claims for property tax relief; modifying certain income limitation; modifying claim limit; updating statutory language; updating statutory references; making language gender neutral; and providing an effective date.

SB 46 – By Weaver.

An Act relating to income tax; amending 68 O.S. 2021, Section 2358, as last amended by Section 155, Chapter 452, O.S.L. 2024 (68 O.S. Supp. 2024, Section 2358), which relates to adjustments; requiring the subtraction of certain income to arrive at Oklahoma adjusted gross income; updating statutory language; updating statutory references; and providing an effective date.

SB 47 – By Dossett.

An Act relating to fee on coin-operated music and amusement devices; amending 68 O.S. 2021, Section 1503, which relates to amount of license fee; making language gender neutral; modifying annual fee on certain coin-operated devices; updating statutory language; and providing an effective date.

SB 48 – By Rader.

An Act relating to income tax; amending 68 O.S. 2021, Section 2358, as last amended by Section 155, Chapter 452, O.S.L. 2024 (68 O.S. Supp. 2024, Section 2358), which

relates to adjustments; limiting deduction for qualifying gains receiving capital treatment to certain tax years; updating statutory language; updating statutory references; and providing an effective date.

SB 49 – By Rader.

An Act relating to sales tax; amending 68 O.S. 2021, Section 1356, as last amended by Section 148, Chapter 452, O.S.L. 2024 (68 O.S. Supp. 2024, Section 1356), which relates to exemptions for governmental and nonprofit entities; providing exemption for certain organization providing services to abused and neglected children; requiring submission of certain documentation; updating statutory language; updating statutory references; and providing an effective date.

SB 50 – By Dossett.

An Act relating to sales tax; amending 68 O.S. 2021, Section 1357, as last amended by Section 4, Chapter 363, O.S.L. 2024 (68 O.S. Supp. 2024, Section 1357), which relates to exemptions; updating statutory references; updating statutory language; providing exemption for firearm and gun safety devices; defining terms; and providing an effective date.

SB 51 – By Hicks.

An Act relating to income tax credit; providing a credit for the purchase of an e-bike; providing for refundability under certain circumstances; defining term; providing for codification; and providing an effective date.

SB 52 – By Hicks.

An Act relating to income tax; amending 68 O.S. 2021, Section 2357.43, which relates to Oklahoma earned income tax credit; limiting certain calculation of credit to certain tax years; clarifying statutory language; updating statutory references; and providing an effective date.

SB 53 – By Rader of the Senate and West (Tammy) of the House.

An Act relating to child sexual abuse material; amending Section 1, Chapter 181, O.S.L. 2024 (15 O.S. Supp. 2024, Section 791), which relates to definitions; modifying term; 21 O.S. 2021, Section 843.5, as amended by Section 2, Chapter 151, O.S.L. 2024 (21 O.S. Supp. 2024, Section 843.5), which relates to child abuse; modifying term; amending 21 O.S. 2021, Section 1040.12a, as amended by Section 3, Chapter 103, O.S.L. 2024 (21 O.S. Supp. 2024, Section 1040.12a), which relates to possession of child sexual abuse material; modifying term; amending 21 O.S. 2021, Section 1024.1, as amended by Section 2, Chapter 103, O.S.L. 2024 (21 O.S. Supp. 2024, Section 1024.1), which relates to definitions; modifying term; updating statutory language; and providing an effective date.

SB 54 – By Weaver.

An Act relating to motor vehicle safety; amending 47 O.S. 2021, Section 11-902, which relates to persons under the influence of alcohol or other intoxicating substance; modifying sentencing provisions for certain violations; modifying scope of certain offense;

creating felony and misdemeanor offenses; modifying scope of penalties for certain offense; updating statutory language and references; and providing an effective date.

SB 55 – By Nice.

An Act relating to the Oklahoma Minimum Wage Act; amending 40 O.S. 2021, Section 197.2, which relates to the establishment of minimum wages; increasing minimum wage amount; providing for additional increase over certain time period; updating statutory language; and providing an effective date.

SB 56 – By Gollihare.

