

Section 130 Program

Section 130 Overview

- Section 130 is the At-grade Rail-Highway Crossing Safety Program
- A part of the Highway Safety Improvement Program.
- As of FFY 2022, in accordance with 23 USC 130(F), Section 130 projects are funded at 100% federal share
- Oklahoma is appropriated \$5.6 million annually
- ODOT allows up to \$8 million to be spent due to the safety benefit from decreased fatalities





Safety Improvement: Closed Crossing






- Cost Estimate \$15,000 per location
- Usually done in conjunction with a corridor
- Road Authority could be paid \$200,000 for closure






