FIRST READINGS

The following were introduced and read the first time:

An Act relating to professions and occupations; amending 59 O.S. 2001, Sections 698.2, as amended by Section 1, Chapter 172, O.S.L. 2002 and 698.12, as amended by Section 3, Chapter 172, O.S.L. 2002 (59 O.S. Supp. 2004, Sections 698.2 and 698.12),

which relate to the Oklahoma Veterinary Practice Act; adding definition; adding to acts not prohibited by the Oklahoma Veterinary Act; and providing an effective date.

SB 2 – By Kerr.

An Act relating to professions and occupations; amending 59 O.S. 2001, Section 46.3, which relates to the State Architectural Act; updating outline; modifying definition; and providing an effective date.

SB 3 – By Shurden.

An Act relating to the Oklahoma Ethics Commission; amending Rule 257:10-1-3 of the Rules of the Ethics Commission (74 O.S. 2001, Ch. 62, App.), which relates to prohibited acts; prohibiting production, printing, publication, broadcast, or other dissemination of certain inaccurate information; providing penalties; providing that certain actions be prima facie evidence of willful violation; and providing an effective date.

SB 4 – By Wilcoxson.

An Act relating to definitions and general provisions; making the selenite crystal the official state gem; providing for codification; and declaring an emergency.

SB 5 – By Corn.

An Act relating to state government; amending 74 O.S. 2001, Section 85.7a, which relates to the Oklahoma Central Purchasing Act; requiring Department of Central Services to include certain provisions in contracts for telephone call centers; defining term; and providing an effective date.

SB 6 – By Corn.

An Act relating to public finance; amending 62 O.S. 2001, Section 695.24, as amended by Section 2, Chapter 380, O.S.L. 2004 (62 O.S. Supp. 2004, Section 695.24), which relates to the Oklahoma Private Activity Bond Allocation Act; updating language; establishing manner in which allocation may be made; requiring specified portion of certain allocation for certain purpose; and providing an effective date.

SB 7 – By Capps and Kerr.

An Act relating to economic development; amending 68 O.S. 2001, Section 1370.7, as amended by Section 2, Chapter 336, O.S.L. 2003 (68 O.S. Supp. 2004, Section 1370.7), which relates to levy of certain sales tax; authorizing levy of sales tax for certain regional economic development projects; modifying provisions relating to sales tax levy for certain purposes; and providing an effective date.

SB 8 – By Wyrick.

An Act relating to state government; amending 74 O.S. 2001, Section 500.2, as amended by Section 11, Chapter 130, O.S.L. 2004 (74 O.S. Supp. 2004, Section 500.2), which relates to the State Travel Reimbursement Act; authorizing the Oklahoma Homeland Security Director and the State Commissioner of Health to enter into contracts and agreements for the payment of food, lodging and other authorized expenses associated with certain activities; and declaring an emergency.

SB 9 – By Wyrick.

An Act relating to the Oklahoma Homeland Security Act; amending Section 1, Chapter 157, O.S.L. 2004 (74 O.S. Supp. 2004, Section 51), which relates to the short title; clarifying statutory reference; clarifying language; and declaring an emergency.

SB 10 – By Corn.

An Act relating to the Oklahoma Homeland Security Act; amending Section 1, Chapter 157, O.S.L. 2004 (74 O.S. Supp. 2004, Section 51), which relates to the short title; clarifying statutory reference; clarifying language; and declaring an emergency.

SB 11 – By Wilcoxson.

An Act relating to motor vehicles; amending 47 O.S. 2001, Section 6-110.2, as amended by Section 1, Chapter 219, O.S.L. 2003 (47 O.S. Supp. 2004, Section 6-110.2), which relates to computerized finger imaging; making finger imaging on a driver license or identification card optional; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

SB 12 – By Wyrick.

An Act relating to officers; amending 51 O.S. 2001, Section 6, as last amended by Section 1, Chapter 51, O.S.L. 2004 (51 O.S. Supp. 2004, Section 6), which relates to officers and deputies not holding certain other offices; prohibiting a state office holder who is a reserve force deputy sheriff or reserve municipal police officer from holding more than one reserve commission; and providing an effective date.

SB 13 – By Wyrick.

An Act relating to officers; amending 51 O.S. 2001, Section 24A.8, which relates to the Oklahoma Open Records Act; providing for the release of copies of certain records by the Council on Law Enforcement Education and Training (C.L.E.E.T.) to law enforcement agencies; and declaring an emergency.

SB 14 – By Wyrick.

An Act relating to state officers and employees; amending Section 4, Chapter 157, O.S.L. 2004 (74 O.S. Supp. 2004, Section 51.3), which relates to the regional planning and coordination advisory councils for homeland security; adding a member; and providing an effective date.

SB 15 – By Corn.

An Act relating to public finance; creating the Anti-Crime Operation Program Act of 2005; providing short title; stating legislative findings; creating Anti-Crime Operation Program; establishing Anti-Crime Operation Program Projects Fund and providing procedures related thereto; providing for division of fund into certain accounts and specifying availability; prohibiting transfer of certain funds or access to more than one account; providing limitation on expenditures from accounts; allowing certain associations to obtain funding for certain projects and providing procedures; prohibiting certain expenditures and payments; providing that counties not be liable for certain actions; requiring governing boards of certain entities to develop fund use plan; requiring plan to be filed with State Auditor and Inspector and approved by certain vote; providing that

matching funds or equivalent value not be required; prohibiting use of funds for administrative expenses; specifying duties of State Auditor and Inspector; providing for disqualification of entities upon misuse of funds; providing penalties for violations; providing for initial planning expenditure payments; providing for manner and construction of expenditure of funds; providing for codification; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

SB 16 – By Corn.

An Act relating to revenue and taxation; amending 68 O.S. 2001, Section 2358, as last amended by Section 14, Chapter 322, O.S.L. 2004 (68 O.S. Supp. 2004, Section 2358), which relates to income tax; modifying standard deduction for individuals; and providing an effective date.

