President Lamb recognized Colonel Louis Wilham, Oklahoma National Guard, to introduce Adjutant General, Major General Miles L. Deering.

Adjutant General, Major General Miles L. Deering, addressed the Joint Session and conducted the program commemorating the 45th Infantry Division Appreciation Day.

Adjutant General, Major General Miles L. Deering introduced Governor Mary Fallin who addressed the Joint Session.

Colonel Wilham conducted a Special Presentation Ceremony honoring Private First Class Jeffrey R. Kerchee with the Purple Heart Medal and Corporal Scotty R. Hopper who was promoted to Sergeant.
