Advising passage of and transmitting for consideration Engrossed **HBs 2325, 2407, 2477, 2486, 2506, 2527, 2568, 2582, 2588, 2652, 2692, 2877, 3157, 3173, 3190, 3191, 3192, 3194, 3195, 3199, 3200, 3202, 3332 and 3367.**

HB 2325 – By Cleveland of the House and Dahm of the Senate.

An Act relating to torts; amending 76 O.S. 2011, Section 33, which relates to civil immunity during a time of emergency; permitting shelter to be provided; providing for request from the federal government or political subdivision thereof; including tornado as a catastrophic act of nature; and providing an effective date.

HB 2407 – By Bennett of the House and Allen of the Senate.

An Act relating to bail bondsman; amending 59 O.S. 2011, Section 1301, which relates to definitions; adding definition; amending 59 O.S. 2011, Section 1305, as amended by Section 1, Chapter 82, O.S.L. 2012 (59 O.S. Supp. 2013, Section 1305), which relates to application for licensure; adding fee for multicounty agent bondsman; stating procedure for licensure and qualifications for multicounty agent bondsman; requiring certain deposit; providing procedure for release of deposit; authorizing transfer of certain license upon certain conditions; providing no limitation on number of bonds for certain licensee; amending 59 O.S. 2011, Section 1309, as last amended by Section 3, Chapter 150, O.S.L. 2013 (59 O.S. Supp. 2013, Section 1309), which relates to renewal of licenses; adding new fee; requiring annual financial statement for certain licenses; amending 59 O.S. 2011, Section 1314, which relates to reports; requiring monthly reports; providing for codification; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

HB 2477 – By Wood and Turner of the House and Dahm of the Senate.

An Act relating to crimes and punishments; amending 21 O.S. 2011, Section 1289.6, as amended by Section 11, Chapter 259, O.S.L. 2012 (21 O.S. Supp. 2013, Section 1289.6), which relates to the carrying of firearms; authorizing the carrying of knives under certain conditions; prohibiting disarmament or physical restraint by law enforcement under certain circumstances; and providing an effective date.

HB 2486 – By Billy of the House and Barrington of the Senate.

An Act relating to prisons and reformatories; amending 57 O.S. 2011, Section 549, which relates to powers and duties of the State Board of Corrections; providing exemption to certain inmate wage requirement; and providing an effective date.

HB 2506 – By McDaniel (Randy) of the House and Newberry of the Senate.

An Act relating to small claims; amending 12 O.S. 2011, Section 1751, as amended by Section 1, Chapter 282, O.S.L. 2012 (12 O.S. Supp. 2013, Section 1751), which relates to small claims procedure; permitting action brought by creditor if debt assigned in ordinary course of business prior to default; and providing an effective date.

HB 2527 – By Floyd, Pittman and Sherrer and of the House and Ivester of the Senate.

An Act relating to revenue and taxation; providing income tax checkoff for domestic violence legal aid services; allowing taxpayer to designate portion of tax liability into fund; defining term; directing placement of funds; creating the Domestic Violence Legal Aid Revolving Fund; allowing Attorney General to distribute monies in fund; specifying method of payment of funds; requiring notice on website; allowing refund for certain donations; providing time limit for refund; providing for codification; and providing an effective date.

HB 2568 – By Thomsen of the House and Paddock of the Senate.

An Act relating to crimes and punishments; amending 21 O.S. 2011, Section 388, which relates to attempts to influence jurors; providing gender-neutral language; modifying penalty; and providing an effective date.

HB 2582 – By Thomsen of the House and Stanislawski of the Senate.

An Act relating to schools; amending 70 O.S. 2011, Section 3-136, which relates to the Oklahoma Charter Schools Act; requiring charter schools to comply with certain law and implement the Oklahoma Teacher and Leader Effectiveness Evaluation System (TLE); requiring charter schools to adopt a policy that designates teachers in certain categories and includes a certain dismissal process; and limiting construction.

HB 2588 – By Ownbey, Nelson, Kern, Peterson, Russ and Cooksey of the House and Simpson of the Senate.

An Act relating to foster care; amending 10 O.S. 2011, Section 601.6, which relates to the Office of Juvenile System Oversight; directing receipt of certain foster parent complaint; describing nature of complaints; directing complaints be forwarded to Office of Client Advocacy for investigation; requiring work between offices to ensure investigation and disposition of complaints; providing exception; amending 10A O.S. 2011, Sections 1-9-112, as amended by Section 7, Chapter 353, O.S.L. 2012, 1-9-119 and 1-9-120 (10A O.S. Supp. 2013, Section 1-9-112), which relate to the Oklahoma Children's Code; specifying how complaints are received; requiring bill of rights be given to foster parents annually; directing Office of Client Advocacy work with Office of Juvenile System Oversight to track complaints; setting time frame for resolution of grievances; requiring notification of grievance procedures at the time of placement; directing designation of certain employee;

requiring an annual report; describing contents of annual report; and declaring an emergency.