SB 17 – By Corn.

An Act relating to motor vehicles and revenue and taxation; amending 47 O.S. 2001, Section 1132, which relates to the Oklahoma Vehicle License and Registration Act; establishing specified vehicle registration fee for motor vehicles owned by individual with certain military disability; amending 68 O.S. 2001, Section 2105, which relates to vehicle excise tax; exempting motor vehicles owned by individual with certain military disability from payment of excise tax; and providing an effective date.

SB 18 – By Lawler of the Senate and Winchester of the House.

An Act relating to roads, bridges and ferries; designating a portion of State Highway 37 as the “Jason White PASSway”; directing the Department of Transportation to place suitable permanent markers on the highway bearing his name; providing for codification; and declaring an emergency.

SB 19 – By Lerblance.

An Act relating to mines and mining; amending 45 O.S. 2001, Section 729, which relates to the Mining Lands Reclamation Act; providing for certain violations reported by citizens' complaints to be kept confidential; requiring the Department of Mines to make certain detailed findings of fact and conclusions of law; authorizing Department to proceed with permit revocation or bond forfeiture under certain conditions; stating procedure for Department to proceed with certain work; authorizing Department to assess certain fine for violation; stating liability for certain entities; authorizing Department to seek certain civil action for relief in certain district courts; authorizing Department to recover certain penalties or fines for violations; providing for attorneys fees; requiring Department to deposit certain monies in certain fund; removing authorization and procedure for the Attorney General to institute certain damage proceedings; and declaring an emergency.

SB 20 – By Riley.

An Act relating to mines and mining; prohibiting approval of certain mining permits within certain distance of residential neighborhoods; directing the Oklahoma Mining Commission to promulgate rules establishing certain criteria; stating exceptions; providing for codification; and declaring an emergency.

SB 21 – By Lerblance.

An Act relating to mines and mining; amending 45 O.S. 2001, Section 9.1, which relates to mining with explosives; updating reference to certain agency; and declaring an emergency.

SB 22 – By Corn.

An Act relating to revenue and taxation; amending 68 O.S. 2001, Section 2358, as last amended by Section 14, Chapter 322, O.S.L. 2004 (68 O.S. Supp. 2004, Section 2358), which relates to income tax adjustments; exempting certain retirement benefits from taxable income; and providing an effective date.

SB 23 – By Laster.

An Act relating to the Council on Law Enforcement Education Training (C.L.E.E.T.); amending 20 O.S. 2001, Section 1313.2, as last amended by Section 1, Chapter 291, O.S.L. 2004 (20 O.S. Supp. 2004, Section 1313.2), which relates to the court fund; modifying provisions relating to waiver of certain late fees; modifying provisions relating to division of certain funds received from court clerks; amending 70 O.S. 2001, Section 3311.6, which relates to the C.L.E.E.T. Training Center Revolving Fund; authorizing certain additional sources of monies to be deposited into the fund; and providing an effective date.

SB 24 – By Jolley.

An Act relating to motor vehicles; amending 47 O.S. 2001, Sections 6-106, as last amended by Section 4, Chapter 390, O.S.L. 2004 and 6-111, as last amended by Section 4, Chapter 149, O.S.L. 2004 (47 O.S. Supp. 2004, Sections 6-106 and 6-111), which relate to application for driver licenses or identification cards; changing from a computer-generated number to an alphanumeric identification; and providing an effective date.

SB 25 – By Paddack.

An Act relating to motor vehicles; amending 47 O.S. 2001, Section 156, as amended by Section 13, Chapter 22, O.S.L. 2002 (47 O.S. Supp. 2004, Section 156), which relates to the purchase of vehicles or buses with public funds; authorizing the Council on Law Enforcement Education and Training to purchase passenger automobiles or buses; and declaring an emergency.

SB 26 – By Kerr.

An Act relating to state government; amending 74 O.S. 2001, Section 5064.4, which relates to the Inventors Assistance Act and purposes of the program; requiring the Oklahoma Center for the Advancement of Science and Technology (OCAST) to establish an annual Made in Oklahoma Trade Show; defining purpose; authorizing funding from specified sources; directing coordination with certain public entities and private organizations; and providing an effective date.

SB 27 – By Leftwich.

An Act relating to motor vehicles; providing for a fine and driver license suspension for death or great bodily injury resulting from failure to yield certain right-of-way; providing for codification; and declaring an emergency.

SB 28 – By Wyrick.

An Act relating to Homeland Security; amending 25 O.S. 2001, Section 304, which relates to the Oklahoma Open Meeting Act; exempting the Oklahoma Office of Homeland Security from provisions of the act; modifying outline form of definitions; amending 51 O.S. 2001, Section 24A.3, as last amended by Section 1, Chapter 328, O.S.L. 2004 (51 O.S. Supp. 2004, Section 24A.3), which relates to the Oklahoma Open Records Act; exempting the Oklahoma Office of Homeland Security from provisions of the act; modifying outline form of definitions; and declaring an emergency.

SB 29 – By Garrison.

An Act relating to counties and county officers; amending 19 O.S. 2001, Section 178.1, which relates to inventory; increasing cap on certain inventory; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

SB 30 – By Corn.

An Act relating to contracts; amending 15 O.S. 2001, Section 755.1, which relates to automatic dial announcing devices; prohibiting the use of automatic dialing announcing device for certain calls; updating outline; and providing an effective date.

SB 31 – By Capps.

An Act relating to revenue and taxation; amending 68 O.S. 2001, Section 1356, as last amended by Section 1, Chapter 384, O.S.L. 2004 (68 O.S. Supp. 2004, Section 1356), which relates to sales tax exemptions; exempting certain sales from sales tax; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

SB 32 – By Johnson.

