There is no breakdown of comparable licensing fees from surrounding states because the surrounding states do not require the same level of "abstracting" to be done regarding the marketability of title for a real estate transaction and there is not an "apples to apples" comparison. The State of Oklahoma requires an Abstract of Title that traces the interest(s) in the property back to sovereignty. Because of the depth of knowledge and quality of work needed, licensure is required. Surrounding states do a more surface level "title search" that is limited in scope and timeframe. Because of our more in-depth process, Title Insurance premiums and claims in the State of Oklahoma are some of the lowest in the nation. States that do require some sort of licensing for a Title Search Agent typically process those through their Insurance Department.
