First Regular Session of the Fifty-sixth Legislature of the State of Oklahoma

Thirty-eighth Legislative Day, Tuesday, April 11, 2017

JOINT SESSION

The Fourth Joint Session of the First Regular Session of the Fifty-sixth Legislature was called to order by the President of the Senate, Lieutenant Governor Todd Lamb.

Senator Treat moved that the attendance roll call of the Senate be considered the attendance roll call of the Senate in Joint Session, which motion was declared adopted.

Representative Echols moved that the attendance roll call of the House of Representatives be considered the attendance roll call of the House in Joint Session, which motion was declared adopted.

President Lamb declared quorums of the Senate and House present and Joint Session duly assembled.

Posting of the Colors was presented by the Thunderbird Youth Academy.

The invocation was offered by Major Davies Vanpool, Chaplain of the Oklahoma National Guard.

President Lamb recognized Brigadier General Louis Wilham, Oklahoma National Guard, to introduce Adjutant General, Major General Robbie Asher.

Major General Asher addressed the Joint Session and conducted the program commemorating the 45th Infantry Division Appreciation Day.

Major General Asher introduced Governor Mary Fallin who addressed the Joint Session.

Governor Fallin and Brigadier General Wilham recognized and issued the oath of enlistment to Mr. Dakota Denison, enlisting into Troop A, 1st Squadron, 180th Cavalry Regiment in Durant, and Ms. Grace Fuqua, enlisting into the Flight Services Squadron of the 137th Special Operations Wing at Will Rogers Air National Guard Base in Oklahoma City. Governor Fallin and Brigadier General Wilham also recognized and issued the oath of reenlistment to Staff Sergeant Lacy Spanier and Senior Master Sergeant Barbara Baldwin.

Brigadier General Wilham read a formal Proclamation from Governor Mary Fallin recognizing 45th Infantry Appreciation Day and presented the Proclamation to Major General Robbie Asher.