An Act relating to revenue and taxation; amending 68 O.S. 2001, Section 2357.43 and 2358, as last amended by Section 14, Chapter 322, O.S.L. 2004 (68 O.S. Supp. 2004, Section 2358), which relate to income tax; eliminating earned income tax credit after specified date; increasing personal income tax exemption according to specified schedule; updating statutory references; and providing an effective date.

SB 33 – By Shurden.

An Act relating to professions and occupations; amending 59 O.S. 2001, Section 725.2, as amended by Section 5, Chapter 543, O.S.L. 2004 (59 O.S. Supp. 2004, Section 725.2), which relates to designation of certain physicians as first responders; defining basic disaster skills requirements for certification; and providing an effective date.

SB 34 – By Wilson.

An Act relating to roads, bridges and ferries; naming certain highway the “Senator Herb Rozell Highway”; requiring Department of Transportation to create certain permanent markers; providing for codification; and declaring an emergency.

SB 35 – By Gumm.

An Act relating to the Corporation Commission; providing certain marine fuel facilities shall be subject to certain laws or rules; providing for codification; and declaring an emergency.

SB 36 – By Garrison.

An Act relating to counties and county officers; amending 19 O.S. 2001, Sections 180.65 and 180.81, which relate to deputies; modifying cap on certain deputies salaries; deleting reference to safety director or coordinator; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

SB 37 – By Barrington.

An Act relating to insurance; amending 36 O.S. 2001, Section 2801, as amended by Section 1, Chapter 21, O.S.L. 2004 (36 O.S. Supp. 2004, Section 2801), which relates to organization and assessments; modifying towns eligible to associate for certain purposes; and providing an effective date.

SB 38 – By Coffee.

An Act relating to elections; amending 26 O.S. 2001, Sections 1-102, as amended by Section 2, Chapter 162, O.S.L. 2003, and 1-104 (26 O.S. Supp. 2004, Section 1-102), which relate to primary elections; making elections for county officers nonpartisan elections; providing for designation of nomination and election of county officers; providing that no runoff primary elections shall be held for election of county officers; amending 26 O.S. 2001, Sections 5-105, as amended by Section 7, Chapter 53, O.S.L. 2004, 8-101, 12-111, as amended by Section 12, Chapter 447, O.S.L. 2002, 12-113, as last amended by Section 5, Chapter 369, O.S.L. 2004, and 12-114 (26 O.S. Supp. 2004, Sections 5-105, 12-111, and 12-113), which relate to candidates for nomination of office, certification and contest of nominees, and vacancies in certain county office; stating certain parameters for filing for office; removing references to county Runoff Primary Elections; stating conditions for winning election; amending 51 O.S. 2001, Section 10, which relates to vacancies in state and county offices; removing references to partisan election and to runoff primary elections; providing for codification; and providing an effective date.

SB 39 – By Gumm.

An Act relating to workers' compensation; requiring certain reports be confidential for certain time period; stating exceptions; providing punishment; prohibiting certain examination of specific record; authorizing certain oath; making certain act a misdemeanor; defining term; providing for codification; and providing an effective date.

SB 40 – By Capps.

An Act relating to property; amending 60 O.S. 2001, Section 178.4, as amended by Section 4, Chapter 386, O.S.L. 2003 (60 O.S. Supp. 2004, Section 178.4), which relates to trust purpose; correcting punctuation error; authorizing financing of retail outlets in certain counties; defining eligible retail outlets; and providing an effective date.

SB 41 – By Wilcoxson.

An Act relating to environment and natural resources; amending 27A O.S. 2001, Section 2-10-802, which relates to solid waste disposal sites; updating reference; modifying amount of penalty for certain late reports; and providing an effective date.

SB 42 – By Brogdon.

An Act relating to the Public Competitive Bidding Act of 1974, amending 61 O.S. 2001, Section 113, as last amended by Section 1, Chapter 299, O.S.L. 2004 (61 O.S. Supp. 2004, Section 113), which relates to execution of contracts; specifying certain requirements for employees of contractors awarded public contracts; and providing an effective date.

SB 43 – By Corn.

An Act relating to the Oklahoma State Bureau of Narcotics and Dangerous Drugs Control; setting forth annual salary schedule for certain positions; providing for additional compensation; providing that certain provisions not be applicable to salaries set forth herein; providing for codification; providing for noncodification; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

SB 44 – By Lawler.

An Act relating to revenue and taxation; amending 68 O.S. 2001, Sections 1365, as last amended by Section 11, Chapter 535, O.S.L. 2004, 1367.1, as last amended by Section 73, Chapter 5, O.S.L. 2004 and 1405, as last amended by Section 77, Chapter 5, O.S.L. 2004 (68 O.S. Supp. 2004, Sections 1365, 1367.1 and 1405), which relate to sales and use taxes; providing exception from certain requirements for sales tax remitters; requiring the Oklahoma Tax Commission to grant certain requests; modifying percentage deduction for certain sales tax remitters; providing exception from certain requirements for use tax vendors; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

SB 45 – By Hobson.

An Act relating to state government; amending 74 O.S. 2001, Section 150.5, as amended by Section 1, Chapter 77, O.S.L. 2002 (74 O.S. Supp. 2004, Section 150.5), which relates to investigations conducted by the Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation; requiring special background investigation of nominee to Oklahoma Lottery Commission under certain circumstances; modifying statutory reference; and declaring an emergency.

SB 46 – By Riley.

An Act relating to revenue and taxation; amending 68 O.S. 2001, Section 2358, as amended by Section 14, Chapter 322, O.S.L. 2004 (68 O.S. Supp. 2004, Section 2358), which relates to income tax adjustments; modifying amount of salary or compensation received as a member of Armed Forces of United States that may be deducted from taxable income; specifying tax years for which increased deduction allowed; and providing an effective date.

SB 47 – By Riley.

An Act relating to oil and gas; amending Section 1, Chapter 361, O.S.L. 2003 (52 O.S. Supp. 2004, Section 318.10), which relates to restriction on location of habitable structures; providing exemption; and declaring an emergency.

