Advising passage of and transmitting for consideration Engrossed **HCR 1001**.

HCR 1001 – By Wright, Winchester and DeWitt of the House and Justice of the Senate.

A Concurrent Resolution relating to rules of the Oklahoma Department of Agriculture, Food, and Forestry; waiving the thirty-legislative-day review period for proposed amendments to permanent rules OAC 35:30-29-22, 35:30-29-37 and 35:30-29-51, which relate to sale and storage of fertilizer; waiving the thirty-legislative-day review period for proposed new rule OAC 35:30-29-37.1, which relates to ammonium nitrate security; and directing distribution.

The above-numbered measure was read the first time.
