FIRST READING

The following were introduced and read the first time:

An Act relating to driver licenses; repealing 47 O.S. 2011, Section 6-110.3, which relates to the Oklahoma Nonparticipation in Implementation of Real ID Act of 2005; and declaring an emergency.

SB 2 – By Dossett.

An Act relating to schools; amending 70 O.S. 2011, Section 1210.508, as last amended by Section 4, Chapter 360, O.S.L. 2016 (70 O.S. Supp. 2016, Section 1210.508), which relates to the statewide system of student assessments; removing the requirement to administer assessments in U.S. history; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

SB 3 - By Sharp.

An Act relating to motor vehicle insurance; enacting The Bob Barry, Jr. Oklahoma Responsible Driver Act; providing short title; amending 47 O.S. 2011, Section 7-605, which relates to suspension of driving privilege and proof of security; modifying procedures to reinstate a suspended license, requiring drivers in violation of the Compulsory Insurance Act to file proof of insurance with the Department of Public Safety for 3 years; establishing procedure of filing proof of insurance; prohibiting termination of insurance on file without notification; allowing for a change of insurance; establishing conditions in which requirement of proof may be waived; providing for noncodification; providing for codification; and providing an effective date.

SB 4 - By Sharp.

An Act relating to limited liability companies; amending 18 O.S. 2011, Section 2054.3, which relates to appraisal rights; establishing appraisal rights for members of limited liability companies under certain circumstances; authorizing modification of certain appraisal rights; establishing exceptions to entitlement to appraisal rights; clarifying applicability of provisions; defining term; and providing an effective date.

SB 5 – By Brecheen.

An Act relating to firearm applications; amending 21 O.S. 2011, Section 1290.5, as last amended by Section 1, Chapter 122, O.S.L. 2014 (21 O.S. Supp. 2016, Section 1290.5), which relates to term of license and renewal; modifying renewal fees; amending 21 O.S. 2011, Section 1290.12, as last amended by Section 2, Chapter 256, O.S.L. 2016 (21 O.S. Supp. 2016, Section 1290.12), which relates to the procedure for application; modifying application fees; and providing an effective date.

SB 6 – By Brecheen.

An Act relating to firearms; amending 21 O.S. 2011, Section 1289.29, as amended by Section 3, Chapter 368, O.S.L. 2014 (21 O.S. Supp. 2016, Section 1289.29), which relates to United States Attorney carrying of firearm; modifying inclusions; and providing an effective date.

SB 7 – By Brecheen.

An Act relating to public finance; stating application of certain provisions; providing for selection of certain professionals for certain purposes; requiring Oklahoma State Bond Advisor to maintain certain lists; requiring Bond Advisor to provide certain list to issuers for a specified purpose; authorizing issuers to seek assistance of Oklahoma State Bond Advisor under certain circumstances; prohibiting the granting of certain inducements; requiring certain written justification to be provided to specific persons under certain circumstances; requiring certain report; providing for codification; and providing an effective date.

SB 8 - By Sharp.

An Act relating to teacher pay; establishing minimum salary schedule for teachers; defining fringe benefits; specifying certain recognition of college degrees; requiring the State Board of Education to accept certain teaching experience; limiting teaching credit for certain service and experience; allowing school district to offer more credit; directing the Board to recognize certain experiences; prohibiting application of minimum salary schedule to certain retired teachers; providing for codification; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

SB 9 - By Dossett.

An Act relating to elections; amending 26 O.S. 2011, Sections 7-119 and 7-127, which relate to conduct of elections; eliminating straight-party voting; and providing an effective date.

SB 10 – By Brecheen.

An Act relating to Rules of the Ethics Commission; amending Rules 5.6, 5.7 and 5.8 of the Rules of the Ethics Commission (74 O.S. Supp. 2016, Ch. 62, App. I), which relate to limits on meals and gifts; modifying amount which lobbyist principal, legislative liaison or legislative lobbyist may pay for meals or gifts for certain persons; and providing an effective date.

SB 11 – By Brecheen.

