

Impacts of Food Insecurity

HEALTH

Exacerbates chronic illnesses including kidney disease, hypertension, diabetes, obesity.



ACADEMICS

Lower reading & math scores, increased behavior & social problems, lower graduation rates.



CHILDREN

Low birth-weight, delayed development, decreased language acquisition.



WORKFORCE

Weakened labor force, decreased educational attainment, increased health care costs.

Trains all sponsors Performs administrative reviews



Attends state agency's training Accepts financial and administrative responsibility of SFSP Partners with eligible sites, provides training and oversight


Meal Site Attends their sponsor's training Serves qualifying meals to all kids aged 18 and under Records the number of meals served



Average Number of FRPL Children/Site





- Navigating administrative requirements


