Second Regular Session of the Fifty-fifth Legislature of the State of Oklahoma

Twenty-eighth Legislative Day, Monday, March 21, 2016

The Senate was called to order by Senator Stanislawski.

GENERAL ORDER

Supp. 2015, Section 11-103.6a-1), which relates to legislative review of subject matter standards; clarifying actions that may be taken by the

Legislature in a joint resolution; modifying when the State Board of Education may revise the standards; directing distribution; and declaring an emergency.