An Act relating to the Oklahoma Self Defense Act; amending 21 O.S. 2011, Section 1290.5, as last amended by Section 1, Chapter 122, O.S.L. 2014 (21 O.S. Supp. 2016, Section 1290.5), which relates to term of license and renewal; deleting certain license option; modifying renewal procedures; decreasing renewal fee amount for handgun licenses; modifying and deleting background check investigation procedures for handgun licenses; amending 21 O.S. 2011, Section 1290.9, as last amended by Section 1, Chapter 85, O.S.L. 2014 (21 O.S. Supp. 2016, Section 1290.9), which relates to eligibility; deleting certain eligibility requirement; amending 21 O.S. 2011, Section 1290.12, as last amended

by Section 2, Chapter 256, O.S.L. 2016 (21 O.S. Supp. 2016, Section 1290.12), which relates to the procedure for handgun application; providing procedures for submitting applications; decreasing application fee amount for handgun licenses; deleting fingerprint submission requirements; modifying and deleting certain background check investigation requirements and procedures for handgun licenses; amending 21 O.S. 2011, Section 1290.14, as last amended by Section 2, Chapter 207, O.S.L. 2015 (21 O.S. Supp. 2016, Section 1290.14), which relates to firearms safety and training course; requiring nonresident applications to complete certain course; deleting fingerprint requirements for firearms instructors; deleting certain registration certificate option; requiring instructors to verify identity of applicants; amending 21 O.S. 2011, Section 1290.18, as last amended by Section 1, Chapter 200, O.S.L. 2015 (21 O.S. Supp. 2016, Section 1290.18), which relates to handgun application form contents; modifying the content of the application form; amending 21 O.S. 2011, Section 1290.19, as amended by Section 38, Chapter 259, O.S.L. 2012 (21 O.S. Supp. 2016, Section 1290.19), which relates to firearm license form; modifying license forms; repealing 21 O.S. 2011, Sections 1290.10, as last amended by Section 1, Chapter 86, O.S.L. 2015, and 1290.11, as last amended by Section 2, Chapter 259, O.S.L. 2015, and 1290.20, as amended by Section 39, Chapter 259, O.S.L. 2012 (21 O.S. Supp. 2016, Sections 1290.10, 1290.11 and 1290.20); which relate to mandatory and temporary preclusions and refusing to submit applications; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

SB 12 – By Brecheen.

An Act relating to campus security; amending 74 O.S. 2011, Sections 360.16, as amended by Section 2, Chapter 48, O.S.L. 2012 and 360.18, as amended by Section 4, Chapter 48, O.S.L. 2012, (74 O.S. Supp. 2016, Sections 360.16 and 360.18), which relate to the Oklahoma Campus Security Act; modifying definitions; modifying inclusions; and providing an effective date.

SB 13 – By Sharp.

An Act relating to income tax; declaring certain actions null and void; amending 68 O.S. 2011, Section 2355, as last amended by Section 2, Chapter 195, O.S.L. 2014 (68 O.S. Supp. 2016, Section 2355); updating and conforming references; defining term; imposing specified duties on State Board of Equalization related to imposition of certain top marginal income tax rate for specified time period; prescribing method for specified computation and mandating certain action related thereto; repealing Section 5, Chapter 195, O.S.L. 2014 (68 O.S. Supp. 2016, Section 2355.1G), which relates to top marginal income tax rate change; providing for codification; providing for noncodification; and providing an effective date.

SB 14 – By Bice.

An Act relating to motor vehicle registration; amending 47 O.S. 2011, Section 1135.5, as last amended by Section 25, Chapter 210, O.S.L. 2016 (47 O.S. Supp. 2016, Section 1135.5), which relates to special license plates; creating Oklahoma License to Educate plate and providing for design and issuance thereof; creating Piedmont Education Foundation License plate and providing for design and issuance thereof; creating Piedmont Education Foundation License Plate Revolving Fund and providing for deposit and expenditure of funds; providing for codification; and providing an effective date.

SB 15 – By Bice.

An Act relating to teachers; directing the State Department of Education and the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education to develop and implement teacher recruitment programs; requiring distribution of materials; giving certain programs priority; encouraging business community and school districts to cooperate in developing certain programs; encouraging certain associations to cooperate in developing certain programs; making actions contingent upon funding; creating the Oklahoma Teacher Recruitment Revolving Fund; specifying sources of fund; providing for expenditures; providing for codification; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

An Act relating to the 1921 Tulsa Race Riot; creating the 1921 Tulsa Race Riot Centennial Memorial Revolving Fund; providing for deposits thereto and expenditures therefrom; requiring transfer of certain funds; repealing 74 O.S. 2011, Sections 8201.1, 8201.2, 8203, 8204 and 8205, which relate to the 1921 Tulsa Race Riot; providing for codification; and providing an effective date.