HB 2652 – By Denney of the House and Bingman of the Senate.

An Act relating to environment and natural resources; amending 27A O.S. 2011, Section 2-16-106, which relates to the Oklahoma Refinery Revitalization Act; replacing certain review board with the Secretary of Energy and Environment; and providing an effective date.

HB 2692 – By Johnson and Kern of the House and Sykes of the Senate.

An Act relating to crimes and punishments; amending 21 O.S. 2011, Section 1290.5, as amended by Section 26, Chapter 259, O.S.L. 2012 (21 O.S. Supp. 2013, Section 1290.5), which relates to the Oklahoma Self-Defense Act; extending grace period for license renewals; and providing an effective date.

HB 2877 – By Newell of the House and David of the Senate.

An Act relating to prisons and reformatories; amending 57 O.S. 2011, Section 561.1, as amended by Section 256, Chapter 304, O.S.L. 2012 (57 O.S. Supp. 2013, Section 561.1), which relates to private prison contractors; clarifying requirements for determining daily costs of inmates; and providing an effective date.

HB 3157 – By Wright of the House and Schulz of the Senate.

An Act relating to roads and bridges; amending 69 O.S. 2011, Sections 1273 and 1277, which relate to highway advertising; defining term; providing for certain permit revocations; and providing an effective date.

HB 3173 – By Henke and Blackwell of the House and Sharp of the Senate.

An Act relating to schools; amending 51 O.S. 2011, Section 24A.7, which relates to the confidentiality of certain personnel records; requiring certain records to be kept confidential; amending 70 O.S. 2011, Section 6-101.16, as last amended by Section 4, Chapter 373, O.S.L. 2013 (70 O.S. Supp. 2013, Section 6-101.16), which relates to the Oklahoma Teacher and Leader Effectiveness Evaluation System; prohibiting certain records from being subject to disclosure under certain act; providing for certain interpretation; and providing an effective date.

HB 3190 – By Blackwell of the House and Treat of the Senate.

An Act relating to sunset; amending 59 O.S. 2011, Section 15.2, which relates to the Oklahoma Accountancy Board; re-creating the Board; and modifying termination date.

HB 3191 – By Blackwell of the House and Treat of the Senate.

An Act relating to sunset; amending 59 O.S. 2011, Section 475.3, which relates to the State Board of Licensure for Professional Engineers and Land Surveyors; re-creating the Board; and modifying termination date.

HB 3192 – By Blackwell of the House and Treat of the Senate.

An Act relating to sunset; amending 74 O.S. 2011, Section 245, as amended by Section 1, Chapter 100, O.S.L. 2012 (74 O.S. Supp. 2013, Section 245), which relates to the Oklahoma Climatological Survey; re-creating the Survey; and modifying termination date.

HB 3194 – By Blackwell of the House and Treat of the Senate.

An Act relating to sunset; amending 62 O.S. 2011, Section 34.30, as amended by Section 362, Chapter 304, O.S.L. 2012 (62 O.S. Supp. 2013, Section 34.30), which relates to the Electronic and Information Technology Accessibility Advisory Council; and re-creating the Council.

HB 3195 – By Blackwell of the House and Treat of the Senate.

An Act relating to sunset; amending 63 O.S. 2011, Section 1-1923, which relates to the Long-Term Care Facility Advisory Board; re-creating the Board; and modifying termination date.

HB 3199 – By Blackwell of the House and Treat of the Senate.

An Act relating to sunset; amending 59 O.S. 2011, Section 396, which relates to the Oklahoma Funeral Board; re-creating the Board; and modifying termination date.

HB 3200 – By Blackwell of the House and Treat of the Senate.

An Act relating to sunset; amending 59 O.S. 2011, Section 1253, as amended by Section 1, Chapter 68, O.S.L. 2012 (59 O.S. Supp. 2013, Section 1253), which relates to the State Board of Licensed Social Workers; re-creating the Board; and modifying termination date.

HB 3202 – By Blackwell of the House and Treat of the Senate.

An Act relating to sunset; amending 10 O.S. 2011, Section 1150.2, as amended by Section 1, Chapter 69, O.S.L. 2012 (10 O.S. Supp. 2013, Section 1150.2), which relates to the Child Death Review Board; re-creating the Board; and modifying termination date.

HB 3332 – By Murphey of the House and Dahm of the Senate.

An Act relating to crimes and punishments; repealing 21 O.S. 2011, Sections 1844, 1845, 1846 and 1847, which relate to emergency telephone calls on party lines; and providing an effective date.

HB 3367 – By Echols, Turner, Ritze and Bennett of the House and Dahm of the Senate.

An Act relating to crimes and punishments; amending 21 O.S. 2011, Section 1289.24, as amended by Section 22, Chapter 259, O.S.L. 2012 (21 O.S. Supp. 2013, Section 1289.24), which relates to the Firearms Act of 1971; expanding scope of state preemption to include knives; and providing an effective date.