An Act relating to home care; defining terms; directing the Oklahoma Health Care Authority to establish certain program subject to certain conditions; stating qualification criteria for program; authorizing and requiring certain standards; imposing certain duty on home care agencies; directing certain reimbursement of home care services; directing promulgation of rules; requiring application for certain federal approval; amending 63 O.S. 2021, Section 1-1961, as amended by Section 3, Chapter 294, O.S.L. 2024 (63 O.S. Supp. 2024, Section 1-1961), which relates to definitions used in the Home Care Act; modifying definition; updating statutory language; providing for codification; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

SB 57 – By Gollihare.

An Act relating to motor vehicles; amending 47 O.S. 2021, Section 11-901d, as amended by Section 93, Chapter 282, O.S.L. 2022 (47 O.S. Supp. 2024, Section 1-229.35), which relates to vapor product manufacturer attestation; defining terms; modifying and adding requirements for certain attestation; transferring certain duties to the Office of the Attorney General; updating statutory language; providing certain exemptions; requiring certain notice; directing seizure of certain products; providing date of certain withdrawal; prohibiting certain sales; establishing certain penalties and remedies for violations; imposing certain requirements on nonresident of foreign manufacturer; allowing certain compliance checks; promulgating certain rules; directing certain funds; requiring certain report; amending 68 O.S. 2021, Sections 400.1, as amended by Section 3, Chapter 285, O.S.L. 2023, 400.5, as amended by Section 4, Chapter 285, O.S.L. 2023, 401, 414, 415, as amended by Section 2, Chapter 285, O.S.L. 2023, 417, as amended by Section 5, Chapter 285, O.S.L. 2023, 420.1, and 422 (68 O.S. SB 1103 – By Jett.

An Act relating to torts; prohibiting prosecution for certain acts; clarifying actions deemed reasonable; defining term; providing for codification; and providing an effective date.

SB 1104 – By Frix.

An Act relating to medical marijuana; amending 63 O.S. 2021, Section 427.13, as last amended by Section 25, Chapter 182, O.S.L. 2024 (63 O.S. Supp. 2024, Section 427.13), which relates to medical marijuana inventory tracking system; requiring the Oklahoma Medical Marijuana Authority to choose certain vendor; requiring certain features for certain tracking system; and providing an effective date.

Supp. 2024, Section 256), which relates to aircraft registration fees and taxes; transferring apportionment duties to Service Oklahoma; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

SB 1109 – By Murdock.

An Act relating to the Youthful Offender Act; amending 10A O.S. 2021, Section 2-5-205, as amended by Section 5, Chapter 375, O.S.L. 2022 (10A O.S. Supp. 2024, Section 2-5-205), which relates to certification as youthful offender or juvenile; adding offenses for which certain juveniles may receive an adult sentence; updating statutory references; and providing an effective date.

SB 1110 – By Murdock.

An Act relating to sales tax; amending 68 O.S. 2021, Section 1358.1, which relates to the proof of eligibility for the agriculture sales tax exemption; expanding the period between permit renewals; and providing an effective date.

SB 1111 – By Woods.

An Act relating to cockfighting; amending 21 O.S. 2021, Sections 1692.1, 1692.2, 1692.3, 1692.4, and 1692.8, which relate to cockfighting definitions, offenses, and penalties; modifying definition; deleting definition; reducing penalties for certain offenses; adding punishment for additional offenses; updating statutory references; repealing 21 O.S. 2021, Sections 1692.5, 1692.6, and 1692.7, which relate to criminal offenses and asset forfeitures related to cockfighting violations; and providing an effective date.

SB 1112 – By Rader.

An Act relating to lodging tax; excluding discounted or comped rooms or lodging from gross receipts upon which a lodging tax is levied; providing for codification; and providing an effective date.

SB 1113 – By Prieto.

An Act relating to the Oklahoma Children’s Code; amending 10A O.S. 2021, Section 1-4-401, which relates to discovery and court rules concerning juvenile proceedings; defining terms; creating rebuttable presumption; authorizing court to order disclosure of certain information; specifying records subject to certain disclosure; authorizing court to take certain actions during deprived proceedings; providing for confidentiality of certain information; and providing an effective date.

SB 1114 – By Woods.