SB 48 – By Eason McIntyre.

An Act relating to definitions and general provisions; amending 25 O.S. 2001, Section 304, which relates to definitions used in the Open Meeting Act; excepting certain bodies from definition; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency .

SB 49 – By Cain.

An Act relating to public health and safety; amending 63 O.S. 2001, Section 1-1914.2, as amended by Section 8, Chapter 230, O.S.L. 2002 (63 O.S. Supp. 2004, Section 1-1914.2), which relates to long-term care facility temporary managers; establishing time frames related to certain appeal; clarifying sources of facility funds; specifying action that constitutes a breach of fiduciary duty and violation of law; requiring establishment of certain fund for specified purpose; clarifying language; delineating contents of complete accounting; providing for and limiting extension of certain rendition; establishing criteria and consequences for failure to comply with provisions; providing for filing of order of disgorgement or remittance and prohibiting specified discharge; providing for recovery of monies or other thing of value pursuant to certain event; providing for awarding of certain costs; specifying liability; and providing an effective date.

SB 50 – By Johnson.

An Act relating to schools; providing definitions; authorizing creation of secondary school building authorities; stating function of certain authorities; stating purpose; providing procedure for creating certain authority; providing for election of trustees; prescribing election procedures; providing for election of officers; providing for selection of chief executive officer and treasurer of trust; naming beneficiaries; making certain laws applicable to certain authority; authorizing authority to propose question on indebtedness to certain school district electors; requiring certain information be contained in proposal; requiring certain election to be held at certain time; providing for special election upon certain resolutions; requiring districts to issue bonds to meet certain obligations; requiring certain proceeds to be paid to certain authority; requiring certain authority to construct certain facilities; requiring certain lease of facilities to certain independent district; requiring shares of sale or lease of certain facilities to be apportioned among certain school districts; stating limit of indebtedness for certain projects; providing formula to establish and limit number of levies authorized on certain property; clarifying that certain act shall not be construed as annexing or consolidating any district; providing for codification; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

SB 51 – By Johnson.

An Act relating to public employment; repealing Sections 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, 11, 12, 13, 14, 15, 16, 17, 18, 19, 20 and 21, Chapter 62, O.S.L, 2004 (11 O.S. Supp. 2004, Sections 51-200, 51-201, 51-202, 51-203, 51-204, 51-205, 51-206, 51-207, 51-208, 51-209, 51-210, 51-211, 51-212, 51-213, 51-214, 51-215, 51-216, 51-217, 51-218, 51-219 and 51-

220), which relate to the Oklahoma Municipal Employee Collective Bargaining Act; and declaring an emergency.

SB 52 – By Garrison.

An Act relating to counties and county officers; authorizing the board of county commissioners to determine an animal nuisance law; stating parameters of the animal nuisance law; specifying rules and regulations for the impounding of animals; requiring sheriff to investigate animal nuisance reports; authorizing sheriff to issue citations; providing for destruction of certain animals; setting fine; providing for codification; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

SB 53 – By Capps.

An Act relating to the Oklahoma Aeronautics Commission; amending 3 O.S. 2001, Section 85, as amended by Section 56, Chapter 329, O.S.L. 2003 (3 O.S. Supp. 2004, Section 85), which relates to the powers and duties of the Commission; eliminating exemption for certain Commission responsibilities relating to certain funds and monies for reliever airports; exempting Oklahoma Space Industry Development Authority airports from jurisdiction of the Commission for certain activities; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

SB 54 – By Lerblance.

An Act relating to waters and water rights; stating public policy encouraging water providers to use local contracts or joint cooperative agreements to allocate customers, territory, revenue or other aspects when providing water, sewer, gas or solid waste services; authorizing rural water districts to enter into certain contracts or joint cooperative agreements with municipalities or certain public trusts; providing for codification; and declaring an emergency.

SB 55 – By Morgan and Crutchfield of the Senate and Benge and Newport of the House.

An Act relating to the Oklahoma Arts Council; making an appropriation to the Oklahoma Arts Council; stating purpose; requiring budgeting in certain categories and amounts; requiring certain performance measures; providing for duties and compensation of employees; limiting salary of the Executive Director; providing budgetary limitations; and providing an effective date.

SB 56 – By Morgan and Crutchfield of the Senate and Benge and Newport of the House.

An Act relating to the Oklahoma Arts Council; requiring budgeting in certain categories and amounts; requiring certain performance measures; providing for duties and compensation of employees; limiting salary of the Executive Director; providing budgetary limitations; and providing an effective date.

SB 57 – By Morgan and Crutchfield of the Senate and Bengé and Newport of the House.

A Joint Resolution recognizing the flag of the former Republic of Vietnam as the official flag of the Vietnamese-American community in the State of Oklahoma; and directing distribution.

SJR 21 – By Laster.

A Joint Resolution directing the Secretary of State to refer to the people for their approval or rejection a proposed amendment to Section 26 of Article X of the Oklahoma Constitution; allowing school districts to propose certain enabling question to voters of the district; allowing certain school districts to incur indebtedness upon majority vote if enabled by voters of district; allowing voters of school district to rescind approval of enabling proposal upon petition by certain number of voters or upon proposal by school district board of education; deleting obsolete language; providing ballot title; and directing filing.

SJR 22 – By Laughlin.

A Joint Resolution directing the Secretary of State to refer to the people for their approval or rejection a proposed amendment to Section 35 of Article II of the Constitution of the State of Oklahoma; prohibiting civil unions; prohibiting recognition of certain civil unions; providing ballot title; and directing filing.

SJR 23 – By Corn.

