“SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 160.20 of Title 17, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

A. Upon the effective date of this act until January 1, 2017, unless earlier repealed, there shall be a moratorium imposed on any new development, construction or installation of any wind energy facility, as defined in Section 160.13 of Title 17 of the Oklahoma Statutes, in any area of this state which is both located east of United States Interstate Highway 35 and identified as an area with an annual wind power estimate rated less than “Fair” on the United States Department of Energy National Renewable Energy Laboratory map issued November 25, 2008. Wind energy facilities that have commenced construction

as defined in Section 160.13 of Title 17 of the Oklahoma Statutes as of January 1, 2014, shall not be subject to the provisions of this act.”, and by amending the title to conform, which amendment was declared adopted.

Senator Brinkley moved to amend **SB 1440**, Page 1, by striking the title, which amendment was declared adopted.

Senator Brinkley moved that **SB 1440** be advanced, which motion was declared adopted.