An Act relating to ad valorem tax; providing credit for owners of property that qualify for certain limitation on the growth of fair cash value; stipulating credit amount; prescribing procedures to claim credit; requiring assessor to deduct credit amount from certain ad valorem tax liability; prohibiting refundability of credit; providing for codification; and providing an effective date.

SB 1115 – By Daniels.

SB 1117 – By Stewart.

An Act relating to taxation; creating the Joint Interim Committee on the Elimination of Ad Valorem Taxes; designating membership; designating co-chairs; authorizing meeting to convene; prescribing duties and powers of committee; requiring state agencies and political subdivisions to provide certain information and assistance; requiring submission of report; abolishing committee after certain period; providing for noncodification; providing an effective date; and providing conditional effective date.

SB 1122 – By Hall.

An Act relating to ad valorem tax; amending 68 O.S. 2021, Sections 2808 and 2847, which relate to definitions and assessments of railroad, air carrier, and public service corporation property; defining term; requiring the State Board of Equalization to assess certain property used to provide wired broadband service; prescribing requirements for assessment; prescribing assessment ratio; authorizing the Oklahoma Tax Commission to promulgate rules; updating statutory language; and providing an effective date.

SB 1123 – By Standridge.

SJR 2 – By Daniels.

A Joint Resolution directing the Secretary of State to refer to the people for their approval or rejection a proposed amendment to Section 23 of Article X of the Oklahoma Constitution; updating reference; modifying purpose for specified procedures; modifying specified duty of State Board of Equalization; requiring Board to certify tax expenditure limitation; specifying formula for limitation; making requirement to certify limitation conditional; providing for spending limit; prescribing determination of spending limit under certain circumstances; deleting certain funds from specified estimate; deleting percentage limit on change in legislative appropriations; modifying duty of Board with respect to determination of revenue available for appropriation; clarifying status of certain funds as surplus funds and providing for surplus funds amount under specified circumstances; renaming Constitutional Reserve Fund as Constitutional Emergency Fund; modifying amounts accruing to such fund; providing for the status of interest income; providing for

Section 38 to Article II; preventing infringement of the fundamental right of a citizen to grow and purchase food; providing ballot title; and directing filing.

SJR 9 – By Guthrie.

JOINT SESSION

The Second Joint Session of the First Regular Session of the Sixtieth Legislature was called to order by the President of the Senate, Lieutenant Governor Matt Pinnell.

Senator Daniels moved that the attendance roll call of the Senate be considered the attendance roll call of the Senate in Joint Session, which motion was declared adopted.

Representative Josh West moved that the attendance roll call of the House of Representatives be considered the attendance roll call of the House in Joint Session, which motion was declared adopted.

President Pinnell declared quorums of the Senate and House present and Joint Session duly assembled.

The invocation was offered by Pastor Ronnie Wilson.

Senator Daniels moved that the President and Speaker appoint a committee of members from the Senate and House of Representatives, respectively, as a Joint Committee to notify Governor Kevin Stitt that the Second Joint Session of the First Regular Session of the Sixtieth Legislature is now in Joint Session and ready to receive him and hear his message, which motion was declared adopted.

President Pinnell appointed for the Senate the following: Senators Jech, Rader, Stanley and Daniels.

Speaker Hilbert appointed for the House of Representatives the following: Representatives Banning, Duel, Manger, Maynard, Roberts and Kevin West.

President Pinnell recognized Sergeant at Arms, Adam Cain, who announced the arrival of the Honorable Kevin Stitt, Governor of the State of Oklahoma.

Governor Stitt was escorted to the Speaker's rostrum by the Joint Committee and presented to the Joint Session by President Pinnell where he delivered his message.

MESSAGE OF GOVERNOR KEVIN STITT

Lieutenant Governor Matt Pinnell, Speaker Kyle Hilbert and President Pro Tem Lonnie Paxton, members of the 60th Legislature, members of the Judiciary, statewide elected officials, tribal leaders. To my cabinet members – thank you for your service to our great state. To my beautiful wife Sarah, who has inspired hope in Oklahomans across our state, and my mom and dad, thank you for being here today and for your support and love. To my children who are with us today, I know it was either go to school or go hear dad talk. Glad you're here today. And to my fellow Oklahomans, I'm so thankful to my Heavenly Father for letting me stand before you to deliver my 7th State of the State. I'm excited to make 2025 the best year in our state's history. Some of you are new to this building. I'm looking forward to working with you on behalf of all four million Oklahomans. Many of you are seasoned veterans. We've gotten so much done in the last 6 years together. We built the largest savings account our state has ever seen. We passed the largest tax cut in state history. Our economy is the strongest it's ever been.