A Joint Resolution directing the Secretary of State to refer to the people for their approval or rejection a proposed amendment to the Oklahoma Constitution by adding a new section to Article XXVIII to be designated as Section 4.1 and by amending Sections 6, 7 and 10 of Article XXVIII; providing for the sale of salvage alcoholic beverages in certain

retail salvage package stores; limiting sales to cities and towns with certain population; requiring certain sales to be below original prices; allowing acquisition of certain alcoholic beverages from certain entities; prohibiting certain sales and service on certain premises; defining term; providing for separation of certain premises from certain sales or services; limiting the issuance of certain license; authorizing the Legislature to enact certain laws; prohibiting certain stores from selling certain alcoholic beverages on certain days; making the sale of certain alcoholic beverages subject to certain tax laws; providing for collection and distribution of certain taxes; restricting the issuance of certain licenses; providing ballot title; and directing filing.

SJR 25 – By Brogdon.

A Joint Resolution directing the Secretary of State to refer to the people for their approval or rejection a proposed amendment to Section 23 of Article X of the Constitution of the State of Oklahoma; updating reference; modifying purpose for specified procedures; modifying specified duty of State Board for Equalization; requiring Board to certify tax expenditure limitation; specifying formula for limitation; making requirement to certify limitation conditional; providing for spending limit; prescribing determination of spending limit under certain circumstances; deleting certain funds from specified estimate; deleting percentage limit on change in legislative appropriations; modifying duty of Board with respect to determination of revenue available for appropriation; clarifying status of certain funds as surplus funds and providing for surplus funds amount under specified circumstances; renaming Constitutional Reserve Fund as Constitutional Emergency Fund; modifying amounts accruing to such fund; providing for the status of interest income; providing for conditional appropriation from such fund; defining term; deleting authority for appropriations under specified conditions; providing for deposit of specified monies into Budget Stabilization Fund; providing for status of interest income; establishing conditions under which revenue failure occurs; providing for transfer of funds upon revenue failure and limiting amount thereof; providing for taxpayer refund of certain funds; requiring Legislative enactment; requiring voter approval for certification of appropriations above specified limit; providing ballot title; and directing filing.

SJR 26 – By Reynolds.

A Joint Resolution directing the Secretary of State to refer to the people for their approval or rejection a proposed amendment to Section 8C of Article X of the Oklahoma Constitution; updating references; establishing a date after which new eligibility applies; providing eligibility for application of specified procedure in determining fair cash value of certain homesteads; defining term and method of determining eligibility; providing procedures for modifying fair cash value of homestead under specified conditions; providing ballot title; and directing filing.

SJR 27 – By Leftwich.

A Joint Resolution directing the Secretary of State to refer to the people for their approval or rejection a proposed amendment to Section 8B of Article X of the Constitution of the State of Oklahoma; limiting increases in fair cash value of property upon which homestead exemption has been claimed to three percent per year; deleting obsolete language; authorizing counties to suspend such limit; providing procedures for such suspension and for rescinding such suspension; providing ballot title; and directing filing.

SJR 28 – By Wilcoxson.

A Joint Resolution directing the Secretary of State to refer to the people for their approval or rejection proposed amendments to Sections 1, 3 and 4 of Article VI of the Constitution of the State of Oklahoma; providing for Gubernatorial appointment of Superintendent of Public Instruction with consent of Senate; providing for length of term; making term concurrent with term of Governor; removing eligibility requirements for Superintendent of Public Instruction; removing prescribed term for Superintendent of Public Instruction; providing an effective date; providing ballot title; ordering a special election; and directing filing.

SJR 29 – By Jolley.

A Joint Resolution directing the Secretary of State to refer to the people for their approval or rejection the repeal of Section 2 of Article XXVIII of the Constitution of the State of Oklahoma, which relates to the exclusion of beer or cereal malt beverages containing not more than 3.2% of alcohol by weight from certain laws; providing ballot title; and directing filing.

SJR 30 – By Monson.

A Joint Resolution directing the Secretary of State to refer to the people for their approval or rejection a proposed amendment to the Oklahoma Constitution by adding a new section to Article X to be designated as Section 10C; authorizing property tax millage for municipal fire districts; providing ballot title; and directing filing.

SJR 31 – By Gumm.

A Joint Resolution directing the Secretary of State to refer to the people for their approval or rejection a proposed amendment to Section 23 of Article X of the Oklahoma Constitution; clarifying references; providing ballot title; and directing filing.

SCR 1 – By Brogdon.

A Concurrent Resolution urging the President of the United States and Congress to take certain steps to secure the nation's borders and adequately fund and equip certain entities; and directing distribution.

SCR 2 – By Brogdon.

A Concurrent Resolution memorializing the President of the United States and the United States Congress to take immediate measures to withdraw the membership of the United States of America from the United Nations; and directing distribution.

SCR 3 – By Rabon.

A Concurrent Resolution designating *Acrocanthosaurus atokensis* as the State Dinosaur of Oklahoma; and directing distribution.

SCR 4 – By Mazzei.

A Concurrent Resolution resolving the Oklahoma State Legislature to contain and liquidate the unfunded actuarially accrued liabilities of the Teachers' Retirement System of Oklahoma; and directing distribution.

JOINT SESSION

The Second Joint Session of the First Regular Session of the Fiftieth Legislature was called to order by the President of the Senate, Lieutenant Governor Mary Fallin.

Senator Fisher moved that the attendance roll call of the Senate be considered the attendance roll call of the Senate in Joint Session, which motion was declared adopted.

Representative Cargill moved that the attendance roll call of the House of Representatives be considered the attendance roll call of the House in Joint Session, which motion was declared adopted.

President Fallin declared quorums of the Senate and House present and Joint Session duly assembled.

The invocation was offered by Reverend Trace Morgan, First Baptist Church of Stillwater.

Senator Fisher moved that the President and Speaker appoint a committee of members from the Senate and House of Representatives, respectively, as a Joint Committee to notify Governor Brad Henry that the Second Joint Session of the Fiftieth Legislature is now in

Joint Session and ready to receive him and hear his message, which motion was declared adopted.

