Senator Sharp moved to amend **SB 431**, Page 3, Lines 8 and 9, by deleting all language beginning with the word "Members" through the word "reimbursement." and inserting in lieu thereof the following language:

"Members of the task force shall receive no compensation for serving on the task force but shall receive travel reimbursement as follows:

1. State employees who are members of the task force shall be reimbursed for travel expenses incurred in the performance of their duties by their respective agencies in accordance with the State Travel Reimbursement Act;