We have become a top ten state for business. We are number four for GDP growth. We are number two in lowest cost of doing business. We are number eight in net migration to our

state. We have 3,500 fewer kids in foster care than we did when I took office. The State of our state is the strongest it's ever been, and we are not done yet.

Let's continue to build on this progress and make Oklahoma the very best state to live, to work, and to raise our families. For those of us in this room, I want to remind you, we are here for such a time as this. We will face challenges, but we're stronger when we face them together as fellow Oklahomans and fellow Americans.

I've thought a lot about what we've been called here to do - to build on the success of those who came before us, to steward what we have been given, and to dream about what's possible for our kids and grandkids. I believe we're here to pursue something greater than ourselves - something that will show the world what Oklahoma is all about. Winston Churchill said, "The price of greatness is responsibility." That means sacrificing now for future benefit. The reality is there is going to be pain either way - the pain of discipline now, or the pain of regret later. Many of us have witnessed that over the last 6 years.

In 2018, the state was facing massive budget deficits and we had nothing in savings. Over the next six years, we said no to good ideas in the moment so we could say yes to the well-being of future generations of Oklahomans. Because of that discipline, we got to come together as Republicans and Democrats to say yes to cutting the grocery tax last year. This makes life more affordable for millions of Oklahomans across our state when inflation is crushing working families.

As we begin this new session, we will be faced with many "good" ideas. The greatness of our state depends on discipline and the willingness to set the right priorities, even when it's difficult. In 2019, I said the Oklahoma turnaround starts right here, right now, and we've seen that turnaround happen. Let's not go back to 2018.

I want to set a savings floor of \$4 billion dollars to ensure we can weather any financial storm. It's conservative policies like this that protect the American dream in Oklahoma. But what is the American dream? On its face, it's the ability to have a family, own a home, have a good job, and build the life you want. It springs from the belief that with hard work and resilience you can accomplish anything God puts on your heart.

But the American Dream is not guaranteed. We have to have the courage to fight for it. This past election signaled a shift in the way we think as a nation. More and more, Americans are moving away from the extremes and turning back to the values that have always defined our success: personal responsibility, resilience, family values, and hard work. Not DEI, government mandates, or regulations. Not extreme gender ideology, Green New Deals, or open borders. Americans voted for courage. They voted for freedom. They voted for the American Dream, not more government. We have a mandate to support and pass conservative, limited government legislation that makes the American Dream possible for all four million Oklahomans. In order to do that, we need to commit to these four principles that Oklahomans voted for.

We need to:

- 1 – Protect Oklahoma taxpayers.
- 2 - Be the Best State for Business
- 3 - Safeguard our Savings
- 4 - Protect the Oklahoma Way of Life

These ideas aren't controversial, but they will require tough choices. They will require sacrifice. They will require that we trust that Oklahomans know how to spend their money better than the government can. That we trust that businesses want to make our state better for everyone by creating jobs and investing in their communities. That we say no to the good now so we can say yes to the great later. That we put our constituents over special interests at all costs. The price of greatness is responsibility. We need to ask ourselves: how big should government be? States like Texas and Florida spend less per person than any other state. They also have no income tax. And you don't hear anyone complaining about their roads, schools or hospitals. States all around us – Nebraska, Missouri, Arkansas, Colorado and Louisiana – are cutting their income taxes and have lower rates than we do. If we don't act quickly, we are going to be left behind and we'll be considered a high tax state. So I'm calling for a half and a path – A half point cut to the individual and business income tax and a path to zero income tax.

