Twenty-seventh Legislative Day, Monday, March 23, 2026

HB 2936 – By Olsen and Adams of the House and Hamilton of the Senate.

An Act relating to children; amending 10 O.S. 2021, Section 557.5, which relates to the Oklahoma Gestational Agreement Act; prohibiting person from being an intended parent to a gestational agreement if individual has been convicted of a crime against a child; amending 10 O.S. 2021, Section 7505-5.1, as amended by Section 1, Chapter 59, O.S.L. 2024 (10 O.S. Supp. 2025, Section 7505-5.1), which relates to the Oklahoma Adoption Code; prohibiting placement of child in home if petitioners or any person residing in home of petitioners have been convicted of a crime against a child; and providing an effective date.

HB 2967 – By West (Rick) of the House and Jett of the Senate.

[revenue and taxation - vehicle excise tax - transfer of vehicle ownership - transfers - effective date]

HB 3627 – By Cantrell and Lawson of the House and Alvord of the Senate.

An Act relating to public meetings; amending 25 O.S. 2021, Section 307.1, as last amended by Section 3, Chapter 369, O.S.L. 2025 (25 O.S. Supp. 2025, Section 307.1), which relates to videoconference exceptions; providing exception for the State Committee of Blind Vendors; requiring members to be audible or visible; providing information meeting notice and agenda shall contain; and declaring an emergency.

HB 3721 – By Kelley and Deck of the House and Frix of the Senate.

An Act relating to retirement; amending 62 O.S. 2021, Section 3103, as last amended by Section 2, Chapter 361, O.S.L. 2024 (62 O.S. Supp. 2025, Section 3103), which relates to the Oklahoma Pension Legislation Actuarial Analysis Act; modifying terms; amending 11 O.S. 2021, Sections 49-106.1, as last amended by Section 2, Chapter 151, O.S.L. 2023, and 50-111.3 (11 O.S. Supp. 2025, Section 49-106.1), which relate to deferred option plans; amending 47 O.S. 2021, Section 2-305.2, as amended by Section 1, Chapter 80, O.S.L. 2022 (47 O.S. Supp. 2025, Section 2-305.2), which relates to deferred option plans; modifying provisions related to deferred option plans; permitting certain individuals to make certain election; defining term; providing for calculation of certain benefit; providing effective dates; providing for contingent effective dates based on outcome of approval of the emergency clause; and declaring an emergency.

HB 4132 – By Steagall and Fetgatter of the House and Alvord of the Senate.

An Act relating to technology; providing liability protections for counties and municipalities that adopt recognized cybersecurity frameworks; providing requirements for safe harbor qualification; permitting counties and municipalities to submit summary information to State Auditor and Inspector; providing for codification; and providing an effective date.

HB 4227 – By Kannady and Miller of the House and Weaver of the Senate.

An Act relating to child sexual abuse; creating the Cindy Clemishire Act; creating Trey's Law; prohibiting the concealing of details relating to certain claims; requiring confidentiality of certain identifying information; making prohibitions applicable to agreements entered into on certain date; providing exceptions; amending 22 O.S. 2021, Section 40.3A, which relates to reports of sexual crimes; modifying scope of reporting requirement exception; amending 22 O.S. 2021, Section 152, as last amended by Section 1, Chapter 115, O.S.L. 2025 (22 O.S. Supp. 2025, Section 152), which relates to criminal procedure; authorizing the prosecution of sexual crimes against children to be brought at any time; providing for noncodification; providing for codification; and providing an effective date.

HB 4303 – By Blair of the House and Gillespie of the Senate.

An Act relating to cities and towns; amending 11 O.S. 2021, Section 14-106, which relates to the requirement of publication of municipal ordinances; modifying requirement to publish ordinance to thirty days after passage; and providing an effective date.

HB 4322 – By Kendrix of the House and Howard of the Senate.

An Act relating to professions and occupations; amending 59 O.S. 2021, Section 396.2, which relates to the Funeral Services Licensing Act definitions; modifying definition for funeral director in charge; amending 59 O.S. 2021, Section 396.3, as last amended by Section 1, Chapter 50, O.S.L. 2025 (59 O.S. Supp. 2025, Section 396.3), which relates to funeral director in charge duties; removing requirement for funeral directors to be dually licensed; and providing an effective date.

HB 4478 – By Deck, Waldron and Provenzano of the House and Reinhardt of the Senate.

An Act relating to schools; amending 70 O.S. 2021, Section 5-129, which relates to the school activity fund; removing requirement to deposit certain funds by end of the next business day; eliminating reference to deposits for less than certain amount; requiring deposit when funds reach certain amount; requiring certain funds to be deposited at least once per business week; and providing an effective date.
