*The **Oklahoma Department of Agriculture, Food and Forestry** serves as the primary regulatory agency for Oklahoma's agriculture industry. ODAFF administers a broad array of programs to promote Oklahoma agriculture and protect Oklahomans and our natural resources.*

- Inspecting food products such as meat, poultry, and dairy products to maintain safety standards
- Fighting wildland fire
- Licensing confined animal feeding operations to ensure stewardship of natural resources
- Providing investigative services for livestock and agricultural equipment theft and arson
- Promoting Oklahoma agriculture businesses and products domestically and internationally

Founded in **1907**, this agency now encompasses the following divisions: Administrative Services, Agriculture Environmental Management Services, Animal Industry Services, Consumer Protection Services, Food Safety, Forestry Services, Office of General Counsel, Laboratory Services, Market Development, and Wildlife Services.





Four Regions of Exploration



ANIMAL HEALTH ALERT New Equine Interstate Movement Requirement

New required statement to be listed on all equine
CVIs for horses

"The equine listed on this CVI have, during the 21 days prior to the shipment date, not originated from a premises under EHV-1 quarantine, not been exposed to an EHV-1 positive equine, and not attended any event where an EHV-1 positive equine has been confirmed."

Effective through at least Jan. 1, 2026

This change is to provide more clarity around the horses being brought into Oklahoma and for the Oklahoma horses going to upcoming equine events

HIGHLY PATHOGENIC AVIAN INFLUENZA

CONFIRMED CASE IN BACKYARD FLOCK IN GRADY COUNTY

KNOW THE SIGNS AND SYMPTOMS

- Coughing, sneezing or difficulty breathing
- Lack of energy
- Decrease in feed or water intake
- Swelling or purple discoloration of head, eyelids, comb, wattle and legs
- Decrease in egg production
- Sudden unexplained death
- Quietness among the flock
