## First Regular Session of the Fifty-sixth Legislature of the State of Oklahoma

Seventeenth Legislative Day, Thursday, March 2, 2017

The Senate was called to order by Senator David.

### GENERAL ORDER

**HJR 1028** by Rogers of the House and Stanislawski of the Senate was called up for consideration.

Senator Stanislawski moved that **HJR 1028** be advanced, which motion was declared adopted.

**THIRD READING**

**HJR 1028** was read for the third time at length.

**MESSAGE FROM THE HOUSE**

Advising passage of and transmitting for consideration Engrossed **HBs 1337, 1499, 1510 and 1794**.

**HB 1337** – By Hoskin, Montgomery, Nollan, Tadlock, Meredith and Loring of the House and Bass of the Senate.

An Act relating to property; creating the Freedom to Display the American Flag Act; prohibiting certain associations from preventing the display of the American Flag on certain property; providing for codification; providing for noncodification; and declaring an emergency.

**HB 1499** – By Babinec, McDugle and West (Josh) of the House and Dugger of the Senate.

An Act relating to motor vehicles; transferring aircraft assets and operations of the Oklahoma Bureau of Narcotics and Dangerous Drugs Control and Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation to the Department of Public Safety; authorizing intra-agency agreements for use of aircraft; requiring state agency directors to provide certain notice of intent; establishing reporting requirement when purchasing or acquiring aircraft; authorizing non-public-safety entities to use aircraft upon certain approval; amending 63 O.S. 2011, Section 2-109, which relates to the rental or charter of aircraft by the Oklahoma Bureau of Narcotics and Dangerous Drugs Control; authorizing the Bureau to enter into intra-agency agreements for aircraft support; amending 74 O.S. 2011, Section 85.12b, as amended by Section 747, Chapter 304, O.S.L. 2012 (74 O.S. Supp. 2016, Section 85.12b), which relates to aircraft leasing, chartering and contracts; requiring approval by Commissioner of Public Safety when purchasing or leasing aircraft; amending 74 O.S. 2011, Section 150.16, as

amended by Section 1, Chapter 156, O.S.L. 2012 (74 O.S. Supp. 2016, Section 150.16), which relates to the rental or charter of aircraft by the Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation; authorizing the Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation to enter into intra-agency agreements for aircraft support; amending 74 O.S. 2011, Section 500.6, as amended by Section 1, Chapter 254, O.S.L. 2014 (74 O.S. Supp. 2016, Section 500.6), which relates to the State Travel Reimbursement Act; expanding scope of certain term; repealing 63 O.S. 2011, Section 2-106.1, as amended by Section 496, Chapter 304, O.S.L. 2012 (63 O.S. Supp. 2016, Section 2-106.1), which relates to leasing seaplanes; providing for codification; and providing an effective date.

**HB 1510** – By Strohm of the House and Stanislawski of the Senate.

An Act relating to motor vehicles; amending 47 O.S. 2011, Sections 1135.3 and 1135.5, as last amended by Sections 23 and 25, Chapter 210, O.S.L. 2016 (47 O.S. Supp. 2016, Sections 1135.3 and 1135.5), which relate to special license plates; correcting certain reference; transferring authority for Jenks Trojans License Plate to different section; creating the Bixby Spartans License Plate; establishing plates as financial assistance license plates; providing for design of license plates; authorizing certain licensing agreements; authorizing and limiting certain payments; and providing an effective date.

**HB 1794** – By McDugle, Ritze, West (Josh) and Faught of the House and Dahm of the Senate.

An Act relating to motor vehicles; amending 47 O.S. 2011, Section 1135.5, as last amended by Section 25, Chapter 210, O.S.L. 2016 (47 O.S. Supp. 2016, Section 1135.5), which relates to demonstration of support and financial assistance special license plates; creating the Prisoner of War and Missing in Action License Plate; establishing plates as financial assistance license plates; providing for design of license plates; requiring certain portion of fees be deposited in certain fund; creating the Prisoner of War and Missing in Action License Plate Revolving Fund; placing fund with the Oklahoma Department of Veterans Affairs; considering certain funds appropriated; exempting Fund from certain budgetary requirements; requiring certain budgetary procedures; providing for codification; and providing an effective date.

The above-numbered measures were read the first time.