President Fallin appointed for the Senate the following: Senators Coates, Monson, Bass and Wyrick.

Speaker Hiatt appointed for the House of Representatives the following: Representatives Calvey, Shoemaker and Billy.

President Fallin recognized Sergeant at Arms, Bob Craig, who announced the arrival of the Honorable Brad Henry, Governor of the State of Oklahoma.

Governor Henry was escorted to the Speaker's rostrum by the Joint Committee and presented to the Joint Session by President Fallin where he delivered his message.

MESSAGE OF GOVERNOR BRAD HENRY

Members of the House and Senate, Honorable Justices of the Supreme Court, Lt. Governor Fallin, Speaker Hiatt, President Pro Tem Hobson, distinguished Cabinet and elected officials, honored guests and my fellow Oklahomans and friends:

Our Heritage of Values

In two months, our state -- our nation, in fact -- will observe the anniversary of one of the most tragic episodes in American history. April 19th will mark the 10-year anniversary of the massive bomb that tore through Oklahoma City's Murrah Building. One hundred and sixty eight of our friends and neighbors lost their lives. Hundreds more were seriously injured.

And yet the legacy of that dark day is one of compassion and decency and goodness. In the weeks and months that followed, Oklahomans demonstrated the caliber of our people. Something called "the Oklahoma Standard" became known throughout the world. It means resilience in the face of adversity. It means a strength and compassion that will not be defeated.

Most of all, it means coming together as a family, the family that is Oklahoma.

The Oklahoma Family

That legacy -- the Oklahoma Family -- is worth remembering today as we embark on a historic legislative session.

Family is woven deeply into the tapestry of Oklahoma. Families are the compass that guide us. They are the inspiration to reach great heights, and our comfort when we occasionally falter.

Like most Oklahomans, I was raised with a deep and abiding appreciation for, and love of, family. My parents, sadly, are no longer with us, but their spirit lives on in what they taught me about being a husband and a father. I am blessed to have three wonderful daughters. I am so proud of them, and they are here today to see how their dad does – Leah, Laynie and Baylee.

And allow me also to introduce my wonderful wife – my best friend and closest education advisor – a graceful, gracious and incredibly poised First Lady, my wife, Kim Henry.

The collective unity of the Oklahoma Family has led us to make tremendous strides forward these past two years, from progress in education to economic development and job creation, from building a better health care system to ensuring public safety. As stewards of state government, we have a moral responsibility to continue working together and moving our state forward.

The mission is simple, but monumentally important.

We must give Oklahoma families the opportunity to thrive and prosper. We must give Oklahoma children the ability to reach their potential. We must give our respected senior citizens access to world-class health care. We must give all Oklahomans the tools necessary to pursue the American dream. And then, we must get out of the way.

I can report to you today that the State of the State of Oklahoma is strong and getting stronger, and positioned for greatness.

We have the will and the commitment. We have the momentum. And now we must build on that momentum.

The Road to Now

It has been a challenging journey. When I became your governor two years ago, Oklahoma faced the worst funding crisis in the history of our state, a budget hole of nearly \$700 million. It was a bleak time. Businesses struggled to make ends meet. Far too many Oklahomans were without work and having difficulty finding a job. Schools from Sayre to Stilwell braced themselves for disastrous cuts.

But I reached out to both political parties and asked you to put aside your differences and put Oklahoma first. Together, we made the difficult decisions and emerged from the crisis without raising taxes – and yet we still managed to protect education and health care from catastrophic cuts. We worked together for the sake of Oklahoma and demonstrated that, together, there is no obstacle too daunting, no goal too ambitious.

We didn't simply pay lip service to fiscal responsibility; we walked the walk. We enacted zero-based budgeting to make sure every dollar is well-spent. We placed restrictions on the Rainy Day Fund to safeguard it for true emergencies. And we did both while still raising pay for our hard-working state employees.

And we funded education first.

Since taking office, I have labored each day to give every Oklahoma child the opportunities and advantages of a great education. Legislators on both sides of the aisle have joined me in the pursuit of educational excellence, and I applaud each of you for your commitment.

No other investment yields as great a return as the investment in education. An educated workforce is the foundation of every community and the future of every economy.

But it is vital we remember that education is more than economic development. Education is not solely about earning a great living. It means living a great life.

We have focused on the single most important factor in education, the quality of instruction. And that meant long-overdue help for Oklahoma's dedicated, hard-working – and historically underpaid – teachers.

Our schools are full of great teachers. I've met them, I've talked to them – I even married one. But our teachers are the worst-paid in our region and consistently among the worst-paid in the nation.

No longer will we allow that travesty.

Together we embarked on a plan to raise our teacher salaries to the regional average, and we strengthened classroom instruction by restoring mentoring programs and promoting National Board Certification.

We built upon the promise of early childhood education, so much so that our preschools are now hailed as the best in the nation. For that, we are indebted to the many champions of early childhood education, a group that ranges from one of our most visionary businessmen and philanthropists, George Kaiser, to my personal favorite preschool advocate, Kim Henry.

In November, I kept a campaign pledge when voters overwhelmingly approved an education lottery and tribal gaming regulation act, the first new revenue streams for our schools in more than 15 years.

To get it done, we entered a new era of cooperation with our great tribal nations for the benefit of all Oklahomans. And, we learned we can accomplish so much more by working together.

Higher education is also vitally important to our state, and here, too, we have made significant progress. We ensured full funding for college scholarships, expanded research opportunities, and finally funded a backlogged endowed chair program.

But an educated Oklahoma is meaningless if it is not also a healthy Oklahoma. Our new Premium Assistance Program will help our small businesses and provide health insurance for thousands of uninsured Oklahoma families.

We also corrected a glaring discrepancy to ensure that Medicaid covers the cost of screening for breast and cervical cancer. We secured funding for our state trauma care system, and we finally committed to building a world-class cancer research center right here in Oklahoma.