I like to remind the naysayers when we cut taxes, the money doesn't disappear. It simply stays in Oklahomans' pockets and gets reinvested in our economy. In times of excess revenue, Oklahomans should keep more of their hard-earned money. That is how we keep pace with our competition and protect Oklahoma taxpayers. It's no secret. Left unrestrained, government will always grow and grow and grow. It's just like the lobbyist bar tabs at Broadway 10. President Trump and Elon Musk, through DOGE, will determine the economic trajectory of our nation. By cutting the size of the federal government, we can finally start having an honest conversation about our national debt. If we continue on the path we're on, we'll be caught in a death spiral. Government is overspending and causing inflation to rise rapidly.

To deflect the burden of rising costs, federal government expands benefits for more people. More people end up reliant on the government, resulting in more deficit spending. It's a great big cycle. And now, we're spending a quarter of our federal income – 25% – to make interest-only payments on our national debt. That's more than we spend on our national defense. I was at Mar-a-Lago a few weeks ago and talked to President Trump about DOGE at the state level. I'm excited about the momentum, and we're going to build on it here in Oklahoma.

Today, I'm launching DOGE-OK to keep the focus on flat budgets and limited government. For years, I've instructed my cabinet secretaries and agency directors to shrink employee count and cut unnecessary contracts. I am committed to having fewer state employees at the end of my term than when I took office in 2019. I also mandated an end to work from home policies for state employees to better serve the people of our state. Even still, we have public officials who have asked the Legislature to double the size of their budget. Our constituents voted for fiscal conservatism, not growing government.

If people hear one thing I say, it's that I want Oklahoma to be the best state for business. By being the best state for business, we're paving the way to be the best state for education, the best state for infrastructure, and the best state for families. Rising tides lift all boats. The world is taking notice of our efforts. This past year, a manufacturing company announced that it's going to invest \$620 million dollars in Oklahoma, bringing thousands of jobs and spurring more economic growth. Every day, people from around the world are chasing the American Dream all the way to places like Stillwater, Guymon, Madill and Inola. In just the last year, 274 businesses opened their doors or expanded their operations in our state. Entrepreneurs created over 31,000 new jobs, lifting up their communities and contributing to our state. This is not an accident. Here in Oklahoma, we have business friendly policies and the most affordable, reliable energy anywhere thanks to limited government, common sense, and clean burning natural gas. Because of that, our state has more opportunities than ever.

In my last state of the state, I said I wanted Oklahoma to be the high-tech data center capital of the world. That vision is becoming reality. Google continues to invest in its data center in Pryor, Oklahoma, and now it's one of its largest in the world. A few weeks ago, President Trump announced a \$20 billion dollar investment in data centers across the country – and Oklahoma is on that list. Those of us in this room know there is no better place than Oklahoma. This is a massive opportunity to create more jobs for people in our state and to continue to put us on the map as the best state for business. Let's keep building on our business friendly policies.

I've been vocal about getting business courts set up in Oklahoma. I saw court systems in other states playing politics with people's businesses. I wanted to make sure that never happens in Oklahoma. I'm grateful for the work Jon Echols and Secretary Jeff Starling have done to research and execute this idea. Let's get business courts finished this session, and make sure business disputes and complicated contracts will be handled by judges with business expertise. It's policies like this that make our state something to brag about.

In addition to our amazing business friendly policies, we have a wealth of natural resources to make our state the best place to do business. Oil and gas giants like Devon, Continental and ONEOK continue to grow their footprint here. Expand Energy made its home in Oklahoma City and is the largest natural gas producer in the nation. Our energy industry is a driving force in our economy, and when they are free from politically motivated barriers and overregulation, they can power our nation and the world. That means more businesses can come online and more electricity can be generated in our state. I want to make 2025 the year of the Energy Abundance Agenda and continue to unleash Oklahoma's energy potential. So let's make sure we can build more generation on the meter and behind the meter to keep our energy the most affordable and reliable in the nation.