SB 18 – By Standridge.

An Act relating to public finance; amending 62 O.S. 2011, Section 46, as last amended by Section 1, Chapter 43, O.S.L. 2016 (62 O.S. Supp. 2016, Section 46), which relates to the Taxpayer Transparency Act; updating statutory reference; requiring state agencies and political subdivisions to make certain information immediately available to members of the Legislature upon request; providing procedures; and providing an effective date.

SB 19 – By Loveless.

An Act relating to schools; directing each school district to make available a fiscal report card for school sites by certain date; providing for contents of fiscal report cards; requiring distribution to certain students; requiring posting of report cards online; providing for codification; and providing an effective date.

SB 20 – By Loveless.

An Act relating to teachers; amending 70 O.S. 2011, Section 6-194, as last amended by Section 1, Chapter 246, O.S.L. 2015 (70 O.S. An Act relating to motor vehicles; amending 47 O.S. 2011, Section 1-105, which relates to the definition of bus; amending definition; and providing an effective date.

SB 27 – By Brecheen.

An Act relating to the Oklahoma Highway Patrol; amending 47 O.S. 2011, Section 2-105, as last amended by Section 1, Chapter 228, O.S.L. 2014 (47 O.S. Supp. 2016, Section 2-105), which relates to personnel of the Highway Patrol Division; modifying qualifications for certain positions; and providing an effective date.

SB 28 - By Thompson.

An Act relating to Oklahoma Law Enforcement Telecommunication System; amending 47 O.S. 2011, Section 2-125, as amended by Section 3, Chapter 283, O.S.L. 2012 (47 O.S. Supp. 2016, Section 2-125), which relates to the deposit of funds; making certain allowances; directing certain actions; and providing an effective date.

SB 29 – By Thompson.

An Act relating to teachers; amending 70 O.S. 2011, Section 5-142, as last amended by Section 1, Chapter 12, O.S.L. 2015 (70 O.S. Supp. 2016, Section 5-142), which relates to criminal history record check requirements for school employees; providing for a criminal history record check to not be required if such a check has been conducted within certain time frame; allowing a board of education to require certain record check; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

SB 30 – By Griffin.

An Act relating to the State Department of Health; amending Section 2, Chapter 353, O.S.L. 2016 (63 O.S. Supp. 2016, Section 1-752), which relates to pregnancy assistance; deleting certain provisions relating to funding; expanding provisions of certain statement; requiring provision of certain internet link; directing Department to use social media for promoting certain information; requiring certain facilities to post certain signage; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

SB 31 – By Standridge.

An Act relating to public employees; amending 74 O.S. 2011, Section 4254, which relates to lobbying by state officers and employees; prohibiting employees of state or political subdivision from being employed or receiving compensation in certain circumstances for certain period; and providing an effective date.

SB 32 - By Thompson.

An Act relating to crimes and punishment; amending 21 O.S. 2011, Section 748, as last amended by Section 2, Chapter 231, O.S.L. 2014 (21 O.S. Supp. 2016, Section 748), which relates to human trafficking; modifying requirements; amending 63 O.S. 2011, Section 2-401, as amended by Section 4, Chapter 206, O.S.L. 2012 (63 O.S. Supp. 2016, Section 2-401), which relates to penalties for prohibited acts; modifying the application of earned credits for offenders; and providing an effective date.

SB 33 – By Boggs.

An Act relating to Veterans; amending 61 O.S. 2011, Section 121, as last amended by Section 1, Chapter 170, O.S.L. 2013 (61 O.S. Supp. 2016, Section 121), which relates to change orders or addenda to public construction contracts; authorizing the Oklahoma Veterans Commission to delegate to the Director of the Oklahoma Department of Veterans Affairs the authority to approve change orders on certain construction contracts; providing requirements of certain change orders; and providing an effective date.

SB 34 – By David.

An Act relating to human trafficking; amending 21 O.S. 2011, Section 748, as last amended by Section 2, Chapter 231, O.S.L. 2014 (21 O.S. Supp. 2016, Section 748), which relates to human trafficking; prohibiting a certain defense; and providing an effective date.

SB 35 – By David.

