A few more details about the job:

Responsibilities of the Legislative Analyst include:

- Conduct research and policy analysis on assigned subject matter and provide written summaries and background materials for possible legislative matters. Evaluate possible impact of legislation and legislative issues;
- Collaborate with bill authors and other interested parties to draft legislation;
- Attend and assist the standing committee assigned. Assist the committee chair by formulating a committee agenda, conducting committee meetings, and interim studies;
- Monitor and evaluate actions, programs, rules and regulations of agencies, boards, and commissions of which the committee assignment is vested with legislative oversight;
- Other tasks and special projects may be assigned on an as-needed basis.

Experience, knowledge, and skills we are seeking:

- Knowledge of research methodology and analytical techniques;
- Strong mastery of mechanics and usage of grammar, composition, and vocabulary;
- A team player who is not afraid of hard work and the ability to work under pressure of deadlines. The candidate should be able to work flexible, sometimes long hours during the legislative session;