Because we're top ten for business, it's time for us to become top ten in education. When Oklahomans elected me, they elected a businessman with a fresh set of eyes to challenge the status quo. We had spent too many years settling for an education system that was failing our kids. So we ushered in the largest education freedom movement in the nation. And just recently, Oklahoma was ranked number four in the nation for education freedom. I

believe that when you inject competition, everyone gets better, and we're seeing that here in our school systems. We passed open transfer in our state. Now, kids aren't trapped in failing neighborhood schools. Then, we passed a tax credit so money could follow the student. Now, thousands of kids can go to the school where they learn best and where they're best equipped to succeed. We paved the way for the first ever religious charter school in the nation. I am so excited that the U.S. Supreme Court will hear this groundbreaking religious freedom case. After all, the government shouldn't stand in the way of a parent's right to educate their children in line with their values.

But we also need to make sure kids are IN their classrooms. I've had parents from all over the state reach out to me with concerns about virtual school days. In some places in Oklahoma, kids are only required to be in their seats at school for 148 days a year. For comparison, Kansas students are in their seats for 186 days every year. We all know that kids learn best when they're in the classroom with our great teachers. It's just common sense. Pro Tem Paxton is already focused on this and I'm excited to work with him and Senator Thompson to make sure kids are in their seats ready to learn. Let's eliminate virtual days in our public schools.

If kids aren't leaving high school college ready or career ready, we haven't done our job. I want to sign a bill that creates more internships and apprenticeships. If we can get this right, we'll lead the nation in workforce development. Companies from all around the world will move operations to Oklahoma because it'll be clear that we have the strongest workforce anywhere. So I'm calling on businesses, schools, and universities to create 250 new apprenticeship and internship programs this year. Let's get it done.

Now that we've got kids in the right classroom, they need to be free from distractions. This past fall, I challenged schools to implement phone-free school policies. I want to brag on Rob Miller. He's here with us today. Thanks for being here Rob. He is the Superintendent of Bixby Public Schools. Through his years in education, he's noticed a clear decline in his students' attention and performance as cell phone use has increased in his schools. To him, the solution was clear. Kids learn better when they aren't distracted by cell phones and social media. He implemented a cell phone free policy in Bixby Public Schools, and he's seen a huge improvement in his students.

I want to challenge the Legislature and school districts across the state to consider ways to make cell phone free schools a reality for all students. It doesn't have to cost anything – it just needs to be effective for the students we serve. Speaker Hilbert – I've enjoyed talking about this issue with you and I'm excited to get something across the finish line this session. I'm proud of how our schools took the cell phone free challenge to make sure our students succeed, but all of that means nothing, if our kids aren't safe in their communities.

Our greatest responsibility as leaders is to protect all four million Oklahomans. Americans made it clear – they want their President to defend our borders and protect our communities. I sent our National Guard troops to Texas to help secure the southern border. We vocally opposed sanctuary city policies and pushed for the deportation of criminals who were here illegally. I'm so excited to have a law and order President back in the White

House that will listen to the American people and our calls for safe communities. On Day One in office, President Trump closed the border and made it clear that illegal immigration would no longer be tolerated. I launched Operation Guardian here in Oklahoma to help keep communities safe. I instructed Commissioner of Public Safety Tim Tipton and Department of Corrections Director Steve Harpe to be ready to assist the Trump administration as they begin deporting those who have committed crimes while here illegally. After all, the Oklahoma taxpayers shouldn't be paying millions of dollars a year to keep criminals incarcerated when they shouldn't be in our state to begin with.

But to have safe communities, we also have to have some common sense. Let me tell you a story about a man named John Standfill.

John made some bad choices and spent 15 years in prison paying for them.

He served his time, paid his debt to society, and now is helping give other people second chances at OSU's Oklahoma City Center for Social Innovation. However, he reportedly owes nearly \$30,000 in fines, fees and court costs. That's simply unacceptable. It's time to reform this system and get rid of what is essentially debtors' prison. We know that high fees keep people trapped in this cycle and contribute to higher recidivism. That doesn't make sense. I want to change that structure and make sure that a second chance is actually a second chance and get rid of fines, fees and court costs for good. John is here with us today. John, thank you for letting me share your story today. We've made so much progress together. Nearly 40,000 Oklahomans have received a second chance because of our efforts. We closed four prisons, saving Oklahoma taxpayers hundreds of millions of dollars. We are on a trajectory to top ten and we will continue to lead the nation in common sense criminal justice.