An Act relating to firearms; amending 21 O.S. 2011, Section 1290.8, as last amended by Section 4, Chapter 366, O.S.L. 2013 (21 O.S. Supp. 2016, Section 1290.8), which relates to possession of license required; modifying inclusions; amending 21 O.S. 2011, Section 1290.12, as last amended by Section 2, Chapter 256, O.S.L. 2016 (21 O.S. Supp. 2016, Section 1290.12), which relates to the procedure for application; modifying certain requirements; amending 21 O.S. 2011, Section 1290.15, as last amended by Section 2, Chapter 86, O.S.L. 2013 (21 O.S. Supp. 2016, Section 1290.15), which relates to persons exempt from training course; modifying inclusions; modifying certain exemption requirements; amending 21 O.S. 2011, Section 1290.26, as last amended by Section 18,

Chapter 15, O.S.L. 2013 (21 O.S. Supp. 2016, Section 1290.26), which relates to reciprocal agreement authority; modifying authorized inclusions; and providing an effective date.

An Act relating to firearms; amending 21 O.S. 2011, Section 1289.3, which relates to definitions for Firearms Act; modifying certain definitions; amending 21 O.S. 2011, Section 1290.2, as last amended by Section 2, Chapter 366, O.S.L. 2013 (21 O.S. Supp. 2016, Section 1290.2), which relates to definitions; modifying certain definitions; and providing an effective date.

SB 37 – By Loveless.

An Act relating to instructional days; amending 70 O.S. 2011, Section 1-109, as last amended by Section 1, Chapter 6, O.S.L. 2016 (70 O.S. Supp. 2016, Section 1-109), which relates to the length of the school year; prohibiting a school schedule from consisting of fewer than five days per week except in certain circumstances; amending 70 O.S. 2011, Section 1-111, as last amended by Section 1, Chapter 135, O.S.L. 2016 (70 O.S. Supp. 2016, Section 1-111), which relates to the school day; directing a district board of education to require that instruction be provided for five days per week except in certain circumstances; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

An Act relating to fines and fees; amending 20 O.S. 2011, Section 1313.4, which relates to the Forensic Science Improvement Revolving Fund; modifying certain fees; and providing an effective date.

An Act relating to carrying firearms; amending 21 O.S. 2011, Section 1277, as last amended by Section 1, Chapter 18, O.S.L. 2016 (21 O.S. Supp. 2016, Section 1277), which relates to unlawful carry in certain places; modifying notification procedures for certain situations; and providing an effective date.

SB 44 - By Sharp.

An Act relating to texting and driving; amending Section 2, Chapter 248, O.S.L. 2015, as amended by Section 1, Chapter 186, O.S.L. 2016 (47 O.S. Supp. 2016, Section 11-901d), which relates to text messaging; modifying inclusions; providing exception; deleting certain definitions; and providing an effective date.

SB 45 – By Sharp.

An Act relating to educator contracts; authorizing the State Department of Education to contract with certain educators for certain services; exempting the contracts from certain act; prohibiting the contracts from being included in certain calculation; amending 74 O.S. 2011, Section 85.12, as last amended by Section 1, Chapter 76, O.S.L. 2016 (74 O.S. Supp. 2016, Section 85.12), which relates to acquisitions excluded from the Oklahoma Central Purchasing Act; providing an exemption for certain contracts entered into by the Department of Education; providing for codification; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

An Act relating to cities and towns; amending 11 O.S. 2011, Section 51-104, as last amended by Section 7, Chapter 15, O.S.L. 2013 (11 O.S. Supp. 2016, Section 51-104), which relates to the Public Employees Relations Board; re-creating the Public Employees Relations Board; and declaring an emergency.

SB 47 – By Kidd.

An Act relating to definitions and general provisions; establishing "Oklahoma Aviation and Aerospace Day"; providing for codification; and providing an effective date.

SB 48 – By Dahm.

An Act relating to county officers and public records; amending 19 O.S. 2011, Section 130.3, which relates to the Commission on County Government Personnel Education and Training; removing obsolete language; amending 19 O.S. 2011, Sections 155.1, 155.4, 155.5 and 155.7, which relate to county records; updating statutory language regarding reproduction and storage of certain county records; updating statutory reference; and amending 19 O.S. 2011, Section 174.1, which relates to county audits; requiring publication on certain websites; updating language; and declaring an emergency.

