ENROLLED SENATE BILL NO 337:

This is to advise you that on this date, pursuant to the authority vested in me by Section 11 of Article VI of the Oklahoma Constitution to approve or object to legislation presented to me, I have VETOED Senate Bill 337.

The language in SB 337 is duplicative to HB 1019xx, passed during special session, that requires remote sellers making sales into this state that do not collect tax to file an annual statement with the Oklahoma Tax Commission identifying each customer and their Oklahoma purchases during the preceding calendar year.

HB 1019xx provides for remote sellers that had sales within this state of at least \$10,000 within the last 12 months to make an election to either file an annual statement with the Oklahoma Tax Commission of Oklahoma purchases made during the preceding calendar year for each customer OR collect and remit the tax on sales into the state. No similar provision is contained in SB 337.

The Tax Commission has reported a positive response for remote sellers with the provisions of HB 1019xx already passed by this Legislature for collecting and remitting the tax on sales into the state. Those collections would not only include the state tax but the tax for our cities and counties as well.

While well intended, SB 337 does not substantially increase the requirements on remote sellers and the differing reporting dates and effective dates may create confusion for remote sellers and have unintended negative consequences on the effective collection of state and local taxes under HB 1019xx.