While I love telling people about our pro business policies, our great teachers, and our safe communities, at my core, I love to brag about how much we value faith and family in Oklahoma. I wanted to cement this priority, so I created the Office of Faith Based Initiatives. This office focuses on bringing the faith community and non-profit community together to solve problems that the government can't. Daniel and May Cave lived in Choctaw, OK and lost their home and belongings in a Fall tornado. The Office of Faith Based Initiatives helped connect the Caves with Harrah Baptist Church which provided them with meals, childcare, clothing, and moving assistance. It was the perfect display of the Oklahoma Standard – neighbors walking with neighbors. I want Oklahoma to be the example for the rest of the country when it comes to connecting churches and non-profits to people in need. Daniel and May, thank you for being with us today.

The reality is that bills and press releases don't solve societal problems. The real work begins at home with strong mothers and strong fathers. For the past two years, I declared November "Family Month" and I encouraged Oklahomans to spend more intentional quality time together. I'm looking forward to celebrating Family Month every year because now, more than ever, we need to promote strong families. It is so clear that strong families are the drivers for success in nearly every area. I say it all the time – kids need their moms AND their dads. But right now, our nation is experiencing a crisis. A crisis of fatherlessness. The result? Less resilient families and less resilient children. At the end of 2022, nearly 250,000 Oklahoma children were living without a father in the home.

Nationally, 71% of those who drop out of high school grew up without a present father. 66% of juveniles in state custody experienced fatherlessness. But here's the secret – we have the power to change this. The numbers don't lie. Kids with engaged fathers are: 43% more likely to get As in school; twice as likely to go to college; and 80% less likely to spend time in jail.

We can turn the statistics around, just by continuing to uplift families and promote marriages. That can start at the dinner table. In my family, we've worked hard to make Friday night a sacred time for us to come together and share a meal. Sarah and I use this time to talk with our kids and catch up on their week. I challenge each of us to start with one extra meal. Studies have shown that sharing family meals results in improved school performance, better family relationships, improved nutrition and lower likelihood of future substance abuse. Let's take the opportunity to intentionally engage with our families. I remember growing up in Norman, Friday night was family night. After dinner, Mom would make popcorn, dad would turn on our favorite tv show, and we'd spend time together as a family.

Mom and Dad, I'm so grateful for how you led our family. Thank you. This is how we make the American Dream possible in Oklahoma. If we want a strong nation, we have to have strong communities. If we want to have strong communities, we have to have strong families. If we want to have strong families, we **MUST** have strong fathers. The health of our nation comes directly from having strong fathers in the home. That's why I have put such an emphasis on fatherhood programs in my time in office. But this isn't a policy idea or a funding request. It's a request for each for us in this room to take the responsibility to lead our families well. Our positions as elected leaders are not the most important positions we hold. Our roles as fathers and mothers and family members will do far more for the future of our society than the nameplate on our doors. There is no higher calling than to raise up kids to be strong men and women of God and to instill in them the values and ethics that are essential to the success of our nation. It takes courage to make the choice to be that present mother or father or grandparent.

The American Dream depends on families who are willing to step up and change the status quo. President Ronald Reagan said, "There is no institution more vital to our Nation's survival than the American family. Here the seeds of personal character are planted, the roots of public virtue first nourished. Through love and instruction, discipline, guidance and example, we learn from our mothers and fathers these values that will shape our private lives and our public citizenship."

I want that to be our legacy – a state where the American Dream is alive and well because of strong families. Every generation has the same longing for the American Dream. In the United States, where every state is a laboratory of democracy, we can see in real time which policies promote the American Dream, and which ones push it farther out of reach. I want Oklahoma to be known around the world as the state where businesses come because they know that they can operate freely without fear of gotcha bureaucrats or burdensome regulations. The state where parents have the freedom to educate their children in line with their values. The state where families flock because they know their kids can grow up in a

safe, hopeful environment. The state where neighbors care for each other and there is always hope for tomorrow.

Oklahoma is a haven. A shining city on a hill. And the American Dream is alive and well in Oklahoma. May God Bless you and may God continue to bless the great state of Oklahoma.

Upon motion of Representative Josh West, the Joint Session was ordered dissolved at 1:35p.m.