SB 50 – By Floyd.

An Act relating to guardians ad litem; amending 43 O.S. 2011, Section 107.3, which relates to appointment of guardian ad litem; modifying certain responsibility of guardian ad litem; clarifying party to make certain determination; updating statutory reference; and providing an effective date.

An Act relating to sales tax; amending 68 O.S. 2011, Section 1357, as last amended by Section 18, Chapter 54, O.S.L. 2015 (68 O.S. Supp. 2016, Section 1357), which relates to exemptions; providing exemption for forestry equipment; and providing an effective date.

SB 52 – By Fry.

An Act relating to driver licenses; amending 47 O.S. 2011, Section 6-112, which relates to licenses to be carried and exhibited on demand; modifying certain action; and providing an effective date.

SB 53 – By Fry.

An Act relating to motorcycles; amending 47 O.S. 2011, Section 12-602, which relates to headlamps on motorcycles; modifying allowances; and providing an effective date.

SB 54 – By Boggs.

An Act relating to prisons and reformatories; amending 57 O.S. 2011, Section 510, as last amended by Section 1, Chapter 115, O.S.L. 2016 (57 O.S. Supp. 2016, Section 510), which relates to penal institutions; directing certain action; and providing an effective date.

SB 55 – By Sharp.

An Act relating to motor vehicle license plates; amending 47 O.S. 2011, Section 1135.5, as last amended by Section 25, Chapter 210, O.S.L. 2016 (47 O.S. Supp. 2016, Section 1135.5), which relates to specialty license plates; creating special Sooner State ABATE license plate for automobiles and motorcycles for specified purpose; providing for design of plate; authorizing certain licensing agreement; creating the Sooner State ABATE License Plate Revolving Fund and designating certain fee to be deposited therein; providing for codification; and providing an effective date.

SB 56 – By Dossett.

An Act relating to concurrent enrollment; amending 70 O.S. 2011, Section 628.13, which relates to participation in concurrent enrollment; removing language related to awarding of academic credit for concurrently enrolled higher education courses; requiring school districts to offer no fewer than two concurrent enrollment courses to certain students for which academic credit shall be granted; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

SB 57 – By Boggs.

An Act relating to veterans; amending 72 O.S. 2011, Section 63.5, as amended by Section 3, Chapter 212, O.S.L. 2014 (72 O.S. Supp. 2016, Section 63.5), which relates to the collection of payments from eligible patients and members for care and maintenance; updating language; clarifying certain admission standards; and providing an effective date.

SB 58 – By Bice.

An Act relating to alcoholic beverages; amending Sections 108 and 138, Chapter 366, O.S.L. 2016 (37A O.S. Supp. 2016, Sections 5-105 and 5-135), which relate to taxes on alcoholic beverages; modifying rate of tax on certain gross receipts; clarifying statutory references; and providing an effective date.

SB 59 – By Boggs.

An Act relating to the Oklahoma Military Department; permitting the Adjutant General to enter into mutual aid agreements; authorizing promulgation of rules; providing for codification; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.

SB 60 – By Bice.

The Second Joint Session of the First Regular Session of the Fifty-sixth Legislature was called to order by the President of the Senate, Lieutenant Governor Todd Lamb.

Senator Treat moved that the attendance roll call of the Senate be considered the attendance roll call of the Senate in Joint Session, which motion was declared adopted.

Representative Echols moved that the attendance roll call of the House of Representatives be considered the attendance roll call of the House in Joint Session, which motion was declared adopted.

President Lamb declared quorums of the Senate and House present and Joint Session duly assembled.

The invocation was offered by Pastor Rex Clayton, Calvary Baptiust Church in Tishomingo, the guest of Speaker Charles McCall.

Posting of the Colors was presented by the Air Force Junior ROTC of Choctaw High School in Choctaw, Oklahoma.

President Todd Lamb introduced his wife, Monica to the Joint Session.

Senator Treat moved that the President and Speaker appoint a committee of members from the Senate and House of Representatives, respectively, as a Joint Committee to notify Governor Mary Fallin that the Second Joint Session of the Fifty-sixth Legislature is now in Joint Session and ready to receive her and hear her message, which motion was declared adopted.

President Lamb appointed for the Senate the following: Senators Bass, Brown, and Sykes.