And I am proud that we finally brought help to the families of beleaguered Tar Creek. We implemented a voluntary relocation assistance program to help families with small children escape this lead poisoning nightmare.

We dealt with another kind of poison, too, by delivering a powerful blow against the scourge of methamphetamine. As a result of our tightened restrictions on a key ingredient of that insidious drug, meth lab seizures have dropped by as much as 70 percent. No wonder other states are clamoring to duplicate our actions in battling this vicious threat to Oklahoma families.

Drug addiction is not someone else's problem. It is every Oklahoman's problem. That's why we expanded our drug court program, which succeeds not only in being tough on crime, but also in being smart on crime. I commend the advocates of drug courts for their efforts to expand this worthwhile program, people like Oklahoma County District Attorney Wes Lane.

In the arena of economic development, we have witnessed many successes these past two years. Dell, Quad Graphics, American Airlines, Vanguard, Cardinal Glass and Tracker Marine are only a few of the companies that either came to Oklahoma or expanded operations here to create thousands of good-paying jobs.

We also enacted serious, long-term tax relief. We permanently reduced the income tax rate, eliminated capital gains taxes on Oklahoma-based property and investment, and lowered taxes on our retirees. As a result, we bolstered economic growth, provided needed help for hard-working citizens and breathed new life into our state's entrepreneurial spirit.

Building on Momentum

We have accomplished so much for Oklahoma families – in education and health care, jobs and public safety – that it's easy to forget just how daunting the situation was when we first began. But our work is far from over. Challenges remain. And so, undeterred, we must build on the momentum of these past two years and push ahead.

Proverbs 29:18 tells us that “where there is no vision, the people perish.” I believe that to be true. This is no time for timid dreams. Oklahomans expect us to devote the same imagination, hard work and resolve that they employ every day of their lives.

Operation Homefront

That resolve is ingrained in Oklahomans. For proof, you need only look to our brave men and women serving in our armed forces. During the height of the Iraq War, Oklahoma’s National Guard led the nation in its percentage of mobilized forces.

Among those Guardsmen is Captain Scott Houck, a 14-year veteran of the Oklahoma Guard. Captain Houck recently returned home after serving nearly a year-long tour of duty in Afghanistan. He earned many decorations – including the Bronze Star. I know his wife Kimberly Ann and their 13-month-old daughter, Kaelyn, are happy to have him back home. Please join me in honoring Scott and Kimberly Ann Houck, who are here representing Oklahoma’s dedicated and selfless Guardsmen and their families.

Scott Houck is typical of how our Army and Air National Guard have made an extraordinary commitment for our state and nation. And so it is time we make an extraordinary commitment to our Guard and their families.

Under “Operation Homefront,” the State of Oklahoma will provide a tax exemption for military pension income for all veterans and purchase a \$250,000 life insurance policy for every Guardsman. In addition, we will establish the Military Family Relief Fund and give all Oklahomans an opportunity to donate to Guard families who need the help most. We honor their sacrifice, and it’s high time we honor their families, too.

Achieving Classroom Excellence (ACE)

We are making important inroads in education. While there is no shortcut to prosperity, we do know the road to prosperity invariably begins in the classroom.

That is why we have committed so much to paving that road through increased teacher salaries, strengthened classroom instruction and, of course, new revenue sources to pump millions of additional dollars into our classrooms. Now we must pass and implement the Achieving Classroom Excellence or ACE initiative.

Last year we made a promise to our teachers. We pledged to pay 100 percent of their health insurance premiums, and we did. But, we also pledged that Oklahoma would no longer tolerate shamefully low wages while other states tried to lure our great teachers away.

This year, we must honor our commitment and stay the course. Oklahomans went to the polls and championed our schools. Now Oklahoma leaders must champion our teachers.

A rock-solid education also means the expectation of excellence. It means lifting up our children so they can see the horizon of possibilities that stretches before them. It is only through raising expectations and striving for excellence that our children can reach their full potential.

The education reforms I bring before you this session have a clear and vital aim: To make sure our children learn what they need to learn in our schools. We will identify students' needs and ensure they get the tools that will enable them to achieve excellence.

We will expand full-day kindergarten so our youngest generation can begin that journey to excellence.

In our middle schools, we will improve lagging math scores by providing additional training for math teachers and computer labs for students. And, we will require meaningful 8th-grade testing, with resources and help for students who need it, to ensure every student demonstrates the skills and knowledge necessary for future success.

In our high schools, we will promote a college-bound curriculum and phase in end-of-course testing that demands results from our students. We'll require three years of high school math, and we'll make the senior year count by encouraging more of our students attend college. We will do that by offering to pay full tuition costs for up to six hours of college credit per semester for our high school seniors.

We will also employ additional performance reviews to guarantee more education dollars get to the classroom and we get the biggest bang for our education buck. And, we must also continue to fully fund scholarships so every student can attend college.

It is within our reach to make Oklahoma schools the best in the nation, and now is the time to build on our momentum.

Higher Education Capital Bond Issue

That same commitment extends to our colleges and universities. First, the good news about higher education: Oklahoma college enrollment is at an all-time high.

Now for the not-so-good news: We're running out of room.

But help is close at hand. No longer can we abide overcrowded facilities, crumbling classrooms, obsolete equipment or deteriorating research labs. I urge this Legislature to join me in passing a \$500-million capital bond issue for higher education – and to do it quickly while interest rates are low.

This bond issue is important for strengthening our colleges and universities. But, it's absolutely critical for the economic growth and vitality of Oklahoma.

With more than 140 construction projects in 36 communities across our state, this economic injection will have an immediate impact of nearly \$740 million and the creation of more than 4,000 construction jobs. But, more important, the economic reverberations of higher education will be felt for generations to come.

Job Creation

Once we pass this bond issue, we should build upon our economic momentum to further fuel business growth. This year, let's pass the rest of the tort reform package I brought before you last session.

