There are currently seven (7) statutory positions on the Board as specified in § 63, section 91: the State Anatomical Board is composed of the following members: the Deans or their designee of each accredited medical school and osteopathic medical school within the State of Oklahoma, the persons heading the Department of Anatomy, or comparable department in the medical and osteopathic medical schools or their designee, two (2) persons appointed jointly by the presidents of institutions of higher education within the state which have educational programs other than medical which require on a regular basis human anatomical materials, and one at-large member appointed by the Governor to represent the interests of the citizens of this state. There are no term limits set by statute. The Board shall elect from its membership a chairperson who shall perform such other duties as the Board may prescribe by rule.