Speaker Hickman appointed for the House of Representatives the following: Representatives McDaniel, Thomsen, and Watson.

President Lamb recognized Sergeant at Arms, Robert Dennis, who announced the arrival of the Honorable Mary Fallin, Governor of the State of Oklahoma.

Governor Fallin was escorted to the Speaker's rostrum by the Joint Committee and presented to the Joint Session by President Lamb where she delivered her message.

MESSAGE OF GOVERNOR MARY FALLIN

Lieutenant Governor Lamb, statewide elected officials, Speaker McCall, President Pro Tem Schulz, members of the court, honorable senators and representatives, Cabinet members, tribal leaders, distinguished guests, and citizens of Oklahoma:

I appreciate the second bond issue enacted last year to renovate this wonderful, irreplaceable building in which we now gather. We will celebrate its 100th birthday on June 30. We have many great activities planned for the celebration.

This is my seventh year that I've had the privilege of delivering this message. We have accomplished a lot, and I plan to be just as productive in my remaining two years. In a book on leadership by Stan Toler, it's written: "Great leaders are never satisfied with current levels of performance. They are relentlessly driven by possibilities and potential achievement. Those who try to do something and fail are infinitely better than those who try to do nothing and succeed."

Today, I want to talk about what we can accomplish, give hope to our state and chart a course for a brighter future.

There is no question the dramatic downturn in our energy sector and an increased loss of sales tax revenue from online shopping the last couple of years have affected our state – both in our private and public sectors.

But we are a resilient state, made of strong people with a long, proud history of facing our challenges head-on and coming out in a better place. We love our families and strive to improve our economy. We are patriotic, and respect our law enforcement officers and veterans. We value our freedoms and liberties.

In preparing for this speech, I thought of our strengths, which I just mentioned, along with our weaknesses, opportunities and threats.

Oklahoma will continue to struggle if we don't fix the structural deficits of our budget.

The well-respected CEO of American Express, Ken Chenault, is fond of paraphrasing a quote attributed to Napoleon: "Leaders define reality and provide hope."

So, as our state's top leaders, let's focus on the REALITY of our state budget deficit. To start, for decades we have attempted to balance our budget for too long with the use of one-time resources. We cannot afford to pass another budget using a large amount of non-recurring revenue.

It is important to provide sufficient revenues to meet the basic responsibilities that our government owes to its citizens, namely:

Educating our children

Ensuring the health and public safety of our people.

And preserving and improving our infrastructure.

No one can argue that these are not fundamental state services...and our ability to provide them to Oklahomans, reliably, and efficiently, is not cutting it.

Government in and of itself does not create jobs, but it should provide the right environment to grow the economy through a free-market system, unfettered by burdensome regulations.

It is our responsibility to prepare a plan and workable budget for long-term solutions to the challenges that our state faces. We must deliver services that work for the people, and put people over politics.

But let's face it – the continued uncertainty of our budget affects not only the services we provide our citizens, but also the effectiveness of government.

Let's work together to get the job done, to ensure the best possible outcomes for our people.

To do so, we need to invest in Oklahoma's future.

So what do we do about it?

Eliminate state sales tax on groceries; corporate income tax

Today, I am proposing a series of bold reforms to stabilize our state regarding both recurring revenue and repairing the structural deficit of the budget. We must put Oklahoma on a solid foundation for the future.

This proposal represents a modernization of Oklahoma tax laws that will ensure new growth in years to come so that we may have the flexibility to prioritize spending as new needs emerge.

This plan eliminates the most regressive tax on the books today, the state sales tax on groceries. This will benefit all Oklahomans. Eliminating the state sales tax on groceries is expected to result in annual savings of between \$350 to \$676 for a family of four.

It also gets rid of one of the most volatile sources of revenue - the corporate income tax. It will reduce the paperwork and red tape burden of many small businesses in our state and boost economic development. Eliminating this tax provides more transparency as it also eliminates the need for the Legislature to pick winners and losers with specific tax credits.

Expand the sales tax base

Third, sales tax modernization. Many decades ago, when the Legislature first contemplated the sales tax laws to boost revenues, the economy depended on the manufacture and sale of goods. As the economy in the United States has shifted from a manufacturing-based economy to a services-based economy, the way we impose taxes and collect revenue no longer reflects the current economy, but instead an outdated system that has not changed much since its inception.

