MESSAGE FROM THE HOUSE

Advising passage of and transmitting for consideration Engrossed **HBs 1505, 1693** and **2306**.

HB 1505 – By Strohm of the House and Stanislawski of the Senate.

An Act relating to professions and occupations; amending 59 O.S. 2011, Section 858-732, which relates to the Oklahoma Certified Real Estate Appraisers Act; requiring invoice be included in certain real property valuations; amending 59 O.S. 2011, Section 858-818, which relates to the Oklahoma Appraisal Management Company Regulation Act; modifying disclosure of fees; and providing an effective date.

HB 1693 – By Martin of the House and Stanislawski of the Senate.

An Act relating to schools; amending 70 O.S. 2011, Section 1210.541, as last amended by Section 9, Chapter 360, O.S.L. 2016 (70 O.S. Supp. 2016, Section 1210.541), which relates to student performance levels and cut scores; requiring that each local education

agency be provided certain data to identify schools for supports and interventions; requiring State Board of Education to establish system of interventions; amending 70 O.S. 2011, Section 1210.545, as last amended by Section 10, Chapter 360, O.S.L. 2016 (70 O.S.
