First Extraordinary Session of the Fiftieth Legislature of the State of Oklahoma

Sixth Legislative Day, Wednesday, August 31, 2005

The Senate was called to order by Senator Gumm.

Senator Gumm declared a quorum present.

The prayer was offered by the Most Reverend Archbishop Eusebius J. Beltran, Archdiocese of Oklahoma City, the guest of Senator Johnson.

UNANIMOUS CONSENT REQUEST DIRECT TO CALENDAR

Senator Johnson asked unanimous consent to suspend Rule 5-4 and refer **SR 2X** direct to the Calendar for consideration, which was the order.

GENERAL ORDER

SR 2X by Johnson was called up for consideration.

All other members of the Senate asked to coauthor **SR 2X**, which was the order.

SR 2X was adopted upon motion of Senator Johnson and referred for enrollment.

**UNANIMOUS CONSENT REQUEST
DIRECT TO CALENDAR**

Senator Cain asked unanimous consent to suspend Rule 5-4 and refer **SR 1X** direct to the Calendar for consideration, which was the order.

GENERAL ORDER

SR 1X by Cain was called up for consideration.

All other members of the Senate asked to coauthor **SR 1X**, which was the order.

SR 1X was adopted upon motion of Senator Cain and referred for enrollment.

GENERAL ORDER

SB 4X by Crutchfield of the Senate and Benge and Newport of the House was called up for consideration.

Senator Corn moved to amend **SB 4X**, by striking the title, the enacting clause and the entire body of the bill and substituting the floor substitute, which amendment was declared adopted. (Copies were provided for all Senators.)

Senator Coffee made a personal point that he is not a member of the Appropriations Subcommittee on Public Safety and Judiciary.

Senator Corn moved that **SB 4X** be advanced, which motion was declared adopted.

THIRD READING

SB 4X was read for the third time at length.

UNANIMOUS CONSENT REQUEST

Senator Fisher asked unanimous consent, which was granted, to amend previously adopted **SR 2X**, Page 1, Line 15, by deleting the word “created” and inserting in lieu thereof the word “established”, and Page 1, Line 25, by inserting after the word “the” and before the word “Pastoral” the word “Catholic”.

GENERAL ORDER

SB 5X by Crutchfield of the Senate and Bengé and Newport of the House was called up for consideration.

Senator Rabon moved to amend **SB 5X**, by striking the title, the enacting clause and the entire body of the bill and substituting the floor substitute, which amendment was declared adopted. (Copies were provided for all Senators.)

Senator Rabon moved that **SB 5X** be advanced, which motion was declared adopted.

THIRD READING

SB 5X was read for the third time at length.

On the question of passage of the bill and emergency, the vote resulted as follows:

Senator Fisher moved to amend the floor substitute to **HB 1001X**, Page 1, by restoring the enacting clause, which amendment was declared adopted.

Senator Fisher moved that **HB 1001X** be advanced, which motion was declared adopted.
