Division and Program Descriptions

Will Rogers Memorial Museum, tomb, and campus, Claremore

This 76-year-old museum is a focal point of Oklahoma tourism; a repository of the bulk of Will Rogers artifacts, archives, art, and history; site of the family tomb where Will Rogers and five family members are interred; the primary resource for public information about Will Rogers; a major image builder for Oklahoma; a living history classroom for students and researchers; a destination for tourists and visitors; and a point of quality and pride for citizens statewide and visitors from all points of the globe.

Education / Research / Educational Outreach

The library and archives are replete with thousands of photographs, manuscripts, newspaper and magazine articles, scrapbooks, and personal writings. The physical maintenance, protection, classification, and publication of these resources is an ongoing challenge. Sharing Will's life, words, and values with successive generations is a primary thrust. Successful adaptation and application of social media and maintenance of major website are of increasing importance, as are encouragement of researchers, film producers, writers, and students working on Will Rogers-related projects.

The 1875 living history Will Rogers Birthplace Ranch, Oologah

A 400-acre ranch, with farm animals including longhorns, is a re-creation of the setting that molded Rogers and is typical of ranches of Cherokee Indian pioneers. The ranch, which includes the two-story house in which Will Rogers was born in 1879, is open 8am-5pm, 365 days yearly. The site also includes a registered airstrip and an Amish-built barn.
