Land Ownership - Prohibitions

- Federal law unlawful for any alien or person not a citizen of the United States to acquire title to, or own, land
 - Exempt: bona fide residents, those declaring intent to become a citizen
- Oklahoma Constitution Art. 22, § 1
 - No alien or person not a citizen of the U.S. shall acquire title to or own land
 - Exempt: "Indians born within the United States...[and] aliens or persons not citizens of the United States who may become bona fide residents of this State."
 - Legislature to enact laws for forfeiture or disposal otherwise within five years
- Oklahoma Statutes 60 O.S. §§ 121-127



Who is in; who is out?

- Okla. Const. prohibits corporations from owning rural farming land Parwal Inv. Co. v. State, 1918 OK 498
- 1974: Corporation may hold title, but an alien individual may not acquire title to that land upon dissolution - 1974 OK AG 214
- 1976: "Person" includes corporations and government; the 1974 opinion relates to corporations created under American jurisdictions - 1976 OK AG 253
- 1979: corporations cannot own rural farming land; withdraw 1974 opinion 1979 OK AG 286
- 1981: alien corporations are subject to land ownership restrictions, BUT "person" includes corporations and domesticated corporations are residents State ex rel. Cartwright v. Hillcrest Investments, Ltd., 1981 OK 27



State Question 788 and Land Ownership

- SQ 788 (2018) permitting licensed legal cultivation, use, and possession of marijuana for medicinal purposes.
- Surge in marijuana grow farms, including those connected to foreign enterprises and adversaries
- Public safety and effects on communities
- Legislative response



Senate Bill 212 (2023)

- Restrict indirect ownership of land by aliens and non-citizens who are not residents of the state
- Deed recorded with a county clerk must have an accompanying affidavit
- Exempt: Business entity engaging in regulated interstate commerce in accordance with federal law
- Attorney General may, in his discretion, exempt any deed when deemed necessary



Senate Bill 1705 (2024)

- Extends land ownership prohibition to foreign government adversaries and foreign government enterprises
 - Designated by the United States as "hostile" or a County of Particular Concern
 - Foreign adversary holds controlling interest in a business, sovereign wealth fund, or state-backed investment fund
- Statutory exemptions
 - 2024 OK AG 2
 - Entity with a national security agreement with the Committee on Foreign Investment in the United States (CFIUS)



House Bill 2905 (2023)

- Gives AG, OBN and OSBI full enforcement authority over medical marijuana laws.
- Allows the AG to subpoen business documents, conduct on—site inspections, seize and destroy illegal products, and to enter into memoranda of understanding with other law enforcement agencies to create a coordinated approach to eradicating illegal grow operations.
- Requires revocation of any business license if the business has intentionally not paid the required taxes and prohibits any future ability to hold a license of any type.
- Limits future grow licenses to one per property.



Foreign Agents Registration Act

- Agents for foreign governments, political parties, or other foreign principals must register with the Department of Justice, if engaged in political activities
- Political activities: intend to influence U.S. government policies, program, or public opinion on behalf of a foreign principal
 - lobbying and public relations
- Penalties: Criminal up to five years in prison and \$10,000 fine
- Oklahoma parallels
 - House Bill 1150
 - Senate Bill 660



Open questions, proposals, & data

- Bona fide resident
 - Remember: Oklahoma Constitution excepts an individual who may become a bona fide resident
 - Statute: "is or shall become a bona fide resident"
 - Person's honest intent to make a place one's residence or domicile, a conscious decision to make a location an individual's home - *In re Initiative Petition No.* 379, State Question 726, 2006 OK 89
- National Farm Security Plan
