Eighth Legislative Day, Wednesday, February 15, 2017

MESSAGE FROM THE HOUSE

Advising passage of and transmitting for consideration Engrossed **HBs 1562, 1607, 1832** and **2251**.

HB 1562 – By Echols and Ritze of the House and Treat of the Senate.

An Act relating to State Capital and Capitol Building; amending 73 O.S. 2011, Section 15.1, as last amended by Section 1, Chapter 335, O.S.L. 2016 (73 O.S. Supp. 2016, Section 15.1), which relates to control of space by the Legislature; clarifying language; and providing an effective date.

HB 1607 – By Enns of the House and Pederson of the Senate.

An Act relating to motor vehicles; amending 47 O.S. 2011, Section 11-1112, as last amended by Section 1, Chapter 396, O.S.L. 2015 (47 O.S. Supp. 2016, Section 11-1112), which relates to child passenger restraint system requirements; providing exception from rear-facing requirement for children of physically disabled parent; and providing an effective date.

HB 1832 – By Osborn (Leslie) of the House and Paxton of the Senate.

An Act relating to children and juvenile code; amending 10A O.S. 2011, Section 1-1-105, as last amended by Section 1, Chapter 210, O.S.L. 2016 (10A O.S. Supp. 2016, Section 1-1-105), which relates to definitions; modifying definition; amending 10A O.S. 2011, Section 1-7-107, as amended by Section 2, Chapter 245, O.S.L. 2016 (10A O.S. Supp. 2016, Section 1-7-107), which relates to placement of siblings in the same home; authorizing the Department of Human Services to separate siblings if placement together would be contrary to safety or well-being of siblings; amending Section 1, Chapter 143, O.S.L. 2014, as amended by Section 1, Chapter 189, O.S.L. 2015 (10A O.S. Supp. 2016, Section 1-8-111), which relates to annual credit report for youth in custody; reducing age of youth in custody of the Department that shall be provided with an annual credit report; eliminating liability for foster parents for property damage or injuries in certain circumstances; providing certain acts and omissions shall not limit liability; providing for codification; and providing an effective date.

HB 2251 – By Brumbaugh and Ritze of the House and Quinn of the Senate.

An Act relating to counties and county officers; amending 19 O.S. 2011, Section 1505, as last amended by Section 5, Chapter 358, O.S.L. 2013 (19 O.S. Supp. 2016, Section 1505), which relates to county purchasing; authorizing county purchasing agents to solicit bid proposals by email; and providing an effective date.