We have implemented commonsense reforms to cut costs and curb frivolous lawsuits. In fact, medical malpractice cases have dropped dramatically since we enacted reforms – by more than 60 percent in some areas. But, as I said last year, there is still more to do.

Last year, I also empanelled a bipartisan task force of experts to examine the most effective workers' compensation systems in the nation to determine what works best. That report is in, and the time to act is now. I urge you to pass the comprehensive reforms recommended by that task force so we can reduce costs, help businesses and ensure fair compensation for injured workers.

Oklahoma Growth and Taxpayer Fairness Act

Fairness is a core Oklahoma value, and it must be our guide when it comes to the rights of our taxpayers. This session, I ask you to enact the Oklahoma Growth and Taxpayer Fairness Act.

Under my proposal, whenever the Rainy Day Fund is full, half of any excess funds will be returned to those who most deserve it, the taxpayers of Oklahoma. It is projected that, this year alone, taxpayers could receive a rebate of up to \$100 million.

The other half of the excess funds should be invested in our future. These funds would help build the \$1-billion EDGE research endowment to truly transform Oklahoma into the "Research Capital of the Plains."

This proposal, crafted by visionary Oklahoma business leaders like Larry Nichols, Jim Everest, Gene Rainbolt and Robert Lorton, was a key recommendation of our EDGE initiative. As we have seen from the incredible successes of OCAST, dollars invested in research and technology are dollars invested in job growth and prosperity. In fact, for every dollar we invest in research, we get 12 dollars in return. That's a 1,200 percent return on our investment.

This proposal also ensures fairness in our tax code through other commonsense measures. We will finish the job we started last year by eliminating the corporate capital gains tax on Oklahoma-based property. We will give collateral heirs the same exemption

we give lineal heirs for estate tax purposes. We will continue to lower taxes on our retirees and make Oklahoma more attractive for our citizens facing retirement. And, we will establish an annual sales tax holiday so our families will buy their back-to-school items here in Oklahoma.

Including the rebate, this tax-relief and investment package totals more than \$263 million – and that’s money back in taxpayers’ pockets. This is something we can all agree on, and Mr. Speaker, I sincerely appreciate your endorsement.

Prescription for Savings

Our state must also confront another financial concern plaguing many families. We are all aware of the skyrocketing costs of prescription drugs – especially our seniors, many of whom face impossible choices between purchasing food or needed medication.

Some people would have you believe we don’t have a say in the matter. I disagree. We must challenge the system, even if it means taking on the federal government and the big pharmaceutical companies. The status quo is simply unacceptable.

It is vital that we ensure affordable prescription drugs for all Oklahomans. Growing numbers of states are reimporting such drugs from Canada and other industrialized nations, and for good reason. They are the same medicines, same exact brands, same effectiveness.

There’s only one difference, but it’s a big one: reimported drugs are more affordable.

With our prescription for a healthy Oklahoma, we will help Oklahomans purchase cheaper medications by facilitating the reimportation of prescription drugs from other industrialized nations. And we’ll do it through collaboration with Oklahoma pharmacies and supplying help through an Internet Web site.

In addition, I propose the creation of SmartCards that will enable Oklahomans to purchase their prescriptions from Oklahoma pharmacies at significant discounts without the mounds of paperwork and bureaucratic red tape.

Make no mistake: Out-of-control prescription drug costs are unconscionable, and we must find a remedy. The worst thing we can do is to do nothing.

Healthy Oklahoma

The same is true for Oklahoma nursing homes. I have proposed a reform package to ensure high quality care for seniors and peace of mind for their loved ones.

As we address the health needs of our parents and grandparents, we must not neglect the physical fitness of other Oklahomans. To encourage a healthier state, I will launch a

comprehensive wellness campaign in April. This public-private partnership will promote healthier lifestyles and a more fit Oklahoma.

Strengthen Anti-Methamphetamine Law

One of the major roadblocks to a healthier Oklahoma is substance abuse, especially the epidemic of methamphetamine. We have the toughest anti-meth law in the nation, but there is more work to do. We must strengthen our efforts by creating a permanent state database to link pharmacies and prevent circumvention of the law.

Beyond that, I will continue to urge my fellow governors to pursue similar legislation to cut down on meth ingredients being smuggled into Oklahoma from other states. I'm also working with Congressmen Tom Cole and Dan Boren to push for tough restrictions on the federal level. We must remain vigilant in our defense of the families torn apart by this deadly drug.

Our Task

Today is the first day of the first session of the 50th Oklahoma Legislature. It is the final Legislature of Oklahoma's first century. We have before us a historic opportunity – an opportunity to lay the groundwork for a second century of statehood that will propel Oklahoma and the Oklahoma Family to new heights.

My administration has demonstrated that we do more than preach bipartisanship. We practice it. And I urge all of you gathered here today to make a similar pledge to that spirit of unity. The election is over, and with it we must set aside the divisiveness and polarization that fuel campaigns but foil good government.

If ever there was a time for true bipartisanship, it is today.

All of us in this chamber were elected so that we may govern with purpose. We cannot govern for the purpose of being elected.

The pundits and political observers say Americans have never been more divided than they are today. They speak in terms of what supposedly separates us – red state or blue state, rich or poor, black or white – and on it goes.

But I don't believe we are defined by our differences, and I don't think most Oklahomans do, either. Simply put, we are more alike than we are different.

There is too much at stake for us to surrender to the politics of polarization. What unites Oklahomans today is what has always united us: Our unshakable faith. Our love of family and compassion for others. The unlimited promise of a hopeful future.

We cannot and will not lose the momentum we have created. So much that we have accomplished to date – in education and job growth, health care and public safety – is meaningless if we close our eyes to the vision that can unite us.

We all understand and appreciate the importance of family and the steadfast legacy of the Oklahoma Family. We – all of us in this chamber today – are a microcosm of the Oklahoma Family. And we must never forget that as we embark on this historic legislative session.