By expanding the sales tax base, this allows us to eliminate the state sales tax on groceries and the corporate income tax. And it may be possible in the future to further lower the sales tax rate.

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To improve the health of our state, I'm also once again asking you to raise our cigarette tax. Smoking remains the Number One preventable cause of death in Oklahoma. It costs our state \$1.62 billion in health care costs. The revenue raised can be spent on current health care needs.

Gasoline and diesel taxes should go to roads and bridges

Next, for decades we've talked about how gasoline and diesel taxes should go to roads and bridges. My tax reform plan does that.

My plan will ensure taxes associated with roads and bridges are the funding source for maintenance of roads and bridges, - period - returning individual income taxes to the General Revenue Fund. This plan does not impact the projects in the Department of Transportation's 8-year plan.

Oklahoma currently ranks 48^{th} in diesel tax in the nation and 49^{th} in gasoline tax. I am proposing a new revenue stream by increasing our gas and diesel taxes to the regional state average, but still below the national average.

By trading out the use of individual income tax to a gas and diesel tax dedicated to fund our roads and bridges, this budget change dramatically improves the percentage of revenue collections the Legislature could control.

As we've discussed for decades, let's put the fuel taxes into roads and bridges.

By working together – and avoiding distractions – we can solve today's problems and make Oklahoma grow and prosper.

Improve the workforce and education

First: Improve the workforce and education. As of August 31, 2016, there were more than 71,000 open jobs in the state of Oklahoma. Of these open jobs, about 18,000 were critical occupations, such as engineers, teachers, nurses, chemists, accountants and truck drivers. Therefore, I am providing \$20 million for higher education programs.

A thriving, prosperous economy must have a skilled, educated workforce. That starts with good teachers in the classrooms providing our children a quality education FIVE days a week. And my budget provides both.

In a recent meeting I hosted with major national site selection companies, an executive asked me how he could persuade businesses to come to Oklahoma when some of our schools have four-day education weeks. We must have five-day school weeks.

Let's act on a permanent pay raise for our public school teachers. It is what the public and families want. The pay raise may need to be phased in and it may be targeted, but it must be done.

However, we also know that a pay raise alone will not improve student outcomes. We have to ensure more existing dollars are reaching every classroom by tackling administrative inefficiencies head-on.

We have a very top-heavy system that needs to be reformed to provide teachers and students more resources. The state already provides a number of services that schools could voluntarily take advantage of to save money, such as IT services, purchasing and bonding assistance.

In addition, I am creating a task force to review the state education funding formula, evaluate funding sources, and analyze the K-12 system footprint. Just as we must fix our own state budget structural issues, we must do the same with the K-12 education system.

Our education system must be focused on creating the best outcomes. To do so, we must ensure more money goes to our classrooms and teachers. We must empower students and parents by giving them more choices so they can best address their own needs.

We must be accountable to the taxpayers on how we spend education dollars.

Public safety: Trooper needs; modernize corrections

Second, public safety. We need to keep our families and our communities safe.

Last fall, a dangerous man named Michael Vance Jr. traveled across Oklahoma on a deadly crime spree for a week. Law enforcement was desperate to find and stop him. He finally was spotted in rural area in Custer County in western Oklahoma. Trooper Brian Costanza drove 230 miles - all the way up from Okmulgee County in eastern Oklahoma - to help. Driving at a high rate of speed, Trooper Costanza chased Vance down a dark rural road, blowing out his own windshield while exchanging gunshots at Vance who had an AK-47 rifle. I'm sure you've seen the video – it is incredible. Trooper Costanza – along with the other troopers who helped to pursue and apprehend Vance - troopers Chris Hanover, Trenton Keasler, Brandon Seward, Micah Whittington along with helicopter pilots Captain Brian Sturgill and Cole Patterson are here today. Thank you, gentlemen: Please stand.

Thank you to all of our law enforcement officers and their families who make sacrifices to keep us safe.

Approximately 26 percent of our current Highway Patrol troopers are eligible for retirement. We must prepare for the future and fund a trooper academy. While we're at it, no trooper should be furloughed or restricted to driving 100 miles a day because of lack of funding.

My budget accommodates these issues.

Investing in public safety is not just about investing in the Highway Patrol. Public safety is also about investing in ways to be smarter on crime and tough on true criminals.

