

# Senate Journal

## Second Extraordinary Session of the Fifty-sixth Legislature of the State of Oklahoma

**Nineteenth Legislative Day, Wednesday, March 28, 2018**

The Senate was called to order by Senator Stanislawski.

Roll Call:

Senator Stanislawski declared a quorum present.

### GENERAL ORDER

**HB 1010** by Wallace and Casey of the House and David and Fields of the Senate was called up for consideration.

Senator David moved that **HB 1010** be advanced, which motion was declared adopted.

### THIRD READING

**HB 1010** was read for the third time at length.

Senator Stanislawski announced that **HB 1010** has been determined by the House of Representatives to be a revenue bill subject to the provisions of Section 33 of Article 5 of the Constitution. In order to become law without being submitted to a vote of the people of this state, the measure must receive the approval of three-fourths (3/4) of the Senate membership.

On the question of passage of the bill, the vote resulted as follows:

The bill passed.

Senator Treat served notice that the vote be reconsidered whereby **HB 1010** passed.

Senator Treat asked unanimous consent, to which no objection was heard, to suspend Senate Rule 11-1(A) (2) and invoke the provisions of Senate Rule 8-32(B) for the notice to reconsider the vote whereby **HB 1010** passed.

## **GENERAL ORDER**

**HB 1011** by Wallace and Casey of the House and David and Fields of the Senate was called up for consideration.

Senator Thompson moved that **HB 1011** be advanced, which motion was declared adopted.

## **THIRD READING**

**HB 1011** was read for the third time at length.

The bill passed.

Senator Treat asked unanimous consent, to which no objection was heard, to suspend Senate Rule 11-1(A) (2) and invoke the provisions of Senate Rule 8-32(B) for the notice to reconsider the vote whereby **HB 1011** passed.

### **GENERAL ORDER**

**HB 1023** by Wallace et al. of the House and David and Fields of the Senate was called up for consideration.

Senator Smalley moved to amend **HB 1023**, by substituting the attached floor substitute for the title, enacting clause and entire body of the measure, which amendment was declared adopted. (Copies were provided for all Senators.)

Senator Smalley moved that **HB 1023** be advanced, which motion was declared adopted.

### **THIRD READING**

**HB 1023** was read for the third time at length.

On the question of passage of the bill and emergency, the vote resulted as follows:
