The role of firearms in U.S. suicides

More than half of suicides in the United States involve a firearm

• Among U.S. Veterans, 74% of suicides were by firearm

Lethal Means Safety saves lives

Range of options for making firearms and other lethal means less accessible









We need trusted, credible messengers to talk about Lethal Means Safety and out-of-home storage

- Healthcare providers are traditional messengers
- Problems with this approach:
 - Mistrust
 - Interventions only within healthcare settings are missing the audience
- Credible messengers include other firearm owners, military Veterans, & firearms professionals (e.g., Federal Firearm Licensees/FFLs)
- FFLs are most trusted location for voluntary out-of-home storage

PUBLIC HEALTH APPROACH TO SUICIDE PREVENTION Reduce firearm suicides by facilitating secure in-home and temporary out-of-home firearm storage while fostering a culture of responsible gun ownership and mental wellness

2022 Louisiana legislation addressed retailers' concerns about potential liability

- Bi-partisan legislation HB260 (la.gov)
- Veterans and retailer testified in support
- Passed unanimously in LA State House and Senate, signed by Governor Aug 2022
- First legislation to define FFL (Federal Firearm Licensee) and temporary hold

Immunity from civil liability

(except in case of unlawful conduct by FFL)

Since then, laws modeled on Louisiana have passed in Montana, Arkansas, Nevada & Alabama

In anticipation of expansion, TAP is providing technical assistance and expert testimony to other states

STORAGE OPTIONS


- Clean and Hold: Your retailer may hold your firearms for a set period of time and may offer basic cleaning or other services for a small fee.
- Temporary Storage: Your retailer may agree to temporarily store your firearm for free or a small cost.