It's no secret our prison population is in a crisis with over 61,000 people under the jurisdiction of corrections. Our prisons are way over capacity, and our prison population is expected to grow by 25 percent in the next 10 years.

Oklahoma's overall incarceration rate is the second-highest in the country. We lead the nation in female incarceration – incarcerating women at two and a half times the national average.

Contrary to what some may think, Oklahoma women aren't meaner.

Without reform, Oklahoma must build or lease three new prisons – an expensive proposition even in the best of times. We would need two new prisons immediately without further reform. That is why I created the Oklahoma Justice Reform Task Force to find data-driven, smart-on-crime policies to focus on improving public safety.

Seventy-five percent of new admissions in prison are nonviolent offenders. The number of drug-possession offenders sentenced to prison with no prior convictions has more than doubled the last five years. My budget includes new money for corrections and treatment, which includes a \$50 million bond issue to build wings on a men's and a women's prison for substance abuse offenders and rehabilitation.

There is unprecedented conservative support on this issue from groups such as the American Conservative Union and Law Enforcement Leaders to Reduce Crime and Incarceration. Meanwhile, smart, conservative states such as Texas, Utah, Georgia, Kentucky and South Dakota are already headed this direction and these states have seen better public safety outcomes by pursuing similar reforms.

As Roy Williams, president and CEO of the Greater Oklahoma City Chamber of Commerce, has said, "Oklahoma spends too much money without positive outcomes locking up low-level, nonviolent people. The business community supports the governor's efforts and encourages the Legislature to seriously consider these recommendations. Doing nothing means taxpayers must spend billions more to incarcerate more people, or risk problematic federal intervention."

And while I'm talking about public safety, send me a bill to fix REAL ID licenses. We have four months to solve this issue. Let's get it done.

Health: Reduce insurance regulations

Third: Health. As I said in my second inaugural, our health outcomes are holding us back and the status quo is unacceptable. As a result, we have convened health leaders from throughout the health care industry and state government to ensure we are improving health outcomes, the quality of health care and controlling costs.

There are many issues to contend with in health care, and Obamacare has created additional problems we must address.

Health care premiums are increasing at a dramatic rate, deductibles are so high people can scarcely afford the insurance coverage they have purchased, and the regulations that have been handed down from the federal government are creating added cost with limited benefit.

With help from local health care leaders, we are developing a plan we will submit to the new administration to fix some of the problems we have seen in Oklahoma.

We hope to reduce regulations to create cheaper insurance plans, encourage investment in private health accounts so people can direct their own health care purchases and utilize successful local programs, like Insure Oklahoma, to provide health insurance that works for Oklahomans.

And while we are fixing our broken health care system, we can never take our attention away from preventing illness in the first place.

Investing in state properties

Fourth: We can't continue to ignore our state's crumbling infrastructure. In my budget, I have identified our state's most urgent, pressing infrastructure needs along with a bond proposal to address them. They include a new Department of Health lab so we don't lose accreditation, and improving facilities for corrections, mental health and juvenile affairs, to name a few.

I have outlined a realistic, responsible way to put our state on a successful path. By investing in our state, we create a stronger business climate. A place where people want to live, work and raise a family.

But this can't happen unless we roll up our sleeves, and make tough decisions.

So, on your desks, you will see a packet that contains three budgets – red, yellow and green.

The red budget cuts \$868 million, which reflects our current shortfall. That's approximately an 11 percent cut to all agencies, some of which had already taken 20, 30, 40, 50 and – yes - even a 66 percent cut already.

The yellow budget drains almost half of the remaining balance of our Rainy Day Fund, and still makes substantial cuts.

These budgets would be detrimental to our state. Neither should be considered.


The green budget – my budget - represents a path forward, stabilizing the budget's structural challenges while investing in core, essential services. It basically mirrors our 2003 state budget adjusted for inflation, but is still less than the 2009 fiscal year budget, the highest watermark when adjusted for inflation. We must note, our student population since 2009 has grown by approximately 48,000 new students, and our state's population has grown from about three and a half million to just under four million.

Giving legislators more control over appropriating state dollars

As you can see on this chart, this will also give legislators more control in directing how this money can be spent to meet pressing needs. In the 2017 fiscal year, legislators have control of a little more than 44 cents for every dollar. By making these changes, we can bump that up to almost 62 cents for every dollar in the 2020 fiscal year.
