**Second Regular Session of the Forty-ninth Legislature
of the State of Oklahoma
Eighth Legislative Day, Thursday, February 12, 2004**

The Senate was called to order by Senator Rozell.

MESSAGE FROM THE HOUSE

Advising passage of and transmitting for consideration Engrossed **HBs 2076 and 2132**.

HB 2076 – By Mitchell and Bonny of the House and Morgan and Robinson of the Senate.

An Act relating to the Office of the State Fire Marshal; amending Section 2, Chapter 265, O.S.L. 2003, which relates to budget categories; changing category amounts; and declaring an emergency.

HB 2132 – By Peters of the House and Dunlap of the Senate.

An Act relating to vessel and motor registration; amending 63 O.S. 2001, Sections 4019, 4020, and 4021, as amended by Section 2, Chapter 374, O.S.L. 2002 (63 O.S. Supp. 2003, Section 4021), which relate to Oklahoma Vessel and Motor Registration Act; allowing a three-year registration of vessel or motor; providing for notice of three-year registration fees; and providing an effective date.

The above-numbered measures were read the first time.
