

# Federal vs. State Sentencing

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## The Federal Sentencing Process

#### §2B3.1. Robbery

- (a) Base Offense Level: 20
- (b) Specific Offense Characteristics
  - If the property of a financial institution or post office was taken, or if the taking of such property was an object of the offense, increase by 2 levels.
  - (2) (A) If a firearm was discharged, increase by 7 levels; (B) if a firearm was otherwise used, increase by 6 levels; (C) if a firearm was brandished or possessed, increase by 5 levels; (D) if a dangerous weapon was otherwise used, increase by 4 levels; (E) if a dangerous weapon was brandished or possessed, increase by 3 levels; or (F) if a threat of death was made, increase by 2 levels.
  - (3) If any victim sustained bodily injury, increase the offense level according to the seriousness of the injury:

	DEGREE OF BODILY INJURY	INCREASE IN LEVEL
(A)	Bodily Injury	add 2
(B)	Serious Bodily Injury	add 4
(C)	Permanent or Life-Threatening Bodily Injur	y add 6
(D)	If the degree of injury is between that specified in subdivisions (A) and (B),	add 3 levels; or
(E)	If the degree of injury is between that specified in subdivisions (B) and (C),	add 5 levels.

Provided, however, that the cumulative adjustments from (2) and (3) shall not exceed 11 levels.

- (4) (A) If any person was abducted to facilitate commission of the offense or to facilitate escape, increase by 4 levels; or (B) if any person was
  - physically restrained to facilitate commission of the offense or to facilitate escape, increase by 2 levels.
- (5) If the offense involved carjacking, increase by 2 levels.
- (6) If a firearm, destructive device, or controlled substance was taken, or if the taking of such item was an object of the offense, increase by 1 level.

- Start with the base offense level 20 for Robbery
- Go through the Specific Offense
   Characteristics and add points as necessary
- Taking into consideration provided definitions and guidelines in the provided commentary.
- Attorneys argue about each step of the process.



## The Federal Process - Adjustments

- Add or subtract points based on relevant adjustments
- Categories include:
  - Victim-Related
  - Role in the Offense
  - Obstruction and Related
  - Multiple Counts
  - Acceptance of Responsibility

#### §3B1.1. Aggravating Role

Based on the defendant's role in the offense, increase the offense level as follows:

- (a) If the defendant was an organizer or leader of a criminal activity that involved five or more participants or was otherwise extensive, increase by **4** levels.
- (b) If the defendant was a manager or supervisor (but not an organizer or leader) and the criminal activity involved five or more participants or was otherwise extensive, increase by 3 levels.
- (c) If the defendant was an organizer, leader, manager, or supervisor in any criminal activity other than described in subsection (a) or (b), increase by **2** levels.

2Q1.3, comment. (n.7)	
	depending upon the nature and quantity of the substance involved and the risk associated with the offense
2Q1.3, comment. (n.8)	
	where a defendant has previously engaged in similar misconduct established by a civil adjudication or has failed to comply with an administrative order
2Q1.4, comment. (n.3(A))	
	in a case in which the offense did not cause a risk of death or serious bodily injury, and neither caused nor was in- tended to cause bodily injury
2Q1.4, comment. (n.3(B))	
	if the offense caused extreme psychological injury, or caused substantial property damage or monetary loss
2Q1.4, comment. (n.3(B))	
	if the offense was calculated to influence or affect the conduct of gov- ernment by intimidation or coercion, or to retaliate against govern- ment conduct
2Q2.1, comment. (n.5)	
	if the offense involved the destruction of a substantial quantity of fish, wildlife, or plants, and the seriousness of the offense is not adequately measured by the market value
2R1.1, comment. (n.7)	
	in the case of a defendant with previous antitrust convictions
2T1.8, comment. (n.1)	
	if the defendant was attempting to evade, rather than merely delay, payment of taxes

D2 = Attempted Escape from Penitentiary




