Second Regular Session of the Forty-ninth Legislature of the State of Oklahoma Sixty-first Legislative Day, Monday, May 17, 2004

WHEREAS, it has been poignantly stated over the years that "Good men must die, but death cannot kill their names."; and

WHEREAS, the name of Army 2nd Lieutenant Luke S. James, who lost his life on January 27, 2004, in an attack near Iskandariyah, Iraq, courageously defending his nation

and state, will always be remembered with pride and will never be forgotten by his loving family, friends, and comrades in arms; and

WHEREAS, Army 2nd Lieutenant Luke S. James, a 24-year-old native of Hooker, Oklahoma, and graduate of Oklahoma State University, always dreamed of serving in the United States Army and was, as told by family members, totally committed to protecting the freedoms for all the citizens of this great nation and state; and

WHEREAS, determined to fulfill his military dream, Army 2nd Lieutenant Luke S. James ultimately became an infantry platoon leader in the 2nd Battalion, 505th Infantry at Fort Bragg, North Carolina, which led him to his military duty and subsequent death in Iraq; and

WHEREAS, on February 10, 2004, at the Arlington National Cemetery in Arlington, Virginia, Army 2nd Lieutenant Luke S. James was laid to rest, commemorated by an army full honor funeral; and

WHEREAS, the honorable Army 2nd Lieutenant Luke S. James, recipient of the Purple Heart and the Bronze Star, left behind a beloved wife, Molly, and six-month-old son, Bradley Heath, devoted mother and father, Arleen and Bradley James, loving sister and brother, Karla and Kirby, and scores of friends, relatives and comrades in arms; and

WHEREAS, all who knew Army 2nd Lieutenant Luke S. James mourn his tragic death and will always remember the name of the man who heroically and courageously gave his life while serving his country and state; and

WHEREAS, it is fitting and proper to remember the name of Army 2nd Lieutenant Luke S. James, who gave his life to protect the precious freedoms held so dear by all Americans and Oklahomans.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE 2ND SESSION OF THE 49TH OKLAHOMA LEGISLATURE, THE SENATE CONCURRING THEREIN:
